mationThe Council presented to Carol Fitzgerald, County Librarian, the
Proclamation entitled "PROCLAIMING THE WEEK OF APRIL 10 16,
2011 AS NATIONAL LIBRARY WEEK".
- Bayhealth Terry Murphy, Chief Executive Officer of Bayhealth Medical Center, Report presented an overview of the Bayhealth organization and facilities plan, which includes the replacement of the Milford Memorial Hospital. Bayhealth Medical Center facilities include Milford Memorial Hospital and Kent General Hospital.

City of Mr. Baker reported that, on April 5, 2007, the Council entered into a loan agreement with the City of Seaford to provide a \$250,000 Economic Seaford Development Stimulus Loan. The loan was for one percent over a period of Loan 10 years. The full faith and credit of the City of Seaford secures this loan. Agreement/ The purpose of this loan was to fund improvements to the Seaford Sports Amendment Complex Project. The City of Seaford also entered into an agreement with the Sussex County Sports Foundation regarding this project. Since that time, Request three annual payments were made in 2008, 2009, and 2010. Mr. Baker advised that the City of Seaford and the Sussex County Sports Foundation have requested a change in the terms of the loan. They are recommending this change due to the current difficult economic conditions whereby the project has not proven to be self-sustaining. The City of Seaford has requested that the terms of the loan be changed so that the balance of \$177,594 is paid over 15 years versus the remaining 7 as per the current agreement. They have also requested that the one percent interest be reduced to zero percent. The loan will remain a debt of the City of Seaford. The City of Seaford is also requesting that the payments be made monthly versus annually. Thus, the total monthly payments due from the City of Seaford will be \$986.63 or \$11,839.61 annually for 15 years. This compares to the current annual payment due of \$26,395.55 for the remaining 7 years.

> Mr. Cole commented on the reduction to a 0% interest rate and he suggested that the City be required to pay any legal costs associated with the amendment of the documents.
