## FRANCES L. HAYES, COUNTY PENSIONER.

RE: Letter regarding Chapter 26, Subsection 26-8 of the Sussex County Code regarding pensions which states in part that "No person, while receiving a pension under this Chapter shall be employed by the government of Sussex County... unless elected by popular vote... and during such elected term he shall not be entitled to a pension unless he serves such term of office without pay." Ms. Hayes asked the Council to consider changing the Chapter to allow pensioners to run for elected office and to receive the salary commensurate with the elected position without loss of their pension.

# CAROLANN WICKS, SECRETARY, DELAWARE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, DOVER, DELAWARE.

RE: Letter to Councilwoman Joan Deaver in regards to her Project Nomination Form regarding access for residents of Briarwood to Route 24 and how future development may impact access to Route 24.

Delmarva Power/ MAPP Project Jim Smith and Jerry Elliott gave a presentation on the Mid-Atlantic Power Pathway (MAPP) Project, which is a high voltage transmission project which will serve the District of Columbia, Maryland and Delaware. The MAPP line will begin in southern Maryland, go underwater via the Chesapeake Bay, terminating at Indian River. The project will cost about \$1.2 billion and has a target completion date of 2014. Much of the East Coast relies on a congested power system that cannot meet rising demand without significant upgrades. As a result of this increasing demand for power, the existing transmission system in the region will not be able to keep up in the years ahead. Experts like the U.S. Department of Energy have said that building a new transmission line will help address this The MAPP project is a 150 to 171 mile transmission line that would significantly increase the region's ability to import power. Although the current recession has curbed demand somewhat, once the economy recovers, demand for electricity is expected to resume its growth. Work must be done now to ensure our power grid can handle the coming growth. Some of the benefits of MAPP are: (1) will greatly improve the reliability of the electric system on the Delmarva Peninsula, (2) will reduce the cost of energy by reducing congestion on the system, (3) will provide a greater access for renewable generation to the Delmarva Peninsula, and (4) will improve the cost of power for everyone, not just Delmarva Power customers.

Mr. Elliott stated that they are making presentations to counties and local officials to ask for letters of support. Mr. Elliott asked for Sussex County's support of the project.

Proposed Agreement Between Sheriff and the State of Delaware Mr. Baker presented a proposed Agreement with the State of Delaware for the County Sheriff's Office to deliver legal documents for Family Court and the Division of Child Support Enforcement. Currently, these documents are delivered by a private company, in accordance with a contract that expires on October 31, 2009. The State would prefer that our Sheriff's Office provide this service. The State has indicated that this may be bid out at a later date, if it is required by State Code. The State has advised that they are checking on this possible requirement and they have indicated they would welcome a bid from the County, if required.

Mr. Baker advised that the proposal at this time is for a month-to-month Agreement and the proposal is estimated to result in at least \$45,000 per year in net income for the County.

Proposed Bylaws Changes/ Advisory Committee on Aging and Adults with Physical Disabilities Mr. Baker presented proposed changes to the Bylaws of the Advisory Committee on Aging and Adults with Physical Disabilities. Mr. Baker explained that this Advisory Committee considers issues related to aging and physical disabilities. This Committee was established in 1988 by the Council.

The proposed changes are as follows:

- Change the name of the Advisory Council to Advisory *Committee*.
- Restatement of their purpose The Advisory Committee on Aging and Adults with Physical Disabilities serves as a liaison to the Sussex County Council. The mission of the Advisory Committee is to promote and advocate for the benefit of the aging and adults with physical disabilities of Sussex County by increasing dialogue, identifying unmet needs, and guiding and directing constituents to available programs and services.
- Membership terms shall be for two years or until their successors

are appointed.

- The officers of the Committee shall hold office for two years instead of one year.
- Three consecutive meeting absences may (instead of shall) constitute reason for replacement. The County Administrator would be notified of absences and whether the member in question wishes to remain on the Committee.

- The Chairperson shall appoint members to the various committees and subcommittees.
- Amendments to the Bylaws would be recommended by the Bylaws Subcommittee to the Advisory Committee, with final approval by the County Council.

The County Council approved this application on January 16, 2007 with ten conditions. The Planning and Zoning Commission granted a one year time extension on February 20, 2008 and January 14, 2009. The Commission has granted preliminary site plan approval for Artisans Bank, which is one of the four out-parcels on the project site.

Mrs. Deaver questioned the County's policy on granting time extensions.

Mr. Baker responded that time extensions are granted for a number of reasons, i.e. time delays associated with obtaining permits, recognition of the economic situation, etc.

Mrs. Deaver stated that the County should establish a written policy for time extensions.

# 2. <u>Emergency Operations Center – Incident Command System Course</u>

## 3. Sussex County Prescription Drug Discount Card Program Report

As per the attached report, 994 prescriptions were processed through the County's drug discount card program during September, resulting in an average 26.54 percent savings totaling \$15,168. This card is free and available at County libraries, the County Administration Building, senior centers, and participating pharmacies.

## 4. <u>Recovery Act News Release</u>

On October 23, 2009, the United States Department of Agriculture, Rural Development section, held a press conference highlighting the benefits of USDA Rural Development wastewater system funding through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. The USDA has partially funded the Johnson's Corner, Woodlands of Millsboro, and Pump Station 30 wastewater projects. This funding via the Federal Stimulus Program has helped provide needed jobs in Sussex County. The Johnson's Corner Sewer Project is now under construction.

# 5. <u>Beneficial Acceptance</u>

The Engineering Department granted Beneficial Acceptance to Sunrise (a/k/a Caldera Sunrise & Bethany Court), Revision 1, Agreement No. 883, on October 19, 2009. The developer is Pio's Bethany Lots, L.P., and the project is located on the east side of Route 1, north of Bethany, in the North Bethany Expansion of the Bethany Beach Sanitary Sewer District, consisting of the addition of a swimming pool at the north end of the site (revision to Agreement No. 723).
