World Championship Punkin Chunkin Association/ Stephanie Coulbourne, Secretary for the World Championship Punkin Chunkin Association (WCPCA) was present to request \$10,000 in funding for the 23rd Annual Punkin Chunkin event to help offset expenses. She stated that, with the rising cost of insurance, fuel and other necessities, along with the associated cost incurred this year to move to a new location, the financial help of the County is imperative to the continuance of the

event in Sussex County. She noted that the Association supports charities such as St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital as well as provides scholarships to local students. Ms. Coulbourne commented on the event's economic benefit to Sussex County.

Administrator's Report

Mr. Baker read the following information in his Administrator's Report:

1. Beneficial Acceptance

The Engineering Department granted Beneficial Acceptance to The Preserve at Jefferson Creek – Phase I, Agreement No. 603-1, on September 18, 2008. The developer is Muddy Neck, L.L.C., and the project is located on County Road 363, 1/4 mile south of Muddy Neck Road in the South Bethany Sanitary Sewer District, consisting of 38 townhouses, eight single-family lots, and a clubhouse. Included with this report is a fact sheet on the project.

2. Delaware Transit Corporation Public Hearing Workshops

Delaware Transit Corporation will be holding two public workshops regarding DART bus service. The closest public hearing for Sussex County residents will be in Dover on Monday, September 29, from 3:30 to 6:30 p.m. As noted in the handout, no changes in service are recommended for Sussex County.

3. NASCAR Race Weekend

Over the past weekend, from Friday, September 19, through Sunday, September 21, 2008, approximately 200 race team crew members used the Sussex County Airport in Georgetown as a transportation route for the Dover NASCAR race. The County, as in the past, provided food for race team crew members at the airport on Sunday, September 21, 2008. Race teams from Dale Earnhardt, Inc., Gillett Evernham Motorsports, and Waltrip Racing used our airport. Many positive comments were received regarding the airport and the County's hospitality that provides an economic benefit to Sussex Countians.

Extension

The Public Hearing was continued on the matter of extending the boundaries of the Long Neck Sanitary Sewer District (LNSSD) to include the lands North of Bay Farm Road (CR 299), primarily from Route 24 to Route 298.

The Public Hearing was opened on September 16, 2008; on that date, the Council deferred action. Also, on that date, Michael Izzo, County Engineer, asked the residents of Bay Farm Road who were in attendance to provide a written statement as to whether or not they support or oppose the expansion. It was noted that attempts would be made to contact those residents on Bay Farm Road that did not respond to the first letter.

John Ashman, Director of Utility Planning, presented a brief update on the Public Hearing held on September 16th: all parcels in this annexation are along Bay Farm Road; all parcels were supplied laterals as part of The Peninsula Project; the total expansion size proposed is 15 acres; the parcels are primarily single-family lots; property owners will be subject to system connection charges of \$3,250.00 per lot; and the parcels are contiguous to the Long Neck Sanitary Sewer District.

Mr. Ashman distributed a map indicating the property owners along Bay Farm Road that wish to be included in the extension (shown in green).

Mr. Cole questioned if the County has the ability to adopt an ordinance which would allow owners of parcels located within an expansion area to connect at a time of their choosing.

Mr. Ashman stated that DNREC's permit requirements state that "the owner shall connect to the County or municipal sewer system if and when such services become available".

Public comments were heard. Rita Kilby spoke in opposition to the expansion.

There were no additional comments and the Public Hearing was closed.

Mr. Ashman stated that the legal description of the area outlined in the Proposed Resolution will be modified in accordance with the action taken by the Council on this date. Mr. Ashman noted that the title of the Resolution will remain the same.

Additional Business

Hugh Dolan of Millville presented information on a road situation in the County and he stated that some developers do not construct roads after they commit to do so (e.g. in Bird Haven). Mr. Dolan stated that there is a dirt road in Bird Haven and therefore, building permits are denied and it is difficult to sell lots. Mr. Dolan questioned what his options are and he asked the Council to consider adopting an ordinance to address this situation, requiring that property owners pay for the road construction. He stated that only 3 of the 11 property owners in Bird Haven are willing to contribute to improving the road. Mr. Dolan noted that the County's sewer system has been extended to this area.

Additional Business (continued)

Mr. Cole commented that property owners should be permitted to construct a home on lots along a dirt road. Mr. Cole questioned if the County could waive its requirements for this subdivision. (Mr. Griffin expressed concern that this may set a precedent.)

Mr. Dolan was advised of two options: (1) submit an application to the County's Suburban Community Improvement Program (although it was noted that a majority of the property owners would have to support a referendum) or (2) submit a request to State Legislators for State funding.

There was no additional business to be brought before the Council.
