1. House Bill No. 39

RE: An act to amend Title 29 of the Delaware Code relating to the Inland Bays Watershed; designating the Inland Bays Watershed as a critical area under the Land Use Planning Act.

A total of 9 hours in meetings have been spent regarding this legislation, in which two amendments have been discussed.

2. House Bill No. 85, House Bill 226 & House Bill No.303

RE: Register in Chancery Office.

House Bill No. 85 - Refers to the appointment, powers and duties of the Register in Chancery Office.

House Bill No. 226 - This legislation implements the transition of the Office of Register of Chancery from County to State Government.

House Bill No. 303 - This legislation implements the transition of the County Register in Chancery Offices to State Government control.

Mr. Stickels informed Council that these three bills have passed both the House and the Senate and are on their way to the Governor for her signature.

3. Senate Bill No. 105

Synopsis: This legislation replaces the existing Advisory Panel on Intergovernmental Planning and Coordination with a Governor's Advisory Council and expands the membership and duties of the advisory council to include responsibility for key elements of the Governor's Livable Delaware agenda.

Mr. Stickels stated that he hopes Sussex County is allowed sufficient representation on this Advisory Council.

4. Senate Bill No. 28

Mr. Stickels stated that this is TDR, "Transferring of Development Rights", legislation. This is an act to amend Title 9 of the Delaware Code relating to Counties and the valuation, assessment and taxation of property.

Synopsis: Under the provisions of the bill, the rezoning or subdivision of land would not automatically constitute a change in use for purposes of valuation, assessment and taxation, if the land has been devoted

to agricultural use for at least the two successive years immediately preceding the tax year in issue.

This bill is in the Senate and several meetings have been held regarding this legislation, none of which the County has been invited. Mr. Stickels was informed that there were going to be six amendments to this bill, none of which he has seen.

Mr. Archut, Assistant County Engineer, appeared before Council regarding the proposed Sea Country Estates Sanitary Sewer District. Mr. Archut explained that he had hoped to obtain Council's approval as to a date on which to hold a referendum. Mr. Archut stated that he had held recent discussions with Mr. Baker and Mr. Stickels in regard to the fact that the cost estimates that had been used were based on pre-Ellendale bid numbers. In order to allow time to see the impact of the Ellendale prices on the rates, in addition to the possibility of the County being able to subsidize this project by using transfer fee revenue, it is the recommendation of Mr. Archut to delay setting a referendum date. Mr. Archut informed Council that he plans to come back before Council on July 10 with an update and to also seek Council approval as to establishing a referendum date.

Mr. Archut, Assistant County Engineer, presented Council with a fact sheet regarding Sussex County Project No. 01-07 - Sussex County Airport Generator Installation. The Engineering Department opened bids on June 15, 2001, at 10:00 a.m. to install a new 100 Kw generator at the airfield adjacent to the new Terminal Building. Mr. Archut informed Council that the Engineer's Estimate was \$75,000; the original engineer's estimate was based on an Onan generator, but the bids received reflect a Kohler generator, which is a less-costly, but equal, generator. Additionally, this is a grant-eligible project and will allow the County to receive 90 percent funding from FAA and 5 percent from the State, with the County being responsible for the final 5 percent.

At 11:02 a.m., Mr. Dukes recessed the Council meeting.

Reconvene

Mr. Dukes called Council back into session at 11:07 a.m.

Legislative Review/Continuation

Mr. Stickels, County Administrator, continued his discussion with Council regarding the following legislative items:

5. House Bill No. 245

Synopsis: This Act would establish a process for addressing the problems of sedimentation occurring in the lagoons of our state, similar to the existing process for establishing tax ditches, in order that the cost of necessary dredging can be approved and costs apportioned among the parties benefiting from such dredging or other sediment management practices.

Mr. Stickels reported that this bill has passed the House.

6. House Bill NO. 235

Synopsis: This Act permits the development of graduated impact fees for new development and construction to permit the State to recover additional costs imposed by such development on State facilities and services.

Mr. Stickels stated that this legislation is part of the Governor's Livable Delaware Program; this legislation would give the County the ability to charge impact fees, but only applies to development outside of the towns, and to agriculture districts and environmentally sensitive areas. It was the consensus of the Council that the Council would be in favor of enabling legislation only.

7. House Bill No. 255

An Act to amend Title 9, Title 22, Title 29 of the Delaware Code relating to land use, comprehensive plans and annexation.

Mr. Stickels stated that this legislation would require the County's land use map to equal the County's zoning map.

8. House Bill No. 283

An Act to amend Chapters 100 and 101 of Title 16 of the Delaware Code to provide for State plans for the implementation of wireless E-911 service and an integrated wireline and wireless E-911 system and for the funding thereof.

Mr. Stickels stated that this legislation would impose a 50-cent charge on every cellular and business phone line; this proposed legislation would also affect the county's current 50-cent charge on residential phones by adding an additional 10 cents. The County would like an amendment that would broaden the ways in which the County could use their monies to include capital expenses.

9. House Bill No. 293

Synopsis: This Act would incorporate the Town of Gumboro.

Mr. Stickels stated that this legislation would allow the town to bond up to \$10,000, and gives them the ability for annexation.

10. House Bill No. 292

Synopsis: This Act requires the councilmanic districts of Sussex county be nested within the State Representative Districts primarily situated within Sussex County to the greatest possible extent.

Mr. Stickels reported that this legislation would result in an increase of Sussex County Council members, from 5 to 7.

Mr. Stickels presented several additional legislative items that have been proposed, but not yet introduced:

1. RE: Buffer Zones - setting standards for setbacks from state wetlands; this bill has not yet been introduced but has been discussed and may come out in January 2002.
2. RE: Establishment of a funding mechanism for nonpoint discharges in the inland bay areas.
3. RE: Reducing the County's realty transfer tax from 1-1/2 percent to 1-1/4 percent in July; and to 1 percent in January. This would have an impact on the County of between \$2.7 and \$3 million per year depending on the year, and would have a tremendous impact on the County's ability to continue with the state police program and sewer subsidies. In the past three years, the County has received \$8.3 in revenues from the realty transfer tax. If this legislation is passed, Mr. Baker and Mr. Stickels will come back before Council on July 10th in regard to the redrafting of the County's budget. The State is proposing to use the increased revenues they would receive by passing this legislation for the purchase of open land and farmland preservation. Mr. Stickels informed Council that letters had been written to all towns informing them of this proposed legislation and its impact if passed.

Mr. Stickels will continue to monitor the progress of the above-mentioned legislation.
