Report1.Georgetown Airport Runway Lighting

We are pleased to announce the runway edge lights and runway threshold lights on Runway 10-28, as well as the taxiway lights for Taxiways D, M, and H, have been converted to LED lights. The conversion project was funded by the federal ARRA program. Airport users will see a noticeable improvement with the intensity of the lights when using Runway 10-28. The County will also see a noticeable drop in our electric bill, as these lights consume one-tenth of the power of the previous lights.

2. <u>Delaware State Police Activity Report</u>

Per the attached Delaware State Police activity report for May 2012, there were 4,335 total traffic arrests and 1,414 total criminal arrests. Of the criminal arrests, 368 were felony and 1,046 were misdemeanor arrests. Of the total hours on duty spent, 43 percent were spent on criminal investigations.

3. <u>Sussex County Emergency Operations Center Call Statistics – June</u>

Attached please find the call statistics for the Fire and Ambulance Callboard for June 2012. There were 17,473 total calls handled in the month of June. Of those 9-1-1 calls in June, 78 percent were made from wireless phones.

4. <u>Project Receiving Substantial Completion</u>

As you will see from the attached Engineering Department Fact Sheet, Forest Landing – Phase 2A reached Substantial Completion effective June 26, 2012.

5. <u>Digital Weekly Packets</u>

Federal Payment in Lieu of Taxes/ Refuge Revenue Sharing Funds	Gina Jennings, Director of Accounting, reported that a check in the amount of \$38,898.00 has been received from the United States Department of the Interior, Fish and Wildlife Service, as a federal payment in lieu of taxes for the Prime Hook National Wildlife Refuge. This check represents payments under the Refuge Revenue Sharing Act covering Fiscal Year 2011. The amount of the payment is calculated by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service by prorating the total funds available for payment. The check is funded through revenues generated from the Prime Hook National Wildlife Refuge and from a supplemental congressional appropriation. Sussex County may use these funds for any governmental purpose. Ms. Jennings advised that the County does not collect property taxes from the Federal Government for the Prime Hook National Wildlife Refuge. In return, the Federal Government gives the County this payment in lieu of taxes. In the past, these funds have been allocated in the same percentage as the other County tax collections.

TylerGina Jennings, Director of Accounting, presented a proposed amendment to
a ContractContracta Contract with Tyler Technology. The Contract, to purchase an
Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) software package (Munis), was
approved at the July 19, 2011 Council meeting. At that meeting, Mrs.
Jennings stated that she did not want to commit to purchasing the Utility
Billing module until staff was comfortable that they were making the right
decision for the Utility Billing Department and the County as a whole. Mrs.
Jennings reported that, in the last year, the following was done to make sure
that staff was certain that Munis was the best choice:

- analyzed if the current system could still be used while the other departments used Munis
- performed a Gap-Fit Analysis with Munis to understand what modifications had to be done to the system to support current procedures
- analyzed what modification could be done to the tax module (already purchased) that could make it usable for billing out utility customers

Mrs. Jennings stated that, after the analysis, staff found that buying the Munis software for Utility Billing is the best choice. The cost of the Utility Billing module and related services such as consulting, training and modifications comes to \$240,350. This is \$20,100 less than the original bid a year ago that did not include the modifications that are in the new price. With this amendment, the contract is still under the \$1.8 million for the entire project.

Additional Business Under Additional Business, William Christy of Milford, commented on a four-wheeler incident that took place in Shawnee Acres in Milford.
