DraftThe Council discussed a Draft Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TOOrdinance/AMEND CHAPTER 62 OF THE CODE OF SUSSEX COUNTYClerk ofRELATING TO FEES CHARGED BY THE CLERK OF THE PEACE TOPeace FeesPERFORM MARRIAGE CEREMONIES AND CIVIL UNIONS". ThisOrdinance sets the fees the Clerk of the Peace charges for marriage andcivil union ceremonies for Delaware residents, non-residents and activeUnited States military personnel.

George Parish, Clerk of the Peace, stated that the respective Clerks of the Peace of each Marriage Bureau in the State of Delaware have been engaged in a continuous dialogue in attempting to achieve unanimity in established fees. Mr. Parish stated that he endorses the proposition to extend Delaware resident fees to all active United States military personnel without regard to their legal residency. The proposition would apply to all Sussex County Marriage Bureau fees. This approach would provide an opportunity for the Sussex County Council to express its gratitude for active military personnel. Mr. Parish noted that the provision was implemented in New Castle and Kent counties in April 2012.

Mr. Wilson suggested that the fees be waived for active military personnel. It was noted that this could be discussed during the Public Hearing process.
