Presen-Jason Beal, Manager of the Abbott's Mill Nature Center in Milford, thanked the Council for its continued support of the Center's educational programs, tation/ Delaware which benefit under-privileged children who visit the Center to learn about Delaware's environment and its rich agricultural history. He stated that the Nature Center maintains over 6 miles of trails for the public to utilize. Mr. Beal Society/ Choosing introduced Madeleine Russell of the Delaware Nature Society and he advised Clean that her presentation to the Council on this date is part of an educational Water outreach mission.

> Madeleine Russell presented "Choosing Clean Water" on behalf of the Delaware Nature Society and the Chesapeake Bay Watershed in the State of Delaware. Ms. Russell reported that there are 64,000 square miles in the Watershed and that 1,800 local governments are in the watershed. She advised that she has given the presentation to Sussex County communities, schools and organizations. Ms. Russell stated that the Watershed Implementation Plan has been put in place to reduce the nitrogen and phosphorus that enters streams and rivers and flows to the Bay. In her presentation, Ms. Russell discussed sources of pollutants and actions to limit pollution, i.e. stream restoration, backyard wildlife habitats, clean marinas, cover crops, rain gardens, rain barrels, floating wetlands, grow native plants, plant trees, eliminate chemical applications, fertilize in the Fall, conserve or restore habitat, street sweeping, community clean-up, and join Clean Water Coalition.

CapitationMr. Lawson reported that Title 9, Chapter 3, Section 305, of the DelawareTaxCode requires that "The government of Sussex County annually at a meeting
held during the month of February shall fix and determine the amount of
capitation tax which the Board of Assessment shall assess for the following

year." Section 305(a)(2) requires that "In Sussex County, such capitation tax shall in no case exceed the sum of \$10.00, nor be less than the sum of \$3.00, and shall be uniform throughout the County, when levied and assessed."

Mr. Lawson noted that the <u>Delaware Code</u> does not require Kent County to levy a capitation tax and, currently, they do not levy one.

(continued)Mr. Lawson recommended, to satisfy the County's legal obligation per the
Delaware Code, that the Council set the capitation tax for the upcoming year
to be levied at the minimum amount (\$3.00) with the requirement that the
County Administrator and Finance Director shall revisit the issue during the
upcoming budget process. Mr. Lawson also recommended that the County
seek to amend the Delaware Code to provide Sussex County the same latitude
both Kent and New Castle Counties have regarding the determination of their
capitation tax.

 National Association of Counties Legislative Conference
