Council discussed the appeal to change the name of Wil King Road. On December 18, 2001, the County Council agreed to reopen the petition process and to allow the submittal of petitions until January 8, 2002. On January 8, 2002, Council received a request from Diane Loekle, one of the petitioners, asking for a one-week extension to the petition process. Council extended the deadline until January 15, 2002.

Mr. Stickels reported that no petitions were received by the deadline. A petition to change the name of Wil King Road was received on January 18, 2002; the petition contained 31 signatures (with only 26 signatures verifiable).

Mr. Cole advised that there is some confusion as to the correct spelling of Wil King Road and recommended that, to avoid confusion, the road name be changed to King Road.

Ms. Rita Pettit of the Mapping and Addressing Department reported that there have been no administrative errors relating to the spelling of Wil King Road; that the road name is spelled correctly on County records and street signs; and that the EMS/Fire Service have not expressed any confusion over the road name.

Council members expressed that they could not support accepting the petition to change the name of Wil King Road due to the fact that the petition was not filed by the deadline established; that the County established a policy requiring that 75 percent of the residents on the road must sign a petition in order for it to be accepted; that signatures on the petition did not represent 75 percent of the 87 possible signatures of the property owners on Wil King Road, and therefore, the petition did not meet the criteria established by the County's policy.

1. Fire Service Grants

Tonight at the Sussex County Volunteer Firemen's Association meeting, \$371,596.88 in checks to various fire companies will be released; \$130,408.86 is for reimbursement for Basic Life Support costs incurred by the individual companies from the County's Fire Service Discretionary Grant Account and \$241,188.02 is for Fire Service Enhancement Fees collected for October 1, 2001, through December 31, 2001.

2. Transportation Workshop

The Greater Lewes Foundation and the University of Delaware Sea Grant Program will be hosting a seminar on Land Use and Transportation Planning in Sussex County on Wednesday, March 13, 2002, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at the Virden Center, University of Delaware Campus, Lewes, Delaware. Included with this report is a list of the featured speakers.

A Public Hearing on this expansion was previously held on December 18, 2001 at which time it was Council's decision that the Engineering Department re-post the Notice of the proposed expansion to give the adjoining property owners additional time to respond as to whether they favored the expansion or not.

Mr. Archut reviewed the boundaries of the Americana Bayside Development, pointing out the privately owned parcels within the boundaries.

Mr. Archut advised that the Engineering Department mailed seventeen letters to individual property owners of the adjoining parcels, giving them the opportunity to comment. Twelve letters were returned - seven in favor of the expansion and five opposed to the expansion.

Mr. Archut advised that the Engineering Department is recommending that all of the adjoining parcels be included in the expansion area since it does not make sense to exclude properties within a sewer area and since it will be some time before sewer service is actually offered in the area.

Mr. Archut noted that Americana Bayside will be constructing all the sewer facilities and for this reason, the County will have no control over when sewer service will be available.

Mr. Cole expressed concern that the County is being too aggressive by pushing sewer into a large area that is undeveloped and has been designated as environmentally sensitive.

There were no public comments and the Public Hearing was closed.
