Public A Public Hearing was held on the Proposed Ordinance entitled "AN Hearing-ORDINANCE TO GRANT A CONDITIONAL USE OF LAND IN AN C/U DISTRICT AR-1 AGRICULTURAL RESIDENTIAL FOR No. 1663 **PROFESSIONAL OFFICE SPACE TO BE LOCATED ON A CERTAIN** PARCEL OF LAND LYING AND BEING IN INDIAN RIVER HUNDRED, SUSSEX COUNTY, CONTAINING 2.4422 ACRES, MORE OR LESS" (Conditional Use No. 1663) filed on behalf of Toe Tapper, L.L.C.

The Planning and Zoning Commission held a Public Hearing on this application on July 13, 2006 at which time they deferred action. On July 27, 2006, the Commission recommended that the application be approved, with conditions.

PublicMr. Lank, Director of Planning and Zoning, read a summary of the
Commission's Public Hearing. The summary was admitted as part of the
Council's record.No. 1663

(continued) Mr. Lank referenced the Engineering Department's comments against exceeding 4.0 EDUs per acre and against approving an office of more than 9,760 square feet on the 2.44 acre project.

> Heidi Balliett, Attorney, was present on behalf of Toe Tapper, LLC. Robert Boyd and Earl Jackson of Regional Builders, Inc. were also present. Ms. Balliett stated that the Applicants are proposing professional offices; that the type of use they are planning is medical offices, however, there may be some professional uses; that there will not be any retail sales from the site; that there should be minimal traffic impact to the area; that the use is consistent with other businesses in the area; that the adjacent site is a Royal Farms store; that this project would share an entrance with Royal Farms, as proposed by DelDOT; that the entrance would be required to be located across from a project entrance across Route 24; that on-site septic is proposed until central sewer is available; and that the project would provide medical and professional businesses to support the community.

> Ms. Balliett referred to the conditions recommended by the Commission. She stated that they would prefer that no mention be made in the conditions regarding limiting the size of the building and that the condition simply state that the building size would have to comply with Sussex County's ordinances and would have to be approved by all required agencies. She stated that they are making this request since the size of the building has to be determined based on whether they have sewer or septic. In addition, Ms. Balliett stated that the proposal was for a larger building (22,000 square feet of building space). She stated that seven suites are proposed, two of which are rather large, including a storage area and a rehabilitation area.

> Robert Boyd stated that their Project Engineer has had discussions with Rob Davis of the Sussex County Engineering Department on the County's criteria for square footage calculations. They were told that the basic maximum "rule of thumb" for an EDU is 1,000 square feet or a 300 gallon per day use per EDU. Mr. Boyd stated that they have done an EDU calculation of the project, as follows: based on the 9.76 EDU capacity, there would be a daily average of 29.28 gallons per day for the site; that there would be seven suites with 18 patients and employees per suite with office hours from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.; and that by using the Engineering Department's calculation of 20 gallons per day per person, the projected daily usage would be 25.20 and there would be an extra capacity of 408

gallons per day. Mr. Boyd told the Council that Royal Farms bought a large tract of property and they propose small building, which could free up some of their EDU usage to be picked up and utilized by this project. He noted that the Applicant is committed to tying into the County's sewer system when it becomes available.

PublicMr. Cole stated that he would like the County Engineering Department to
comment on the sewer calculations presented by the Applicant.

No. 1663 In response to questions raised by the Assistant County Attorney, Ms. (continued) Balliett stated that the project is currently considered strictly medical. She stated, however, that they would like for the application to remain the same, that is, for "professional office space". She clarified that the intent is that the tenants be medical offices; however, if the application is approved and limited to a smaller area and they cannot do the medical offices, they may have to do professional offices.

There were no public comments and the Public Hearing was closed.

Mr. Lank, Director of Planning and Zoning, read a summary of the Commission's Public Hearing. The summary was admitted as part of the Council's record. Public Hearing-C/U No. 1692 (continued) The Council found that Greg Temple, Chief of the Millville Fire Company, was present. He stated that the Millville Fire Company has been providing emergency services to the area since 1936; that there has been a lot of growth in their district; that to meet their growth needs, they have purchased property on Route 54 (Omar Road) which would give approximately 30 of their members a fire house to respond to which is closer than going to the main station on Atlantic Avenue; that it would improve response times; that the members would have access to apparatus for response in any direction; that they chose this site because that is where future growth is going to occur; that this location would allow quick access to Route 17 and Millville by the Sea; that they would meet all State Fire Marshal criteria for the substation; that the site has been cleaned up; that there would be no public events held on-site, it would strictly be for the storage of apparatus and response, except that the only possibility would be one car show a year to raise money for their building fund; that training events for the firemen may be held there; that they plan to utilize the existing building, a 3,000 square foot metal combine shed; that in two to three years they may build a new building; and that he does not foresee needing a siren at the site in the immediate future unless it is required by FEMA or DEMA for public notification purposes.

It was noted that the Director of Planning and Zoning can authorize three three-day events per year upon receipt of a request in writing.

It was noted that all prices listed are advertised (MLS) prices.

Mr. Dukes stated that he believes the Council should discuss whether the intown location is best or whether we should look elsewhere. He stated that he favors purchasing property on the highway where there is room for expansion and adequate parking.

Mr. Cole stated that, 10 years ago, the Council made the commitment to remain in the Town of Georgetown and that he favors maintaining a presence in Georgetown.

Mr. Stickels stated that the construction of an Administrative Annex Building was approved in the Fiscal 2007 Budget. In addition, the Council has acquired additional land for parking lots.

Mr. Phillips stated that his concern is parking and he questioned if anyone has performed a parking study. He stated that this is one of the biggest complaints he hears – people cannot find parking spaces when they need to visit the County Administrative Office Building.

Mr. Jones stated that he would like the Engineering Department to be placed within walking distance of the County Administrative Office Building.

Mr. Cole and Mr. Phillips requested that the County's in-town properties and parking be inventoried. Mr. Stickels stated that a report would be given to the Council in two weeks.
