The Planning & Zoning Commission held a Public Hearing on the application on November 13, 2024. At the meeting of November 13, 2024, the Planning & Zoning Commission recommended approval of the application for the 8 reasons as outlined.

Mr. Samuel Petersheim and Mrs. Glenda Petersheim, the applicants spoke on behalf of the application; that they own the Dutch Furniture Store in Laurel; that they have run out of space; that they want to sell storage buildings and display backyard properties, backyard structures, gazebos, pergolas, and lawn furniture; that they would like to move their furniture store to this area so that they can expand; that most of their customers buy the items rather than lease.

There were no public comments.

- 2. The site is in the Developing Area according to the current Sussex County Comprehensive Plan. B-2 zoning and the uses permitted in that District are appropriate in the Developing Area according to the Plan.
- 3. This location is in an area along Route 13 where there is a larger commercially zoned area of land that includes a large store complex and warehousing as well as other retail and commercial uses.
- 4. The rezoning will not adversely affect area roadways or traffic.
- 5. The rezoning will also not adversely affect nearby properties or property values.
- 6. No parties appeared in opposition to this Application.
- 7. The proposed rezoning meets the general purpose of the Zoning Code by promoting the orderly growth, convenience, order prosperity, and welfare of the County.
- 8. Any future use of the property will be subject to Site Plan review by the Sussex County Planning and Zoning Commission.
