OrdinanceMr. Baker distributed and reviewed a draft ordinance entitled "ANRelatingORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 115 OF THE CODE OF SUSSEXto Adminis-COUNTY BY AMENDING ARTICLE XXV § 115-181 RELATING TOtrativeYARDS AND OPEN SPACES GENERALLY".Variances

Mr. Baker noted that the ordinance would allow the Director of Planning and Zoning to administratively grant a variance for a yard setback or building separation that does not exceed one foot of the yard setback or building separation requirements. Mr. Baker stated that a \$50.00 fee is being proposed to cover the cost of the process; the fee could be used as a credit for a Board of Adjustment application if an applicant's request is In accordance with the ordinance, the Director denied by the Director. would give written notice to adjacent property owners of the requested administrative variance and would accept written statements for ten working days from the date of mailing. Within 30 working days after the administrative variance application is submitted and accepted, the Director of Planning and Zoning may approve the administrative variance or advise the applicant that an application must be submitted to the Board of Adjustment. The Director of Planning and Zoning shall be governed by all the procedures, standards, and limitations of Chapter 115 applicable to the Board of Adjustment in granting variances, except the public hearing.

Mr. Baker noted that the draft ordinance would not apply to manufactured home parks.

The Council discussed the suitability of this ordinance for variances in Agricultural Districts (for agricultural uses). Mr. Cole suggested that Mr. Moore look into drafting another ordinance to addresses variances and agricultural uses.

Introduction Mr. Cole introduced the Proposed Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 115 OF THE CODE OF SUSSEX COUNTY BY AMENDING ARTICLE XXV § 115-181 RELATING TO YARDS AND OPEN SPACES GENERALLY". The Proposed Ordinance will be advertised for Public Hearing.

1. Emergency Operations Dispatcher Call Statistics

Attached are schedules with the 2007, 2008, 2009, and 2010 call statistics for the Sussex County Fire and Ambulance Callboard. As noted, 108,436 calls were received during 2010. The percentage of wireless 9-1-1 calls has increased from 54 percent in 2007 to 71 percent today. The volume of calls is up by ten percent in 2010. Incidents dispatched increased about five percent during 2010. We wish to thank our Emergency Operations Center Fire and Ambulance Callboard for handling the various difficult situations that they work to resolve.

2. Public Hearings Scheduled for January 11, 2011

Public hearings scheduled for January 11, 2011 will be rescheduled for March 15, 2011. Attached are copies of the notices. This is because the Planning and Zoning Commission public hearings for the same proposed projects were rescheduled due to snow until February 10, 2011. Planning and Zoning Commission hearings must be held before the County Council hearings.

3. <u>Planning and Zoning Public Hearings Scheduled for January 13,</u> 2011

Planning and Zoning public hearings scheduled for January 13, 2011 will be rescheduled for February 24, 2011. This is because the Planning and Zoning Commission will not have a quorum due to a family emergency. The public hearings before the County Council will be rescheduled for March 22, 2011.

Ocean Farm Proposed Sussex Community Improve- ment Project	Patricia Deptula, Assistant Director of Public Works, presented and reviewed a Proposed Resolution establishing a date, time, place and judge for an election to be held to consider the Ocean Farms Sussex Community Improvement Project. Ocean Farm is located on Double Bridges Road (Road 363) near South Bethany. The streets are privately owned by the Ocean Farm Property Owners Association (POA). Mrs. Deptula reported that the POA submitted a formal letter of request in February 2010 after which time Engineering staff held a meeting with the Ocean Farm Board Members and discussed the requested roadway improvements. A preliminary estimate was performed and petition forms were delivered. Sixty executed petitions were returned on September 10, 2010; the petitions represent approximately 53 percent of the total billable properties (a return of 50 percent is required by the Code). A public meeting was held in conjunction with the POA's annual meeting on November 13, 2010; at that time, the POA voted to proceed to an election using the ten-year time period to calculate the annual billing rate for each property. The estimated rate	

to calculate the annual billing rate for each property. The estimated rate

for a 10-year time period is \$568.62 annually per billable property.

Mrs. Deptula asked for permission to hold an election. If approved, the election is proposed to be held on Thursday, February 17, 2011 from 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 pm. at the South Coastal Library in Bethany Beach.

(continued) Mrs. Deptula noted that this will be the first project under the new Sussex Community Improvement Program, Chapter 96 of the Sussex County Code, which was adopted in July 2009 and thereafter, amended in November 2009.
