1. 9-1-1 Awareness Day

3. Wastewater Operator of the Year Awards

We are proud to announce that Mr. Robert Moore, an employee of the Sussex County Engineering Department, has been nominated and awarded Waste Water Operator of the Year for the State of Delaware. As noted, these awards are presented annually to those *"who have demonstrated outstanding technical excellence and exemplary work ethic, thus contributing to the high level of water quality in Delaware"*. There are approximately 463 waste water operators licensed in the State of Delaware. Mr. Moore has worked in conjunction with DNREC's Biosolids program and generated a new reporting program for Biosolids, which will be used statewide. Per Ms. Heather Sheridan, "The managers of the facilities throughout the state, who are responsible for submitting the Biosolids Data Management System report, will benefit from Bob's initiative and creativity".

We are also proud to announce that Ms. Ann Hobbs-Noon, who also works at the South Coastal Regional Wastewater Facility, was one of the three nominees considered for this award. Ms. Hobbs-Noon has worked for Sussex County Council since 1999. She is a waste water operator who oversees the laboratory at the South Coastal Regional Wastewater Facility.

Prime Hook/ Payment in Lieu of Taxes Gina Jennings, Director of Accounting, reported that a check in the amount of \$44,299.00 has been received from the United States Department of the Interior, Fish and Wildlife Service, as a federal payment in lieu of taxes for the Prime Hook National Wildlife Refuge. This check represents payments under the Refuge Revenue Sharing Act covering Fiscal Year 2009. The amount of the payment was calculated by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service by prorating the total funds available for payment. The check is funded through revenues generated from the Prime Hook National Wildlife Refuge and from a supplemental congressional appropriation. Sussex County may use these funds for any governmental purpose. Ms. Jennings advised that the County does not collect property taxes from the Federal Government for the Prime Hook National Wildlife Refuge. In return, the Federal Government gives the County this payment in lieu of taxes. In the past, these funds have been allocated in the same percentage as the other County tax collections.

Aircraft Tie-Down Apron Expansion Project Michael Izzo, County Engineer, presented bid results for Sussex County Project No. 09-01, Aircraft Tie-Down Apron Expansion”, as follows:

It was reported that this project was designed by Urban Engineers and that this is a paving project to provide approximately 18 additional tie-down spots for aircraft. Complaints have been received in the past from some of the aircraft owners at the airport about insufficient tie down space, especially on summer weekends. Mr. Izzo reported that the project will involve reconfiguring taxi-way lights at the Airport; the contractor will be required to manage aircraft traffic during the construction period; and a thicker pavement is required due to airplane weight considerations.

Mr. Izzo noted that this project does not qualify for Federal funding.

Garrett Dernoga spoke regarding the need for the additional tie down spots.

The Council members expressed concern regarding the cost of the project and requested that additional information be presented to the Council on May 25th, including a diagram, bid information, and explanation of the \$500 per month reimbursement by the Fixed Base Operator.
