Vegetable Growers Association of Delaware Grant Mr. Stickels announced that the Sussex County Council would be presenting a check in the amount of \$20,000 to the Vegetable Growers Association of Delaware. He noted that the funding was appropriated and approved in the FY 2004 Budget. Mr. Ed Kee, Extension Specialist, University of Delaware Research & Education Center, was present and stated that the funds will be used to support and enhance a new agricultural enterprise (pepper program) in Sussex County. Dean Foods, a major U.S. food processor has contracted 8 acres of sweet cherry peppers and nearly 40 acres of hot cherry peppers with local growers. Four growers in Sussex County are involved in the program. The funds provided by the County will support the project in terms of pest management and nutrient management.

Mr. Stickels read the following information in his County Administrator's Report:

1. Burke and Cedar Creek Group, LLC vs. Sussex County Council

On February 14, 2002, the Plaintiffs, Burke and Cedar Creek Group, LLC, filed a declaratory judgment action in the Court of Chancery to reverse the County Council's 3-2 vote to deny the Plaintiffs' conditional use application for a campground at Fort Saulsbury, near Slaughter Beach. In particular, the Plaintiffs argued that the County Council did not create a sufficient record for the court to review because the individual members of Council did not articulate reasons for their voting for approval and that, if the record was found to be adequate, the decision of the County Council was arbitrary and capricious. Oral argument was conducted before Vice Chancellor Leo Strine on Friday, July 18, 2003, in Georgetown. Mr. Burke, Ms. Longabardi (attorney for Slaughter Beach) and Dennis Schrader appeared and argued for their respective clients. At the conclusion of the argument, the Court took the unusual step of ruling from the bench. The Court rejected both the claims of the Administrator's Report (continued) Plaintiffs and found the Councilmen properly created a record of their reasons for voting as they did and that the Council had acted within its discretion and the applicable law.

2. Bethany Crossing West

Sussex County Engineering Department granted beneficial acceptance on July 16, 2003 for Bethany Crossing West Agreement No. 283. Included with this report is a fact sheet on the development.

3. Community Development Block Grant Allocations

I am pleased to inform the Council that the Delaware State Housing Authority has awarded \$1,173,500 to Sussex County for Community Development Block Grant Programs. The funding has been allowed for the following activities:

The recommendations for funding were made by an independent review panel, whose members evaluated each application's potential benefit to low-income persons, the management capacity of the applicant, and the cost-benefit of the proposed activities, including: the severity of need, impact, cost reasonableness and feasibility.

The recommendations for funding were also made in response to a limited State CDBG allocation and, therefore, not all activities requested could be funded. Consequently, housing rehabilitation activities requested for Bridgeville, Ellendale, Georgetown, Laurel, Milford, Seaford and Selbvyille were not recommended for funding. Additionally, the review panel did not recommend Morningside Village sewer upgrade, the Laurel emergency generator, the Laurel water main valve replacement, or the Rehoboth Beach water main. It was the review panel's opinion that these activities would not compare to the need for the housing rehabilitation work.

I would like to compliment Bill Lecates and his staff for the work they did in securing the \$1.1 million.

4. Property Tax Bills

The Treasury Division will be mailing Sussex County property taxes the week of August 18, 2003. Sussex County residents have until September 30, 2003 to pay their property tax bill without penalty.



Administrator's Report (continued) This year's billing totals \$61,038,760. This includes \$48,655,818 for the school districts and \$9,578,378 for the County's portion of the property tax bill.

Sussex County property owners may file for a 50 percent reduction from school taxes, up to \$500, if they are a year-round resident of the County and the property is their primary home. Those over the age of 65 may file for the exemption up to September 1, 2003.

The Planning and Zoning Commission held a Public Hearing on this application on May 22, 2003 at which time they deferred action. On June 26, 2003 the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended that the application be denied since the application has been a difficult one to consider; since the application is a change of zoning application in error; and, since the application would be more appropriate as a conditional use.

The County Council held a Public Hearing on this application on June 10, 2003.

The County Council considered the Commission's recommendation and findings.
