Introduction of Proposed Ordinance/ Issuance of General Obligation Bonds/ Johnson's Corner SSD Mrs. Webb reviewed a draft ordinance that would provide for the issuance of up to \$10,500,000 of Sussex County General Obligation Bonds in order to finance or reimburse the County for a portion of the costs for the design, construction and equipping of the wastewater collection, transmission and treatment facilities for the Johnson's Corner Sanitary Sewer District.

Mrs. Deaver introduced the Proposed Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE ISSUANCE OF UP TO \$10,500,000 OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF SUSSEX COUNTY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPPING OF THE JOHNSON'S CORNER SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT AND AUTHORIZING ALL NECESSARY ACTION IN CONNECTION THEREWITH". The Proposed Ordinance will be advertised for Public Hearing.

Mr. Godwin reviewed a police marine unit proposal that the Fenwick Island Police Department is pursuing through federal funding and Senator Edward Kaufman's office. The purpose of this project is to extend the law enforcement and the public safety capabilities of the Fenwick Island Police Department to cover the Little Assawoman Bay and water front properties. This project will service the needs of the citizens of Fenwick Island and visitors to the area as well as the boating public. Mr. Godwin advised that the Chief of Police William Boyden is asking for a letter of support from the County for the Federal funding process. It was noted that the Delaware State Police and Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control have indicated their support this endeavor. Mr. Godwin advised that the costs for the project would come from federal funding and various grants and that the County is not obligated to the funding of this project. Mr. Godwin presented and read a draft letter of support from the County.

Public Hearing/ Fees Relating to the Recorder of Deeds Mr. Cole questioned what recourse a person may have if they do not agree with the County's sewer charges. Gary Tonge, Director of Utility Permits, responded that an Appeals Board meets annually in March.

A Public Hearing was held on the Proposed Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 62, OF THE CODE OF SUSSEX COUNTY BY AMENDING ARTICLE VI, § 62-18, RELATING TO FEES CHARGED BY THE RECORDER OF DEEDS".

Mrs. Webb explained that this ordinance establishes fees for internet based searches of Recorder of Deeds records which have been digitized and entered into the online database maintained for the Recorder of Deeds Office and establishes charges for monthly subscriber fees and a discounted per page printing rate for subscribers and also establishes a per page rate for printing of digitized documents by users who do not elect to execute a subscriber agreement. It also authorizes the acceptance of electronic payment for the services to be provided to users of the online document database. The adoption of this ordinance will facilitate the access to recorded documents by users from remote locations utilizing the services of the internet.

Public comments were heard.

Dan Kramer of Greenwood questioned if documents can viewed online at no cost or if only the index can be viewed at no cost.

Cathy Pepper of the Recorder of Deeds Office explained that a fee would not be charged for viewing a document, only when a document is printed.

The Public Hearing was closed.

Additional Business

Under Additional Business, Henry James Johnson of Millsboro presented information on a problem he is having with the County regarding a Certificate of Compliance for a garage he constructed on his property that has four doors in the front and two doors in the back. The garage is located on the same property as his residence. Mr. Godwin was directed to look into the matter, to contact Mr. Johnson, and to report back to the Council.

Mr. Godwin advised that he was expecting a representative of Flexera who wished to address the Council regarding the installation of windmills, the County's lack of engineering/manufacturing specifications in the Code, and the fact that the County does not perform inspections on windmill construction. It was noted that new State legislation (House Bill No. 70) was

passed in June, which requires that all windmills must be constructed on a
minimum of one acre of land, unless the windmill is constructed on a roof.

Windmill Mr. Moore reported that he has been meeting with and discussing this Regulations matter with Rick Berl and Vince Robertson, Assistant County Attorneys.

Windmill It was the consensus of the Council that Mr. Moore would look into the Regulations possibility of drafting an ordinance to address windmill standards/specifications and inspections.
