Mr. Phillips further advised that Lori Christiansen, Senior Legislative Analyst, forwarded a letter to Secretary Tarburton on behalf of the House Committee on Capital Improvement Programs, requesting that all action regarding the proposed changes be suspended until the Department of Agriculture CIP hearing on Wednesday, May 5, 1999. Mr. Phillips requested Council's support of (1) the Sussex County Farmland Preservation Advisory Board's concerns and (2) suspending all action regarding the proposed changes until May 5, 1999.

Paramedic Report/Response Times

Mr. Stickels, County Administrator, reviewed Sussex County paramedic response times. According to County statistics, some areas in Sussex County exceed the national EMS eight-minute standard for paramedic response time. Council members noted that it has been known for some time that an additional paramedic unit is needed in the Long Neck – Oak Orchard area. Only 10 percent of emergency calls in the Long Neck – Oak Orchard area receive a paramedic response within eight minutes. Mr. Stickels also noted that, in addition to an additional paramedic unit, the County needs a 2nd supervisor. A 2nd supervisor would provide the County with a supervisor on the east and west side of the County. The addition of another paramedic unit and another supervisor would enhance patient care in Sussex County with a quicker response time.

It was noted that the County Council has delayed addressing these improvements to the Paramedic Program to see if the State would make provisions for the improvements based on (1) the findings of the Fitch Report and (2) the recommendations from the State EMS Improvement Committee.

Mr. Stickels advised that the price of an additional paramedic unit would be \$1 Million; \$600,000 to be funded by the State and \$400,000 to be funded by the County. Mr. Stickels stated that if Council is supportive of an additional paramedic unit, and the State EMS Office does not support an additional unit in Sussex County at this time, Council would need to authorize legislation to be drafted and introduced.

Subdivision Council discussed an appeal of the Sussex County Planning & Zoning
No. 98-12/
Deep Commission's decision to deny an application of Norris L. Niblett for the
Pines II/
Norris subdivision of land in an AR-1 Agricultural Residential Zoning District in
Niblett Nanticoke Hundred, by dividing 38.71 acres into 42 lots, located south of Road
46, 740 feet east of Road 526 (Deep Pines II). The County Council reviewed the
record of the Planning & Zoning Commission; at the hearing, the compliance by
the developer with the requirements of § 99-13 of the Subdivision Code was
raised by Mr. Witsil, the attorney for one of the opponents to the proposed
subdivision. Since that time, Mr. Schrader, Assistant County Attorney, has
determined that the subdivider has failed to present the documented evidence of
notice and consent required by § 99-13 and for this reason the application cannot
be heard or the subdivision altered. Due to this non-compliance, the Planning
and Zoning Commission denied Mr. Niblett's application.

Mr. Bradley, attorney for the applicant, addressed Council stating that the Ordinance pertaining to § 99-13 is "fatally flawed" as it delegates the power of the Planning & Zoning Commission to the property owners and, further; that § 99-13 does not set any standards for the approval of the subdivision by the property owners. Mr. Witsil, attorney for the opposition, reiterated the fact that this application is a resubdivision of a previously approved subdivision plan and requires the consent of the property owners. Mr. Bayard, County Attorney, requested that action be deferred for a review of the briefs submitted. It was the consensus of Council to defer action.

The planning study should be completed by July 1999. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended deferral until the engineering study is completed. The Public Hearing was closed and action was deferred. It was the consensus of Council that the record remain open pending receipt of the sewer planning study, scheduled for completion in July, 1999.
