

The Sussex County Engineering Department has received a request from Love Creek MHC, LLC to annex the Love Creek Mobile Home Community, consisting of 168 homes and 10 campers, into the Sussex County Unified Sanitary Sewer District for the purpose of providing County central sewer service to parcel 334-18.00-32.00.

An income survey was completed by the University of Maryland, Environmental Finance Center revealing a Median Household Income of \$44,400.00 well below the 2024 countywide one of \$78,996.00.

The Community is located directly adjacent to the tidal portion of Love Creek. Under the State of Delaware's promulgated Pollution Control Strategy for the Inlands Bays the areas within 1,000 feet off water's edge were to be connected to central sewer under priority one in 2008. Love Creek has had its shell fishing halted many times in recent years due to contamination. However, to date no request was received despite several outreach attempts on the County's part.

The community is served by individual on-site "systems" with two homes per system. Most of the disposal areas are very limited in size and possibly not much more than a converted cesspool. If connected, the environmental impact of removing almost three tons of nitrogen per year from the Inland Bays is significant and in the best interest for the health and welfare of the entire area.



Time is of the essence to start the annexation process in order to file a Notice of Intent to qualify the project for the State's 2025 Intended Use Plan. Therefore, the Engineering Department requests permission to prepare and post notices for a Public Hearing on the annexation area as per Del Code Title 9 to be held at the February 4th Sussex County Council meeting. The public hearing will explain the project timeline and the potential costs to the residents. It will further allow the addition of adjoining properties also interested in connecting. The Department will reach out to two smaller mobile home parks in the same general area prior to the public hearing.

DATE: January 14, 2025

The County's five (5) year capital plan, as approved in the FY 23 Capital Budget, included the Cannon Road –Inland Bays Road Drainage Improvements and Constructed Wetlands, Project S22-05 located at the Inland Bays Regional Wastewater Facility utilizing a portion of the County's American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding.

This project reduces runoff discharges to Guinea Creek as well as nuisance flooding in the Cannon Road area and within the spray fields. In addition, it creates a significant water quality credit which can be used as a stormwater management offset for future projects including the ongoing plant expansion.

The wetland was designed in coordination with the Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) under a 5-year "operational-testing" program. The wetland is an innovative land based enhanced polishing and disposal option for wastewater effluent and groundwater with elevated nutrient levels. The initial design for the constructed wetlands portion of the project was first submitted to DNREC in 2020. As a result of DNREC's comments additional data acquisition, soil testing, hydrogeologic evaluations and surface water assessments were conducted summarized in the October 2022 Hydrogeological Report.



On November 17, 2022, invitations to bid for the Cannon Road/Inland Bays Road Drainage Improvements and Constructed Wetlands, Project S22-05 were publicly advertised and on December 21, 2022, six (6) bids were received.

The bid review revealed imbalances and mathematical errors in the apparent low bid and considering these errors and irregularities the bid was withdrawn. Kinsley Construction, Inc. of Dagsboro, Delaware submitted the lowest, responsive base bid and on January 10, 2023, Council awarded the project to Kinsley Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$11,467,000.00.

During the initial stages of the project the Environmental Services staff gained a better understanding of the objectives and made three improvement (3) requests associated with the South Field irrigation area. The first one involved an expanded hydroseeded buffer area on the downstream southern end of the field; the second one an additional drainage structure and piping next to Wetland 1 for an adjacent area ponding along the wetland maintenance access area; the third one was associated with the stabilization of the irrigation rig ruts. On June 6, 2023, County Council approved Change Order No.1 in the aggregate amount of \$34,953.00.

In October the Engineering Department requested pricing for the following objectives:

- The South Hettie irrigation field had initially been left out of the grading and replanting scope for cost considerations. However, it was beneficial to complete all the grading, eliminate the remaining ponding which poses permit challenges plant the area in meadow mix.
- During the construction of the submerged gravel wetland stone chimneys were deleted but subsequently more aquatic plants in the wetland itself as well as the outfall swale were added.
- The DNREC required four (4) two-inch monitoring wells around the submerged gravel wetland were added.
- A supplemental feed line essential for the initial hydration stages and during subsequent mid-summer months for aquatic plants survival was added.
- The bid included an allowance for two (2) suction lift pump systems. In cooperation with Kinsley's subcontractor the Department was able to value engineer the approach by switching to a system of wells with submersible pumps more than offsetting the cost by a reduction in the allowance.

October 10, 2023, County Council approved Change Order No. 2 in the aggregate amount of \$847,134.56 and the associated 55 calendar days extension.

The project is still on schedule despite several weather-related impacts. Even in the partially completed stage did the project prevent overtopping of Cannon Road during the most intense storm event.

The Department had previously advised Council of one last grading modification to eliminate an off-field ponding between the lagoon perimeter road and the North Spray Field. In addition to this known item listed under item 1 below several other issues arose.

- 1. Lagoon perimeter road and swale modifications (T&M) -- estimated at \$44,000.00.
- 2. Stormwater wetland 1 pilot channel repairs- completed for \$10,526.71.
- 3. North Spray Field electrical conduit test pitting- completed for \$7,776.50.
- 4. East Hettie Spray Field electric conduit and effluent lines test pitting (T&M) estimated at \$7,800.00.
- 5. Assistance for consultants RK&K to expose restrictive layer for infiltration testing-completed for \$18,660.00.
- 6. Goose damage repair to wetland replanting- three-way cost split between contractor, subcontractor, and County lump sum \$65,000.00.
- 7. Hydro-mulch hardening of wetland bypass swale and northern portion of Cannon Road swale completed based on unit pricing \$104,885.20.
- 8. Bypass swale repairs after damage by County's inappropriate irrigation techniques, since then corrected (T&M) estimated at \$52,000.00.
- 9. Lower electric conduits and effluent main in North Spray Field in conflict with grading to be completed in January (T&M) estimated at 58,000.00.

On December 5, 2023, Council approved Change Order No. 3 in the aggregate not to exceed amount of \$375,000.00.

The project site experienced a five-inch rain event between December 17th - 18th. The resulting run-off overtopped Cannon Road and washed-out part of the eastern shoulder as and undermined the road bed. Temporary repairs were completed allowing the road to reopen for vehicular travel. The permanent repair to the road surface scheduled to occur in the spring and will be covered in a future change order. To further improve drainage runoff from stormwater management pond 1, riprap armor was added to the low flow outfall.

To meet a DNREC requirement preliminary PFAS testing on the submerged gravel wetland sand and biomass was initiated. Erosion has continued to plague the constructed wetland bypass swale and the contractor was directed and has completed the installation of stone level spreaders plus riprap swales and slopes to prevent erosion by capturing the runoff and slowing its discharge rate into the bypass swale.

Change Order No. 4a (items 1-4 below) covering the following issues:

- 1. Bypass Swale stone channels and level spreaders completed PCO 19 for \$72,834.48.
- 2. Additional riprap at the Wet Pond 1 outfall weir under PCO 20 for \$12,434.15.
- 3. Initial Cannon Road repairs under PCO 21 for \$30,410.62 caused by the December 18th storm.
- 4. PFAS testing on the submerged gravel wetlands PCO 22 for \$1,012.12

It was determined that additional erosion control measures were need including but not limited to riprap bleeder swales and armoring of slopes along the constructed wetland bypass channel to halt erosion. Kinsley Construction, Inc. proffered PCO 23 however the Department recommends a not to exceed approach for up to \$95,800.00 based upon confirmed breakdown of labor and material.

On March 5, 2024, Council approved issuance of Change Order No. 4A in the amount of \$116,691.37 and Change Order No. 4B in the not to exceed amount of \$95,800.00 to be reconciled based on confirmed quantities.

A series of previously stabilized areas within the constructed wetland by-pass swale, the Cannon Road swale north of the facility entrance and the swale along Inland Bays Road were repeatedly compromised in subsequent storms. The Department in conjunction with Kinsley developed PCO 24 summarizing the additional erosion control effort to this point at a cost of \$138,576.08.

In addition, Environmental Services requested the assistance of Kinsley's subcontractor, ARRC, to "No-Till Drill" a new sand-tolerant seed mixture into fields that have established vegetation limiting erosion and reducing soil moisture loss. PCO 25 establishes a \$0.12/SY unit price for no-till meadow seed drilling of up to 95,000 SY at a not to exceed cost of \$11,400.00.

On April 30, 2024, Council approved Change Order No. 5A based on unit pricing in the not to exceed amount of \$11,400.00 and Change Order No. 5B in the amount of \$138,576.08 to Kinsley Construction, Inc.

However, over the last two months the following scope changes have actively tracked for potential approval under Change Orders No. 6A & 6B:

- 1. South Field had been originally regraded by JJID, Inc. under the General Labor & Equipment contract. However, recent storm events combined with higher-than-normal spray irrigation activities revealed some remaining grading deficiencies in the most southern 20-acres segment. It will be beneficial to complete all the grading and eliminate the remaining ponding which poses permit compliance challenges. The associated regrading will be using in situ material and is proposed by Kinsley Construction, Inc. under PCO 26 at a lump sum of \$434,800.00 and a net cost allowance per truck load of \$170.00 for other on-site material in the not to exceed amount of \$170,000.00.
- 2. A portion of the constructed wetland by-pass swale is subject to storm runoff sheet flows concentrating in several locations along a 700 feet long section. In order to prevent future wash outs in these limited swale segments the Department developed the attached revised living wall cross section, which is proposed by Kinsley Construction, Inc. under PCO No. 27 for a lump sum of \$226,234.00.
- 3. Irrigation and rainfall across the fields south of Inland Bays Road create a channel as they exit the Plant and enter the South Swale. The slope and adjoining bank should be

- armored with turf reinforcement matting for approximately 400 feet. is proposed by Kinsley Construction, Inc. under PCO No. 28 for a lump sum of \$23,592.00.
- 4. The submerged wetland will polish 300,000 gpd of treated effluent as well as 150,000 gpd of groundwater from new wells on site. Approximately 200 feet of steel sheeting should be installed to reinforce the toe of the north berm where seepage is occurring. Kinsley Construction, Inc. is proposing to complete this work under PCO No. 29 for a lump sum \$136,800.00.
- 5. Portions of our North and Center Swale areas along Cannon Rd. have been subject to storm runoff sheet flows concentrating in several locations, which will also be remediated with a living wall. Kinsley Construction, Inc. is proposing to complete this work under PCO No. 30 for a lump sum \$51,512.00.

On June 4, 2024, Council approved Change Order No. 6A for South Field regrading in the not to exceed amount of \$604,800.00 and Change Order No. 6B in the aggregate amount of \$438,138.00.

Since Council's approval of Change Order No. 6 additional adjustments had to be made to the project scope to reduce sediment erosion and to finetune grading in certain areas for further drainage improvement. The following scope modifications were implemented under a time and material tracking approach:

- 1. A temporary sediment trap near the corner of Inland Bay Road and Cannon Road was filled in. (PCO 35)
- 2. The auxiliary irrigation line for the constructed wetlands occasionally floated and disconnected requiring repeated repairs. (PCO 36)
- 3. Stone bedding pads and bollards around the North and South Groundwater Production Well Sites protecting control cabinets and wells were not included in the original contract drawings and had to be added. (PCO 37 & 39)
- 4. The South Burton Field swale grading reduced the effluent line "cover". For protection during future swale maintenance, it was partially encased in concrete. (PCO 40)
- 5. Fill material from the "Mt. Joy Borrow Area" was needed for grading operations south of Inland Bay Road and now doubles as a flood plain during heavy rainfall events. Contractor covered all costs except the permanent stabilization. (PCO 43).
- 6. A section of Cannon Road was initially repaired after a storm under Change Order No. 4. The DelDOT required permanent repairs included top course hot mix plus turf reinforcement matting in the shoulder area. (PCO 44)
- 7. The South Field and in a small portion of the West Hettie Field were improved with gravel drainage trenches. The section in the latter field required more gravel than originally designed. In addition, the contractor repaired a section of the gravel trench in the South Field after emergency repairs were made on the West and South Hettie irrigation rigs. (PCO 45 & 48).

8. Wet Pond 1 proved to be difficult to stabilize requiring riprap in addition to turf reinforcement matting on the incoming slopes carrying stormwater sheet flow runoff as well as the outfall slopes to prevent erosion of the adjacent spray field (PCO 46 & 51).

- 9. Forebay 1 also required riprap in two locations for energy dissipation of the runoff from the North and East Hettie Fields. (PCO 47)
- 10. The turf reinforcement matting along the Cannon Road swale was expanded to further armor the slopes downstream of the East and West Hettie irrigation pivots. (PCO 49 and 50) The initial turf reinforcement matting was covered under Change Order 6.
- 11. The facility previously had a secondary access road north of the effluent lagoons. The contractor was instructed to remove the gravel road surface and revegetate it matching the neighboring field. (PCO 52).
- 12. These additional work items required re-stabilization after each improvement because the Sussex Conservation District requires that less than 20 acres be disturbed at any time and that stabilization efforts be completed within 14 days. (PCO 54).

With the project conclusion, the Department was able to balance all unit price work items and allowances resulting in credit un der Change Order No. 8. In summary, the Department requests Council's concurrence to Change Order No. 7 in the aggregate amount of \$453,283.77, the final unit quantity balancing Change Order No. 8 in the deduct amount of \$(\$368,561.85) and the granting of Substantial Completion including release of retainage in accordance with the contract documents.

Overall, the project experienced a good start but was subjected to a record winter rainfall in 2023/2024, significant goose damage and an extended drought in the fall of 2024 affecting germination. Despite these adverse conditions, the overall change order percentage was contained at <24%.

A. GHD Amd. 28 – Ocean Outfall Benthic Testing & Dispersion Modeling

DATE: January 14, 2025

GHD, Inc., held the County's engineering services contract associated with the South Coastal RWF since December 7, 2001. Council reaffirmed GHD as the "Engineer of Record" for South Coastal in September of 2016 and again on May 14, 2019, at which time Council also included professional services associated with the City of Rehoboth Beach's Wastewater Treatment Plant. On July 16, 2024 County Council expanded GHD, Inc.'s reaffirmation as "Engineer of Record" for the County's wastewater treatment process related projects at all facilities through June 30, 2029.

In July of 2016, County Council authorized agreement negotiations with other wastewater service providers for the utilization of existing unallocated wastewater treatment capacity. On September 20, 2016, Council approved the initial agreement with the Lewes Board of Public Works (BPW) for wastewater treatment and disposal. It allowed for the transmission of a year-round base flow rate of up to 75,000 gallons per day into the BPW's system with a seasonal ramp up of up to 300,000 gallons per day during the fall/winter season.

In March of 2018, the LBPW requested an amendment to the Agreement allowing LBPW's service area tie-in(s) to the County's system and on March 20, 2018, Council approved Amendment No. 1 allowing wastewater to be transmitted and treated in the most cost-effective manner with the billing to be accomplished on a net zero metering basis.

On September 26, 2018, the County presented a request to increase the flow contributions at a Board meeting. Subsequently, the Board instructed their Counsel to draw up Amendment No. 2, which was accepted by County Council on January 8, 2018.



In 2021 both parties independently started planning for capital treatment plant improvements and expansions using GHD, Inc., the consultant already representing both entities. In addition, County Council committed substantial ARPA funding to the upgrade of wastewater treatment facilities in general and the Wolfe Neck RWF in particular. In this context, the County Engineer was authorized to initiate discussion with the BPW regarding increase cooperation.

This presented an opportunity to significantly reduce the LBPW's future long-term capital costs concerning sustainability of the wastewater treatment plant, especially compared to other potential options. Therefore, the Board held a series of workshops for public discussion and input and on March 31, 2022 decided to evaluate the following three (3) options:

- 1. Maintain wastewater treatment facility in its current flood plain location at its current capacity while "hardening" the perimeter to deal with climate change.
- 2. Relocate wastewater treatment facility outside of the flood plain, increase capacity to meet ultimate demand and investigate (2a) land treatment disposal, (2b) continued Canal discharge and (2c) ocean outfall.
- 3. Relocate wastewater treatment facility to Wolfe Neck in a partnership with County using the same capacity assumptions while investigating (3a) continued piped Canal discharge versus (3b) biological polishing.

The 2016 Agreement had established a "handshake" point splitting capital cost responsibility between the parties. Under options 1 & 2, all activities would occur on the Board's side of the handshake point and the County would participate on the agreed upon prorated percentage. Under option 3, most of the transmission and all the treatment plant capital upgrades would occur on the County side of said point.

On May 24, 2022, Council approved to fund 50% of the long-range study in the amount of \$124,250.00 utilizing allocated ARPA. The results of the study were presented to County Council on December 6, 2022. Since then, the BPW held workshops on February 10th, March 22nd, April 12th, May 17th and June 14th to continue the open decision-making process.

In late June Sussex County was informed by DNREC officials of significant findings during a Phase 1 archeological study at the Wolfe Neck RWF. These findings triggered a Phase 2 archeological study, encompassing the entire spray lease area. The impact has created uncertainty for biological polishing under option 3b as well as the proposed facility conversion from center pivot irrigation to a fixed-head irrigation in managed forests.

During the BPW workshop on August 9th the concept of an ocean outfall from the Wolfe Neck RWF emerged as study Option 3c. Under this scenario the County would construct a new 5.00 MGD treatment facility relying mainly on the outfall and only spray irrigate at agronomically required rates using the exiting irrigation systems. With BPW's waste load allocation in the Lewes-Rehoboth Canal no longer an asset, Option 3c would be a flow-based partnership requiring a new agreement detailing future operation and maintenance.

Due to archeological findings any Wolfe Neck treatment expansion can only occur in the location of the primary treatment lagoon requiring even more urgent removal of the accumulated biosolids. As a precursor of the removal, all incoming flows must be transferred to treatment lagoons 2 & 3. For the support of the biosolids removal and dewatering

equipment a new electrical service and power distribution center must be installed to accommodate both the immediate power needs as well as the future plant expansion.

On August 15, 2023, Council approved GHD's Amendment 22 – Advanced Electrical Design in the not to exceed amount of \$427,138.72 and Amendment 23 for the expansion of the long-range study to include Option 3c in the not to exceed amount of \$95,000.00, utilizing allocated ARPA funding.

Subsequently GHD developed construction documents for the associated electrical and general construction at the Wolfe Neck Facility with the option to bid on one or both segments of the work. The project was publicly advertised and on April 18, 2024, two (2) bids were received for the Electrical Construction and one (1) bid was received for the General Construction.

BW Electric, Inc.'s low bid for the Electrical Construction was within budget. However, the bid for General Construction came in well above budget. At the time of bid the County had three (3) open general construction projects with different companies. All three, Bancroft, Whayland and Ronca are capable of performing the scope but chose not to bid. Therefore, the Engineering Department recommended, and Council concurred to approach each company requesting competitive proposals for a potential change order under.

On April 30, 2024, Council approved award of the Electrical Construction to BW Electric, Inc. in the low bid amount of \$5,000,000.00, rejecting the sole General Construction bid and soliciting three proposals under an alternate delivery method.

The Whayland Company, Bancroft Construction, and M.F. Ronca were sent a request for proposals. BW Electric was later invited to bid since they were awarded the electrical portion of the project. On June 7, 2024 four (4) proposals were received with the lowest responsible offer by Bancroft Construction at \$1,376,000.00. The Engineering Department requested GHD to submit an amendment for construction phase engineering services for both contracts at the Wolfe Neck Facility and on June 11, 2024, Council awarded the general construction contract to Bancroft Construction in addition to approving GHD's Amendment 25 in the not to exceed amount of \$736,342.23.

City of Rehoboth Beach and Sussex County had a very successful wastewater partnership since the 1970s with the current 25-year agreement dating to 2017. It contains a 42% county capacity allocation which can be increased to 50%. The debt service is based on the reserve allocation while the operational and maintenance expenses are based on percentage of flow.

Given, this partnership background the County jointly with the Lewes BPW approached the City in the spring of 2024 with a proposal to purchase 5.0 MGD of unused ocean outfall capacity for \$20 million in lieu of constructing another outfall off Wolfe Neck.

After receipt of the joint request the City Commissioners held five (5) public meetings culminating on December 20, 2024 with a conditional approval motion after considering favorable recommendations from city staff and the city's independent engineering consultant. The conditions centered around value, risk assessment, bi-directional flow capabilities and hydraulic analyses among others. However, under either outfall option the County and the

Lewes BPW must expeditiously either update previous ocean studies or initiate new ones off Wolfe Neck.

In order to accomplish this task, the Engineering Department requested attached Amendment 28 from GHD to initiate up to four (4) sampling events and reports of the near field benthic zone associated with the city's outfall. The benthic zone being the lowest ecological zone involving the sediments at the seafloor which play an important role for the organisms living in that zone. In addition, the previous dispersion modeling must be updated reflecting the increased effluent flow rates and waste loadings.

The Engineering Department recommends approval of GHD's Amendment 28 in the not to exceed amount of \$474,000.00 allowing for immediate scheduling of the first four (4) rounds of ocean sample collections.

Notwithstanding any language to the contrary in such Amendments, the parties agree that those Amendments are intended to be additions to the Original Contract between the parties dated December 7, 2001.
- 4.4.2 In accordance with the method of fee determination described in Articles 4.3.1, 4.3.2, 4.3.3, and 4.3.4 of this Agreement, the total compensation and reimbursement obligated and to be paid the CONSULTANT by the COUNTY for the CONSULTANT's Scope of Services for **Benthic Study and Dispersion Modeling** as set forth in **Attachment A**, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference, shall not exceed **Four Hundred Seventy-Four Thousand dollars (\$474,000.00)**. In the event of any discrepancy or inconsistency between the amounts set forth in this Article 4.4.2 and any appendices, exhibits, attachments or other sections of this Agreement, the amounts set forth in this Article 4.4.2 shall govern.

ARTICLE FOURTEEN

14.2 Attachment A: Consultant's Scope of Services, Benthic Study and Dispersion Modeling (Contract Amendment No. 28).

By execution of this Agreement, the following sections are amended as set forth below:

- 2.4 The CONSULTANT shall perform the Scope of Services attached hereto as Attachment A and all additional Scopes of Services as may be set forth in consecutively numbered subsets of Attachment A.
- 4.3 The COUNTY shall pay the CONSULTANT for the satisfactory completion of the Scope of Services specified herein before in Attachment A <u>and all additional Scopes of Services</u> as may be set forth in consecutively numbered subsets of Attachment, based on and limited to the following method of determination...."

Benthic Study and Dispersion Modeling

Dear Mr. Medlarz & Mr. Harmer

GHD is pleased to submit this proposal for Benthic Study and Dispersion Modelling associated with the potential disposal of treated effluent from the Wolfe Neck Regional Wastewater Facility (WNRWF) via the existing Rehoboth Beach WWTP ocean outfall.

Introduction

Sussex County is planning on upgrading and expanding the WNRWF to approximately 5 MGD to accommodate growth and allow decommissioning of the Lewes WWTP. GHD has been assisting Sussex County and the Lewes Board of Public Works in numerous preparatory tasks for this expansion project.

Sussex County and the City of Rehoboth Beach are discussing the utilization of unused capacity in the Rehoboth Beach WWTP ocean outfall for discharge of treated effluent from the upgraded and expanded WNRWF. If agreement is reached, Sussex County would seek the permits from DNREC required to construct the new facility and discharge into the ocean via the existing ocean outfall. In anticipation of permitting requirements, GHD will oversee benthic testing for establishment of baseline conditions at the ocean outfall discharge location and update near-field dispersion modeling to reflect increased flows associated with the addition of treated effluent from the WNRWF.

Scope of Services

GHD will provide the following services:

- Benthic Testing
 - Subconsultant management and coordination.
 - b. Development of a benthic testing plan with input from a subconsultant and GHD staff.
 - c. Coordination with DNREC regarding the benthic testing plan, and incorporation of any feedback from DNREC into the benthic testing plan.
 - d. Ongoing liaison with DNREC over the course of benthic testing.
 - e. Completion of up to four instances of benthic testing with associated reporting, and with the first mobilization anticipated to occur as soon as early spring of 2025. It is anticipated that subsequent

testing might be completed in the winter of 2025 and then in the spring and winter of 2026, depending on the outcome of discussions with DNREC. Refer to the subconsultant proposal for preliminary details.

- 2. Near-Field Dispersion Modeling utilizing CORMIX
 - a. Discuss design flows and loads with Sussex County and agree on flows and loads to include in modeling.
 - b. Complete near-field dispersion modeling in CORMIX for the existing Rehoboth Beach WWTP ocean outfall and the agreed flows and loads from Rehoboth Beach WWTP and the WNRWF. Modeling will rely on previous assumptions for ambient ocean characteristics, currents and water quality.
 - c. Use CORMIX model results to determine appropriate dilution factor.
 - d. Reporting (draft and final technical memorandum).

County Responsibilities

- 1. Participation in meetings and communications with DNREC.
- 2. Participation in meetings to determine agreed flows and loads for the combined discharge from the Rehoboth Beach WWTP and the WNRWF.

Schedule

- The objective of this amendment is to have the first phase of benthic testing completed as soon as
 possible within any timeframe required by DNREC. It is anticipated that this could be as soon as early
 spring of 2025.
- 2. Draft reports from the subconsultant within 5 months of each field work mobilization.
- 3. Dispersion modelling will be completed within 3 months of NTP.

Subconsultants

1. Benthic Study: Versar, Inc.

Engineering Fee

GHD proposes to provide engineering services based on direct hourly payroll costs paid to technical staff engaged on the project plus FAR overhead costs of 1.83 times actual payroll costs billed, plus a fixed fee of 10% on direct costs plus FAR overhead costs and a fixed fee of 10% on subconsultant costs. Payroll rates presented on invoices will be constrained by the maximums specified in the attached rate schedule. This rate schedule is valid until June 30, 2025, and subject to adjustment at that time and on an annual basis thereafter. Total cost for this amendment shall not exceed the total identified in the following table. However, these costs are considered preliminary estimates only, especially in the case of the benthic study which has not yet been discussed with DNREC. If the cost of total services reaches the budget of this amendment, a future amendment would be required to cover the costs of remaining services.

GHD, Inc., has asked Versar Global Solutions, Inc. (Versar) for a proposal to conduct a new baseline benthic study for the existing ocean outfall off the coast of Delaware at Rehoboth Beach. An ocean outfall conveys treated effluent to a diffuser located 1.8 km offshore in 12 meters of water. Previous baseline and impact studies were conducted by Versar between 2017 and 2019 before and after the construction of the outfall and start of effluent discharge. Effluent discharge may be increased at the outfall, and for this a new baseline study is required. A general proposal and scope of services is provided below.

SAMPLING DESIGN

This proposal is for a baseline benthic survey to be conducted in spring 2025, or as specified by the State of Delaware. Additional benthic surveys will be needed in other seasons and will be submitted at a later time upon request.

Sampling in early spring 2025 will take place in the vicinity of the current diffuser and within a reference area. Within these two areas sediment samples will be collected for analysis of benthic community abundance, composition, and biomass, and for characterization of sediment grain size and total organic carbon content. In addition, water temperature, conductivity, salinity, dissolved oxygen, pH, and turbidity will be measured at the surface and near the bottom of the water column at all sampling sites.

Sampling near the diffuser will be performed within two circular plots similar to those employed in the 2017-2019 surveys, with a combined diameter of 600 meters or larger, depending on anticipated effluent increase. Plot 1 for assessment of nearfield effects will encompass the diffuser within a radial distance of 100 m from the outfall. Plot 2 for assessment of farfield effects will be at a radial distance of 100 m to 300 m or more from the outfall.

A reference area (Plot 3) of similar size and depth as the outfall area will be established north of the outfall. Based on the results of the previous surveys, the location of the reference area will be reassessed. This area had slightly coarser sediments than the outfall area in the previous study, and this introduces variability in the benthic data. Variability can mask the potential effects of an impact. An effort should be made at reducing variability in sediment composition. An alternative design consisting of radial transects originating at the diffuser site and extending beyond the anticipated effluent impact area into a reference area will be evaluated.

Sampling sites will be allocated at random in sectors within plots, so that there is a homogeneous spread of sampling sites within plots. Each plot will receive 10 sampling sites, for a total of 30 sampling sites to be used in the spring survey. At each sampling site two sediment samples will be collected, one for the analysis of benthic invertebrates and one for the analysis of sediment characteristics.

Although 30 samples will be used for the analysis of benthic invertebrates, we propose as



an option to double the amount of sampling sites in the field (20 sites in each plot for a total of 60 sampling sites) in order to select samples that represent the predominant sediment type in the sampling area.

Past surveys revealed considerable sediment variability within plots. Some of the sampling sites were atypical, with either too much coarse material or a wide spread of grain size from pebbles to very fine sand particles. This introduces variability in the benthic data. We propose to bring all 60 benthic and sediment samples to the laboratory, conduct a gross characterization of grain size on the sediment samples, and select 30 samples among the 60 (10 in each plot, in order of random outcome) that are within the grain size range representative of the predominant sediment type in the area. We will then process the corresponding 30 benthic samples and complete the sediment characterization. This will reduce variability in the benthic data. Unprocessed benthic samples will be archived.

SAMPLING AND LABORATORY METHODS

The survey will be conducted from a 25-foot research vessel equipped with an electric winch, benthic gears, and depth finder, VHF radio, and differential GPS. Samples will be collected with a Young-modified van Veen grab with a sediment surface sampling area of 440 square centimeters(cm) to a depth of 10 cm. Separate grabs for benthic invertebrates and sediment grain size analysis and organic carbon content determination will be collected at each sampling site. Benthic samples will be sieved through a 0.5-millimeter (500 micron) screen in the field, and the organisms preserved in 10% buffered formaldehyde. The top two (2) centimeters of sediment from the second grab will be removed and placed in labeled sediment bags for subsequent grain size and organic carbon analysis. Water quality parameters will be measured with a YSI water quality sonde.

In the laboratory, organisms will be sorted under the microscope and the macrofauna enumerated and identified to species level whenever possible. Quality control procedures (resorting and re-ID) will be implemented in 10% of the samples. Biomass will be measured on a taxon-specific basis by drying each taxon at 60 °C, weighing, ashing at 500 °C, and re-weighing to obtain ash-free dry weight. Grain size of sediment samples will be determined by wet sieving to obtain sand-size categories in the Wentworth grade scale, and by pipetting to obtain percent silt-clay. Total carbon and total nitrogen in the sediments will be determined by combustion at high temperature in an Exeter Elemental Analyzer.

DATA ANALYSIS AND REPORTING

All data will be entered in a relational Microsoft Access© database. Abundance, biomass, and diversity measures will be computed, examined, and plotted. Presence of economically important species will be noted. The data will be setup so that an areas-by-time factorial analysis of variance can be conducted later to evaluate the potential impacts from increased effluent at the outfall. Multivariate analyses (classification, ordination, and permutational analysis of variance) will be conducted to delineate groups of samples with similar benthic composition and test for differences among the groups. All data analyses will be summarized in a professional quality report



that will include tabular summaries of the benthic species that occur at the project site.

KEY PERSONNEL

Roberto Llansó (Ph.D., Marine Science, The College of William and Mary, 1990) will be Versar's proposed Principal Investigator. **David Wong** (B.S., Marine Biology, University of Maryland, 1999) will be Field Coordinator and Project Manager. **Suzanne Arcuri** (B.S., Biology, Pennsylvania State University, 1987) is Senior Taxonomist at Versar (>35 yrs. experience) and will be Laboratory Manager for this project.

ANTICIPATED SCHEDULE

Field sampling will take 3-4 days of good weather to complete. A standby rate for inclement weather applies. Benthic samples are typically completed within 120 days of collection (the industry standard) or better. Individual sample processing time is dependent of the number of species, total densities, and the amount of detritus collected by the grab. We anticipate a draft report within five (5) months of sample collection.



ESTIMATED PROJECT BUDGET

Versar is providing the following prices based upon the proposed scope of work outlined above and assumptions based on previous surveys conducted at the Rehoboth Beach Outfall. Prices are estimated and will be adjusted and finalized once a scope is established by GHD.
