Sussex Outdoors Program	Auxiliary Captains, effective July 13, 2011. John Hollis, Sussex Manager of Nemours Health and Prevention Services, and James Wilson, Executive Director of Bike Delaware, were in attendance to promote the upcoming Sussex Outdoor Campaign which launches in October. Sussex Outdoors is a summit event scheduled on Thursday, October 13, and a series of other events to encourage families and children to be physically active in the Sussex outdoors. Sussex County has been recognized by the Center for Disease Control as one of 40 communities nationally that will focus on the lifestyle changes that will be healthier both physically and emotionally. Sussex Outdoors seeks to put into action the concepts embraced by our Governor and General Assembly (Walkable, Bikeable Delaware, No Child Left Inside). Sussex Outdoors is in partnership with Delaware State Parks, Sussex County Council, Sussex Child Health Promotion Coalition, and Nemours Health and Prevention Services. Mr. Hollis acknowledged and				
	thanked the County Council and David Baker for their support of programs such as the Sussex Outdoor Program.				

HPG William Lecates and Brad Whaley of the Community Development Office Grant were in attendance to review the Housing and Home Owner Preservation Grant and to request the Council's authorization to apply for the grant. He stated that the \$50,000 grant is for homeowner-occupied housing rehabilitation; that it is for 100% rural areas; and that it covers housing deficiencies. Mr. Lecates stated that a few years ago, when the State decreased the grant amount with only one allocation for the State of Delaware, Kent and Sussex Counties agreed to split the grant to augment the Community Development Block Grant. This year, Kent and Sussex counties can submit applications for grants in the earmarked amount of \$50,000 (\$25,000 each county). Mr. Lecates reported that the grant would impact about twelve dwellings throughout Kent and Sussex Counties; that homeowners will meet Section 8 income guidelines; and that the grant recipients will be elderly and very low income homeowners.

Re-
districtingEverett Moore reported on the proposed redistricting process. He noted
that, for the first time, a public comment period was held prior to the
drafting of the ordinance and the maps. Mr. Moore advised that public
comments were received by mail and by email and those comments have
been distributed to the Council members.

Mr. Moore reported that the public comments received indicate that the public: (1) appreciates the process of being able to have input before the maps are drafted; (2) desires to keep communities and towns intact; (3) recognizes of the amount of growth east of Route 113, and (4) desires to have further input after the maps have been drafted but prior to the ordinance being drafted. Mr. Moore stated that he concurs with each of these comments/recommendations and he stated that, with the Council's approval, he will present a further report at the Council meeting on August 23rd at which time he would review and show the draft maps; he will display the draft maps on the County's website with his comments and explanations regarding why the maps are drawn the way they are; and the public will be given a ten day comment period on the revised maps. There were no objections to Mr. Moore's proposal.

(Mrs. Deaver joined the meeting during the discussion on the redistricting process.)

Mr. Lank noted that included in the Councilmembers' packet of information for this meeting was a copy of a listing of Subdivisions, Residential Planned Communities (RPCs), and Conditional Uses. Mr. Lank summarized the reports by stating that 45 subdivision projects (4,201 lots) could be affected by the Proposed Ordinance, 23 RPCs (7,615 units) could be affected by the Proposed Ordinance; and 41 Conditional Use applications could be affected by the Proposed Ordinance. Mr. Lank further noted that the number of Subdivisions, RPCs, and Conditional Uses affected depends on how and if the Proposed Ordinance is adopted; i.e. the retroactive date.

The Council members discussed the Proposed Ordinance, the Commission's recommendation, and the listings provided by Mr. Lank.

Greenwood Michael Izzo, County Engineer, presented Contract Amendment No. 2, Library dated August 1, 2011, to the Davis, Bowen & Friedel Contract for the Project/ Greenwood Library Project. Mr. Izzo updated the Council on the project; in February, the County initiated a Feasibility Study for the expansion of the existing library; the design will be for a new 10,400 square foot single story facility; one of the work items will be the evaluation of alternative building methods. Mr. Izzo advised that the design contract is valued at \$185,569.00.

Additional Under Additional Business, Catherine Ward of the League of Women Voters commended Lawrence Lank, Director of Planning and Zoning, on the work he did reporting on Subdivisions, Residential Planned Communities, and Conditional Uses. She noted, however, that thinking the reports would give any real understanding of what the impact on Sussex County will be for 12,000 possible properties is illogical (referencing the Ordinance relating to time extensions). Ms. Ward questioned the legality of the passage of this ordinance. Ms. Ward also stated that the reports prepared by Mr. Lank were supposed to be available to the public prior to any vote being taken and that the public received the report only 30 minutes prior to the Council's vote.

Under Additional Business, Sandy Spence thanked Mr. Moore and the Council for a more open and transparent redistricting process. In regards to the Time Extension Ordinance, Ms. Spence stated that she would be hurt by the approval of the ordinance since she is already unable to sell her house. Under Additional Business, Michael Panco of Ultra Solar & Wind Solutions, LLC gave a presentation on "The Marilyn" wind turbine that his company offers. He reported that this type of wind turbine is affordable and creates no decibel problems and does not kill birds. Mr. Panco stated that he would like to sell these in Sussex County; however, the County's current ordinance prohibits them on parcels smaller than five acres. Mr. Panco asked the Council to reconsider the five acre rule.
