

**REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS
MISCELLANEOUS ENGINEERING SERVICES
RFP 24-17**

The Sussex County Council is hereby soliciting proposals from qualified Professional Engineering Firms to provide **Miscellaneous Engineering Services** to support the Engineering Department on projects over a five-year period. Services will include but are not limited to various planning, design, permitting, and construction phase components of civil and municipal improvement projects.

All services shall be assigned on an as-needed basis only, dependent solely on the necessity of County project quantity and scope. There is no guarantee of agreement value.

Sussex County shall determine that firms meet the minimum qualifications, based upon items addressed in the proposals that are received, consisting of the following criteria:

Experience and reputation

Capacity to meet requirements (size, financial condition, etc.)

Location (geographical)

Demonstrated ability

Familiarity with public work and its requirements

In addition to the above, other criteria necessary for a quality, cost-effective project may be utilized.

Sussex County intends to select multiple qualified firms for negotiation of base service agreements which the County determines fair and reasonable.

The submission shall be confidential until proposal evaluation is complete and agreement(s) are executed. Thereafter, all submissions shall be open to public inspection.
