Mr. Stickels, County Administrator, reviewed the following information in his County Administrator's Report:

1. Emergency/Disaster Declaration

As a result of the storm of December 11, 1992, an Emergency/Disaster Declaration has been filed with the Delaware Emergency Preparedness Office. Extensive damage was caused by the storm to the County's water and sewer districts in our coastal communities. To date, approximately \$90,000 has been spent. Included with this report is a copy of the declaration.

2. Industrial Park Advertising

Delaware Business Review featured a promotional advertisement of Sussex County industrial parks. The parks are located at the Sussex County Industrial Airpark, Georgetown; Selbyville Industrial Park, Selbyville; University of Delaware Research Park, Lewes; and Seaford Industrial Park, Seaford. Delaware Business Review has a circulation of 35,000 subscribers, with readership consisting mostly of decision-making executives. The area covered includes Northern Delaware, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and Maryland. In addition to this advertisement, ads will be featured in the Tri-State Real Estate Journal, Delaware Chamber of Commerce Annual Report, Slam Dunk Basketball Tournament Program Book, and the Winter Roller Skate Invitational Program Book.


The Sussex County Economic Development main priority for 1993 is to attract additional businesses to our industrial parks. Our promotional campaign is targeted at adjoining states that are experiencing high taxes.

3. Cedar Landing, Cedar Neck Road

Effective December 28, 1992, Sussex County will no longer issue building permits for the Cedar Landing Subdivision. The Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control has requested that no additional building permits be issued, as the developer has reached capacity for connections to his holding tank. Four homes are currently under construction and will not be issued certificates of occupancy until the Department has issued additional capacity.
