- Bond Mr. Lawson reported that Standard & Poor's rating services has raised its Rating rating on Sussex County, Delaware's General Obligation Bonds to AA+ from AA, the highest AA rating. The rating increase was due to the resilient local economy with below average unemployment rates during a protracted national recession. The one notch upgrade also reflects the County's strong financial performance which has been supported by a stable stream of property tax revenues. Mr. Lawson stated that this news is especially significant in light of the economy and heightened focus on credit quality; this upgrade is very rare. The County's team, including Finance Director Susan Webb and Retired County Administrator David Baker are to be commended.

On Thursday, December 29, 2011, the Delaware Supreme Court issued its decision on the suit of Sussex County Council vs. DNREC. The court affirmed the Superior Court's decision striking down DNREC's Pollution Control Strategy regulations that attempted to establish buffer zones contrary to those established by the County. This decision affirms the County's position and rejects attempts by DNREC and any other State agency attempting to regulate land use in any county or municipality which has home rule.

The Planning and Zoning Commission held a Public Hearing on this application on December 8, 2011 at which time action was deferred for further consideration and to allow the Commission time to review the video submitted during the Public Hearing.

Lawrence Lank, Director of Planning and Zoning, read a summary of the Commission's Public Hearing.

The Council found that Michael Van Drunen was present with James Waehler, Attorney. They stated that the parcel contains approximately 3 acres and is located in a Low Density Area according to the Comprehensive Land Use Plan; that there are other business uses in the immediate area including a nursery/greenhouse business, an auto sales business, a tree service business, and a landscaping/satellite equipment business; that the Applicant hopes to continue his manufactured home installation and electrical contracting business; that the business started on the land of Cornelius Van Drunen, his father, and has been in operation for approximately 30 years on either his father's property or this site; that employees arrive between 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. daily, leave for job sites, and then return around 5:00 p.m.; that trucks and equipment would be stored on the site on nights and weekends; that the existing storage building is used for storage of materials and equipment; that the Applicant will be phasing out the dumpsters and dumpster carrier and will be contracting for one small dumpster to handle regular trash pick-ups; that the use has compatibly existed with the residential businesses in the area for over 28 years; that 16 of his neighbors have signed the petition in support of the application; that the business has continued to grow and he has 12 employees; that if the use is granted, the Applicant can consolidate his business at the site; that the Applicant submitted pictures of the site; that the Applicant has agreed to erect a six foot barrier fence around the business's storage and parking yard and to extensively landscape the perimeter of the drive-ways and the storage and parking areas; that the Applicant is agreeable to reasonable limits to his hours of operation; that the Applicant does do work out of state on occasion and sometimes his employees do return to the site after 5:00 p.m.; that if the application is not approved, the Council would be terminating an existing business; that some of the comments in opposition to the application were incorrect; and that the concerns expressed by the opposition will be addressed if the application is approved, i.e. by fencing, landscaping, and temporary covering of the dumpsters and their ultimate phasing out; that mobile homes have never
