Fire Service Smoke Detector Program Mr. Baker introduced Todd Reilly of the Delaware Volunteer Fire Service who spoke on the Fire Service's smoke detector program. Mr. Reilly reported that over the past eight years, the State has applied for and received a grant to subsidize the Wake Up Delaware Program. This past year, over 100,000 smoke detectors were handed out in the State of Delaware. Mr. Reilly stated that there is evidence that many of these smoke detectors are not being maintained properly as many of them have no batteries or dead batteries.

Mr. Reilly stated that, this year the State did not receive the grant. It was determined that the grant specifications have changed and the grant is geared more towards smoke detector installation programs and fire inspections within the homes. The Sussex County Volunteer Firefighters Association has established a committee to come up with a program in Sussex County that meets the guidelines so that grant funding can be applied for next year.

Mr. Reilly reported that the Committee is working on implementing the program and that they are proposing the following: (1) this year, installations in homes will be done monthly and (2) next year, inspections will be performed to make sure that the smoke detectors are in working order.

Mr. Reilly stated that he is hoping Sussex County will be the first county in the State to establish such a program.

Mr. Reilly thanked the Council for its support of the smoke detector program and he explained that County funds were used to put 100 smoke detectors and batteries in every fire station in Sussex County.

Mr. Baker reported that two vacancies exist on the Board of Assessment Review. Jane Horn (District 1) is resigning her position and Ann Hudson's (District 3) term expired. Mr. Baker advised that, as required by State Law, this Committee meets the first 15 days in March every year; members serve for five year terms. This Board hears appeals on property assessments and appeals of EDUs and front foot assessments relating to sewer bills.

Disability Mr. Baker reviewed proposed changes to the County's disability benefits. Issues He explained that a number of concerns have arisen recently regarding disability pensions and long-term disability insurance issues. Currently, employees who are disabled for medical reasons continue to receive County benefits, as well as continue to vest toward a County pension (except for those who are receiving a disability pension). Also, the County does not provide short-term disability benefits, with the exception of paying based on accrued sick and/or vacation time. Mr. Baker outlined and explained the proposed changes. Mr. Baker noted that the proposal was developed with the assistance of Karen Brewington and Bonnie Wootten of the Personnel Office along with Barry Willoughby, Esq. and Tim Snyder, Esq.
