Mr. Stickels, County Administrator; Mr. Daniel Griffith, Division of Historical and Cultural Affairs; and Mr. James Waters, Rural Development Office, discussed a Memorandum of Agreement by and among the United States Postal Service, the Rural Development Office (administered by Farmers Home Administration), the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, and the Delaware State Historic Preservation Officer regarding the sale and rehabilitation of the Georgetown Post Office Building for the Sussex County Administration Building project. Mr. Griffith explained that the Memorandum of Agreement is required for two reasons: (1) the County's application for federal assistance for the project and (2) the acquisition of

Memorandum of Agreement (con't) federal property. For these reasons, the project comes under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act which says that federal agencies (the Postal Service and RDA) must take into account the effects of their projects on historic or archeological sites/properties that may be affected by the project. In order to comply with Section 106, the agencies agreed to certain stipulations which are described in the Memorandum of Agreement, including a design review and archeological testing. Council deferred action on this matter until the afternoon session.

Design Proposals County Administration Building Mr. R. Calvin Clendaniel and Mr. Robert C. Clendaniel of R. Calvin Clendaniel Associates presented for Council's consideration two new design proposals (#2 - Georgian style, #3 - Federal style) for the new Sussex County Administration Building. The design proposals include the Post Office building as the anchor building. The first design proposal, submitted to Council on September 21, 1993, is unacceptable to the Delaware State Historic Preservation Office due to the fact that it does not meet the standards of the Secretary of the Interior, as follows: (1) elements cannot be added, i.e. cupola, (2) massing, and (3) materials used. In addition, it is a requirement that a range of alternatives be considered. Comments from the public were solicited and several were made. Mr. Stickels, County Administrator, noted that the public was informed through advertising that this matter would come before Council on this date and that public input would be permitted. Historic Georgetown, Georgetown Historical Society, Georgetown Chamber of Commerce, Georgetown Town Council and Georgetown Business Association were notified by mail that this matter would come before Council on this date and that public input would be permitted. Council deferred action on this matter until the afternoon session.

Administrator's Report Mr. Stickels, County Administrator, reviewed the following information in his County Administrator's Report:

1. 17th Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Conference

Mr. Frank B. Calio, Director of the Sussex County Economic Development Office, was recognized for his work at the Sussex County Airport and Industrial Park by the FAA last week in Hershey, Pennsylvania. A plaque was presented to Mr. Calio by Mr. William DeGraaff, Administrator for the FAA Eastern Region, on behalf of the United States Department of Transportation. Mr. Calio was recognized for his leadership and community commitment to economic development of the airport and industrial park. His efforts in obstruction removal within the clear zone enabled the FAA to assist the County in funding for much needed runway rehabilitation.


