Mr. Hudson also distributed a list of the individuals and businesses who donated funds to the Land Trust Foundation.

Mr. Stickels reported that there is \$1.8 million available for this purchase, as follows:

- Sussex County Council \$300,000
- Sussex County Land Trust \$300,000
- State of Delaware Grant \$600,000
- Federal Matching Grant \$600,000

The money will be used by the State to purchase easements to six properties in Sussex County, totaling 933 acres. The properties were selected based on development pressures and the discount at which landowners were willing to sell their development rights.

Mr. Stickels stated that this is the first partnership between the County and the Land Trust. This purchase will preserve approximately 1,000 acres of farmland.

Mr. McGrath, Delaware Department of Agriculture, stated that the leveraging partnership enabled Sussex County to purchase a larger percentage of the properties that were voluntarily offered by landowners in the County compared with Kent and New Castle Counties. Mr. McGrath pointed out that the landowners themselves are contributing to this effort by the discounts that they offered from market value.

In 2001, the Sussex County Council pledged its support for the Foundation in order to assist in protecting, improving, enhancing and preserving the natural resources and open space in the County.



Land Trust (continued) Mr. Hudson presented a check to the Sussex County Council in the amount of \$300,000 representing their contribution for the purchase of the development rights of the properties previously listed.

## 1. Beneficial Acceptance

Please be advised that on February 14, 2003, Beneficial Acceptance was granted to The Summerlyn Project, Agreement No. 253. Included with this report is a summary of the project.

## 2. Public Workshop

The Department of Transportation invites all interested parties to attend a public workshop to begin the public involvement process for the design and construction of a new bridge over the Indian River Inlet in Sussex County. The workshop will be held on Wednesday, February 26, 2003, at the Lord Baltimore Elementary School, 120 Atlantic Avenue, Route 26, Ocean View. The public is invited to meet the project team any time between 4:00 and 8:00 p.m.

Despite preventative maintenance efforts, severe tidal erosion is occurring at the foundation of the Route 1 bridge over the Indian River Inlet. While the existing bridge is safe at this time, the Department has decided to proceed with replacement of the bridge.

The public is invited to this first public workshop to learn more about why the bridge is being replaced and how the design of the

Administrator's Report Administrator's Report (continued) new bridge will be created with public input. There will be an opportunity to meet the project team, learn how to become more involved in the design process, and to contribute ideas. The recently approved Capital Transportation Program includes \$57 million for this project. It is anticipated that construction would start in FY '04.

## 3. <u>Public Information Meeting</u>

The Delaware Department of Transportation (DelDOT) and Sussex County are together hosting a public information meeting regarding the DelDOT/Sussex County SR1 Land Use and Transportation Study. The meeting will be held on March 1, 2003, at Cape Henlopen High School, 1250 Kings Highway, Lewes, Delaware.

The SR1 Land Use/Transportation Study is in a planning process to increase the mobility of residents in the SR1 corridor between Five Points and the entrance to Rehoboth and Dewey Beaches. DelDOT and Sussex County are working as partners to develop a coordinated plan for land use and a supporting transportation system that emphasizes interconnections. This study is actively seeking participation of all local residents in developing recommendations for all types of travel, including automobile, bus, bicycle, and walking.

Representatives from Sussex County, DelDOT, the Public Advisory Committee, and the study team will be available between 11:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. to discuss study objectives and concerns. Interested residents are invited to attend during these times. At noon and 1:30 p.m., the study team will present the draft transportation plan for the study area.

Mr. Lawrence Lank, Director of Planning and Zoning, will represent the County during this meeting.

ion I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the County employees who worked overtime during the storm. I realize County government is easy to criticize when we close office hours or have to cancel meetings. However, over 100 employees, many of us working 16 to 18 hours a day, worked during the storm. I am pleased to report that there were no reported serious injuries during this time period as a result of the storm. The Emergency Operations Center, the 9-1-1 Dispatchers, Paramedics, Wastewater Operations and Maintenance employees, as well as other employees volunteered to work long hours. These employees would be too numerous to list and I would be afraid I would overlook someone, but they know who they are and I really appreciate their efforts.

Mr. Baker and the accounting firm of Jefferson, Urian, Doane & Sterner, P.A., Certified Public Accountants, presented the <u>Comprehensive Annual</u> <u>Financial Report (CAFR) for the Sussex County Council for the Fiscal Year</u> <u>Ended June 30, 2002</u>.

Mr. Baker pointed out that the report contains a new title and new information this year. The report includes additional information over and above the audit information; it includes statistics and general information about the County. Mr. Baker advised that the County has applied to the Government Finance Officers Association for an award for this report.

The CAFR report is divided into four sections: Introductory, Financial, Statistical and Single Audit.

• The Introductory section includes the table of contents, lists of elected and other officials, organizational chart, and the letter of transmittal. The letter of transmittal includes background information about Sussex County and its government, information regarding County departments and services, the economy, County government finances, budget and

Comprehensive Annual Financial Report Review for Fiscal Year 2002 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report Review for Fiscal Year 2002 (continued) internal controls, capital projects planned, cash management and investments, risk management, pension benefits, and debt management.

- The Financial section of this report includes the independent auditor's report along with the general purpose financial statements, required supplementary information, and combining and individual fund and account group financial statements and schedules.
  - The Statistical section includes various schedules of information regarding governmental expenditures, revenues, property tax, debt information, etc.
  - The Single Audit section contains the schedule of expenditures of federal awards and the independent auditors report on compliance with applicable laws and regulations and internal control as required by OMB Circular A-133 and Government Auditing Standards.

The report notes that the County finances have become stronger with growth in the County. The County has maintained its current tax rate at the same level for the past 13 years. During the last 12 years, General Fund revenues have exceeded expenditures each year. Taxable property assessed values have increased between 3 and 4 percent a year since 1993, without a reassessment. At the same time, total tax revenues have increased from \$11,965,216 in fiscal year 1998 to \$21,767,582 in fiscal year 2002. This is particularly due to the increase in realty transfer tax revenues, as well as a result of increased construction in the County resulting in an increase in Recorder of Deeds revenues and an increase in building permit and building inspection fee revenues.

As of June 30, 2002, the General Fund's undesignated portion of the fund balance totaled \$7,732,890. This represents 23.8 percent of the County's succeeding year General Fund budget. It is the County's goal to maintain an undesignated portion of fund balance up to 25 percent of the General Fund budget.

During Fiscal Year 2002, Sussex County's General Fund experienced an excess of revenues over expenditures in the amount of \$6,254,989.

Mr. Stickels noted that although this is a very favorable General Fund Financial Report, consideration must be given to future needs in Sussex County. Mr. Stickels distributed a list of proposed future expenditures totaling \$6,254,989.

It is the opinion of Jefferson, Urian, Doane & Sterner, P.A. that the general purpose financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the County of Sussex, Delaware as of and for the year ended June 30, 2002.

Mr. Izzo, County Engineer, discussed a Proposed Escrow Agreement with a proposed development in the West Rehoboth Sanitary Sewer District. The proposed development (Natelli, Inc.) is already within a sanitary sewer district; however, sanitary sewer infrastructure is not adjacent to the property. Mr. Izzo stated that there is also some concerns about the capacity of the existing pipeline and in particular, Pump Station No. 207. Mr. Izzo advised that the Engineering Department is proposing that the developer perform a Planning Study to determine how best to extend sanitary sewer service to the proposed development and to look at the capacity of the pipeline and Pump Station No. 207. Mr. Izzo recommended that Cabe Associates, Inc. perform the Planning Study since George, Miles & Buhr is representing the developer. **Upon Council's** approval, an Escrow Agreement will be executed with the developer. The developer will give the County the money to fund the Study; the money will be put in an Escrow Account; the County will execute a contract with Cabe Associates; Cabe Associates will perform the work and bill the County; and the County will make payment with funds in the Escrow Agreement. The scope of work is valued at \$12,500.

A Motion was made by Mr. Jones, seconded by Mr. Dukes, based upon the recommendation of the Sussex County Engineering Department, that the Sussex County Council authorizes its President to execute an Escrow Agreement/ Agreement with Natelli, Inc. to provide for the extension of regional sewer infrastructure for the West Rehoboth Expansion of the Dewey Beach Sanitary Sewer District, and an Engineering Agreement with Cabe Associates, Inc. to perform the scope of work considered in said Escrow Agreement.


