The process will be as follows: applications will be received from interested towns; a loan committee will review the application and make a recommendation to the Council; following Council approval, the loan will be closed and funds will be disbursed to the towns on a reimbursement type basis. The terms of the loans will be a maximum of \$250,000 at an interest rate of 1 percent and a maximum term of ten years. The applicant would be responsible for issuance costs. Mr. Baker explained that the purpose of the program is to promote economic development in the County.
