Prime Hook National Wildlife Refuge/ Payment in Lieu of Taxes

Mr. Baker reported that a check in the amount of \$66,702.00 has been received from the United States Department of the Interior, Fish and Wildlife Service, as a federal payment in lieu of taxes for the Prime Hook National Wildlife Refuge. The check represents payment under the Refuge Revenue Sharing Act covering Fiscal Year 2002. Sussex County may use the funds for any governmental purpose.

Mr. Stickels noted that this year's payment is a \$5,000.00 increase over last year's payment in the amount of \$61,931.00 and a \$29,000.00 increase over the previous year's payment in the amount of \$37,263.00.

Mr. Baker presented for Council's authorization, the recommended distribution of the Refuge Revenue Sharing Funds, as follows: Milford School District - \$16,344.49; Cape Henlopen School District - \$35,106.69: Sussex Technical High School - \$5,162.20; Library - \$982.00; and Sussex County - \$9,107.00

Mr. Baker noted that the allocation is based on actual tax percentages.

Mr. Baker presented a draft ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF UP TO AN ADDITIONAL \$815,000 OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF SUSSEX COUNTY FOR THE CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPPING OF THE ELLENDALE SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT AND AUTHORIZING ALL NECESSARY ACTION IN CONNECTION THEREWITH". This Ordinance authorizes a loan in the amount of \$815,000 from the Department of Agriculture, Rural Development, Rural Utilities Service (RUS) for the Ellendale Sanitary Sewer District.

Draft Ordinance Relating to the Issuance of General Obligation Bonds/ Ellendale Sanitary Sewer District The Draft Ordinance provides for the issuance of up to an additional \$815,000 of Sussex County General Obligation Bonds in order to finance or refinance a portion of the costs for the design, construction, and equipping of the wastewater collection and transmission facilities for the Ellendale Sanitary Sewer District.

Mr. Baker reported that the RUS also approved, as part of the financing package, an additional \$570,000 in grant money. The County Council previously authorized \$1,250,000 in loans from the RUS for this project, as well as State SRF loan funding for \$2,726,000.

Mr. Baker noted that, due to construction cost increases, the financing plan had to be revised resulting in the request for the additional \$815,000.

Board of Adjustment/ Billboard Application

Council discussed a Board of Adjustment issue relating to the denial of an application for an advertising billboard in a commercially zoned area. It was noted that billboards are permitted in commercially zoned areas provided a special use exception is granted by the Board of Adjustment.

Board of Adjustment (continued) Questions were raised following the Board's decision to deny the application as to (1) whether there was a valid reason for denial and (2) Council's position on billboards. The Board's reasons for denial were as follows: (1) there is not a need for additional billboards and (2) there would be a negative impact on the area.

Mr. Stickels noted that if the Board of Adjustment denies an application, the applicant cannot reapply.

It was noted that Council is not taking a position on billboards and that billboard regulations have previously been established and remain in effect.

Mr. Stickels advised Council that there were no agenda items for the August 19th meeting. The August 19th meeting was to be the first night meeting.
