**EPCRA Reporting Program LEPC Report – March 2023** 

1. EPCRA Reporting Virtual Workshops

DNREC hosted four workshops in January for reporting facilities. The workshops covered both the regulatory background and the online reporting software, with specific emphasis on Tier II Reports due March 1st. 214 people attended throughout January, and post-event surveys indicate that they were well received. Videos of the workshops, as well as the presentations, are posted on DNREC's EPCRA webpage.

**DPH Briefing LEPC Meeting – March 2023** 

- Dr. Rick Hong continues as the Acting Director of the Division of Public Health
- Diane Hainsworth has been selected to serve as Chief of the Emergency Medical Services and Preparedness Section. Diane joined DPH in 2005 as the Training Administrator in the Office of Emergency Medical Services.
   She later was promoted to serve as the Statewide Paramedic Administrator

- and in 2011 was selected as the Director of the Office of Emergency Medical Services, where she has been integral in the daily operations of the EMS and Preparedness Section and played a critical role in the DPH response to the COVID pandemic.
- The Delaware Division of Public Health (DPH) Emergency Medical Services and Preparedness Section (EMSPS), Office of Preparedness held a Hazardous Materials Incident Response Annex (HMIRA) Workshop on Wednesday, February 8, 2023. The event was attended by twenty-one individuals from six organizations that have a role in hazardous materials (hazmat) incidents in Delaware. The plan is designed to outline the roles and responsibilities of DPH when responding to hazmat incidents in support of the Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC). The workshop was held to not only test the HMIRA through a tabletop exercise (TTX) but share organizational capacity and capabilities among hazmat incident response agencies. Gaps within the HMIRA were to be identified so the plan can reflect the most current information, as well as the current procedures that DPH will take during a hazmat incident response.
- DPH Office of Emergency Medical Services will conduct a Radiological Medical surge annex workshop on May 4 with a TTX exercise planned for June 1.
- State Health Operations Center (SHOC) remains at Level 2 for COVID-19 (US Public Health Emergency expected to end May 11, 2023)
