Draft Ordinance Relating to Lot Mr. Baker explained that on September 18, 2007, the Council discussed a draft ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL CHAPTER 80, RELATING TO LOT MAINTENANCE AND TO AMEND CHAPTER 115, ZONING, ARTICLE XXV, SECTION 115-191 RELATING TO THE

Maintenance PARKING, STORING AND MAINTENANCE OF VEHICLES AND BOATS AND PROHIBITED GROWTHS AND ACCUMULATIONS ON NON-AGRICULTURAL LANDS, WASTE MATERIALS OUTSIDE COMMERCIAL PREMISES, ENFORCEMENT METHODS AND THE VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES RESULTING THEREFROM". Mr. Baker stated that on September 18th, the draft ordinance, as presented, allowed up to two boats and two cars on a lot which are either inoperable, dismantled, wrecked, etc. This has been changed (Page 4, B) to say that "No more than a total of 2 automotive vehicles, boats or other watercraft, which are either inoperable, dismantled, wrecked, or which display registration plates..."

Introduction of Proposed Ordinance

Mr. Dukes introduced the Proposed Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL CHAPTER 80, RELATING TO LOT MAINTENANCE AND TO AMEND CHAPTER 115, ZONING, ARTICLE XXV, SECTION 115-191 RELATING TO THE PARKING, STORING AND MAINTENANCE OF VEHICLES AND BOATS AND PROHIBITED GROWTHS AND ACCUMULATIONS ON NON-AGRICULTURAL LANDS, WASTE MATERIALS OUTSIDE COMMERCIAL PREMISES, ENFORCEMENT METHODS AND THE VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES RESULTING THEREFROM". The Proposed Ordinance will be advertised for Public Hearing.

Draft Ordinance/ "Clean Hands" Mr. Baker explained that on September 18, 2007, the Council discussed a draft ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT CHAPTER 116, ENFORCEMENT OF COUNTY OBLIGATION, TO REQUIRE RESIDENTS AND PROPERTY OWNERS TO BE CURRENT IN THE PAYMENT OF TAXES AND OTHER COUNTY OBLIGATIONS AS A CONDITION PRECEDENT TO MAKING APPLICATION FOR AND RECEIVING COUNTY APPROVALS, SERVICES, AND/OR PERMITS". Mr. Baker stated that there have been no changes to the wording since the draft was presented on September 18th.

Mr. Rogers referred to the last sentence in §116-3 on Page 2 which states that "If the party requesting County approval is current on some, but not all obligations owed to the County, the approval, permit, license and/or County service being applied for shall be denied until such time as all County obligations are current and fully complied with." Mr. Rogers suggested that the word "denied" be changed to "not considered", "withheld" or "not accepted".

Mr. Griffin stated that the Council could make this change during the Public Hearing process.

Introduction of Proposed Ordinance

Mr. Dukes introduced the Proposed Ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT CHAPTER 116, ENFORCEMENT OF COUNTY OBLIGATIONS, TO REQUIRE RESIDENTS AND PROPERTY OWNERS TO BE CURRENT IN THE PAYMENT OF TAXES AND OTHER COUNTY OBLIGATIONS AS A CONDITION PRECEDENT TO

## Administrator's Report

### 1. Sussex County Property Taxes

The due date for Sussex County property taxes is October 1, 2007. Checks received by mail postmarked after October 1 will be charged a one-and-one-half percent per month penalty. The Sussex County Treasury Division will be open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. throughout this week, Monday through Friday. #### 2. <u>Sussex County Airport Committee Meeting</u>

As per the attached announcement, a meeting of the Sussex County Airport Committee will be held on Wednesday, October 3, 2007, at 6:00 p.m. at the West Complex in Georgetown.

## 3. <u>Delaware Department of Transportation – Western Sussex County</u> <u>Improvements</u>

Attached are Press Releases issued by the Delaware Department of Transportation announcing road improvements to be made in the Seaford and Laurel areas, primarily near various Route 13 intersections. Construction is set to begin in late September and early October for these improvements.

## 4. NASCAR Dover Race Weekend

Approximately 100 race team members flew into the Sussex County Airport at Georgetown during the past weekend of September 20 through September 23, 2007. Racing teams including Mark Martin, Dale Earnhardt, Jr., Martin Truex, Jr., John Andretti, and others flew to and from the Sussex County Airport. Planes carrying up to 50 people arrived and left. Many positive comments were received regarding the hospitality offered at the County Airport.

Land Use Meeting

Mr. Baker reported that Public Meetings on the Land Use Plan would be held on this date at 6:30 p.m. at the Rehoboth Beach Convention Center and at 6:30 p.m. on September 26th at the Laurel Fire Hall.

**Prime** Hook/ **Payment** in Lieu of Taxes

Mrs. Webb reported that a check in the amount of \$62,291.00 has been received from the United States Department of the Interior, Fish and Wildlife Service, as a federal payment in lieu of taxes for the Prime Hook National Wildlife Refuge. The check represents payments under the Refuge Revenue Sharing Act covering Fiscal Year 2006. The amount is calculated by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service by prorating the total funds available for payment, including refuge receipts and supplemental appropriations. Sussex County may use the funds for any governmental purpose.

Mrs. Webb presented for the Council's authorization, the recommended distribution of the Refuge Revenue Sharing Funds, as follows: Milford School District - \$12,227.36; Cape Henlopen School District - \$38,879.48; Sussex Technical High School - \$3,879.08; Library - \$766.62; and Sussex County - \$6,538.46.

Mr. Rogers stated that the fire company spends a lot of time at the Prime Hook National Wildlife Refuge fighting fires and therefore, they should receive some of the funding.

Public Hearing/ Piney Neck Expansion of the DFSSD The Public Hearing was continued from September 18, 2007 on the Piney Neck Expansion of the Dagsboro – Frankford Sanitary Sewer District.

John Ashman, Director of Utility Planning, reported that an area resident spoke at the September 18th Public Hearing concerning being included in the proposed expansion; at that time, the resident was given contact information and was asked to call the County Engineering Department regarding his request. To date, the Engineering Department has not been contacted.

Mr. Ashman reported that they have been in contact with the developers who requested a deferment on September 18th and he stated that he believes they have resolved their differences. Mr. Ashman and Michael Izzo, County Engineer, noted that the major issue was the refunding of oversizing costs and that generally, credits are given for transmission or connection fees. Mr. Izzo stated that they are working with the developers to find other ways to reimburse for oversizing and that they have agreed to work toward this goal.

Mr. Ashman reported that all the parcels, as proposed on September 18th, remain in the Proposed Resolution for inclusion in the District.

Mark Chura of Ocean Atlantic Associates was present representing HKS, LLC. He expressed their thanks to the Council and to the Engineering Department for working through the details of their concerns. He stated that they support the expansion of the sanitary sewer district.

There were no additional public comments and the Public Hearing was closed.
