John Ashman, Director of Public Works, requested permission to post notices for the Sherwood Forest North Expansion of the Sussex County Unified Sanitary Sewer District (Long Neck Area). The expansion would include all remaining parcels within the Sherwood Forest Subdivision and miscellaneous parcels along Bay Farm Road. Over the past several years, the Engineering Department has received requests from many property owners interested in having the County extend the Sewer District Boundary. In response, the Department sent out polling letters; the results of the poll to date show 67 parcels (40%) in support and 53 parcels (32%) opposed. In total, 167 parcels were polled with 120 responding. The six parcels along Bay Farm Road were not polled but are included at this time as service is available for those parcels. If authorized, a public hearing will be scheduled on the annexation of the area. Projected annual costs will be presented at the public hearing as well as to Council at a later date.

The Planning and Zoning Commission held a Public Hearing on this application on February 14, 2019 at which time the Commission recommended approval to amend Condition F of Ordinance No. 2295 to state that “The amenities contained within Phases 1, 2 and 3 shall be open and available to use by residents prior to the commencement of the second phase of construction.” and to amend Condition P of Ordinance No. 2295 to state “Area to be used as a school bus shelter with parking for five vehicles shall be set aside in the parking lot for the community center, and that both the DART bus stop and the school bus stop shall be constructed at the time that the DelDOT entrance is also constructed.”

Janelle Cornwell, Planning and Zoning Director, presented the application.

The Council found that Pret Dyer, member of Captains Way Development, was present on behalf of the application with Mark Davidson of Pennoni. They stated that this application was precipitated by the movement of the clubhouse closer to the entrance; that they are requesting that conditions of the former approval (Ordinance No. 2295; Change of Zone No. 1721) be amended; that Condition F currently reads as follows: “All amenities shall be clearly shown on the Final Site Plan and they shall be open and available to use by residents prior to the construction of the second phase of the development.”; that the problem is that this a multi-phase project and some roads will not be accessible to some areas until later phases; that they propose that Condition F be amended to the following: “The amenities contained within Phases 1, 2, and 3 shall be open and available for use by residents prior to the construction of the second phase of construction.”; that the project is divided by a creek that runs perpendicular to Route 16; that Condition P currently reads as follows: “Areas to be used as a DART bus stop and school bus shelter with parking for 5 vehicles shall be set aside near the entrance to the project. The areas for the bus stops shall be constructed at the time the DelDOT entrance is also constructed.”; that they propose that Condition P be amended to the following: “Area to be used as the school bus shelter with parking for 5 vehicles shall be set aside in the parking lot for the community center. Both the DART Bus Stop and the School Bus Stop shall be constructed at the time the DelDOT entrance is also constructed.”; that Cape Henlopen School District is in agreement; that it is a safer movement and location for the school bus stop; that the DART bus stop will be constructed on Route 16; that the amenities to be built in Phases 1, 2 and 3 will include a clubhouse with parking lot, outdoor pool, tot lot, dog park, pickle ball court, and natural surfaced walking path. Mr. Davidson explained how school buses will enter and exit the site.
