Criteria for a Variance

1. Uniqueness of property

The new pole building placement must be the same width as the previous garage due to the placement of the house on the lot. The building may not be built closer to the house due to the existing well and a porch. The other side of the house has the septic system so we cannot build a garage on the septic side.

- 2. Cannot otherwise be developed Because the other side of the house has the peat moss septic system, a garage needs to be located on the right side of the house (when looking at it from the street).
- 3. Not created by the applicant
 The previous garage location was 8' from the property line and the placement of the septic
 system and well determine that this is the only location where a garage can be built.
- 4. Will not alter the essential character of the neighborhood

 There are several pole buildings and large garages in our neighborhood and our proposed

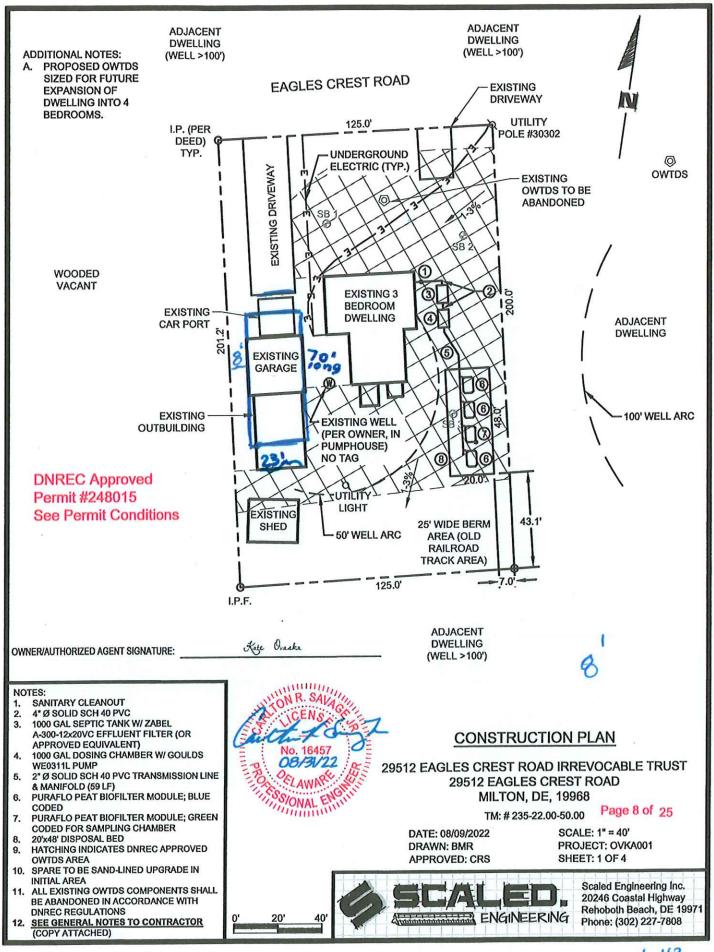

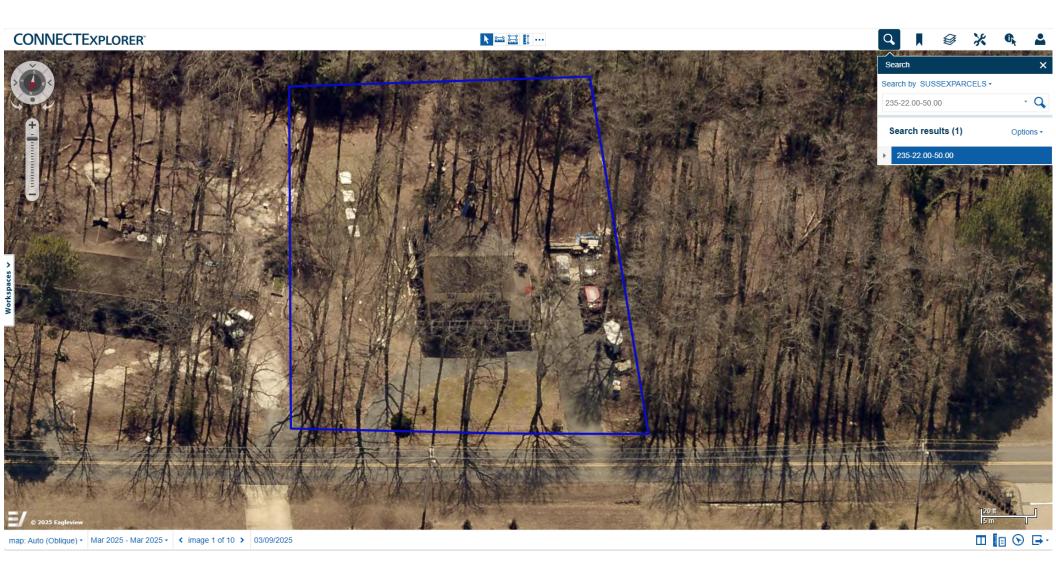

ADDENDUM "A" TO BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT APPLICATION

I. BACKGROUND

The subject property ("Property") is owned by the Ernest E. Megee, Jr., Irrevocable Turst of December 23, 1993 ("Owner") and is located at 22975 Lewis Georgetown Highway, Georgetown, Sussex County, Delaware. The Property is further identified as Tax Parcel Number 135-16.00-12.00 and is presently zoned C-1 General Commercial. The general area has some commercial activity, with nearby businesses like A. P. Croll & Son (at 22997 Lewes Georgetown Hwy) and other commercial and professional parks.

TowerNorth Development, LLC (together "Applicant") proposes the installation of a personal wireless services facility (monopole) at the Property for the use and benefit of wireless service providers. New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC, d/b/a AT&T Mobility ("AT&T") is the anchor tenant on the proposed monopole. AT&T is licensed by the Federal Communications Commission. The personal wireless services facility (the "Facility") shall consist of a 145' monopole with lightening rod extending to a height of 149 feet, wireless antennas and support platform. The Facility will also include a concrete pad on which the radio-equipment cabinets of AT&T will be placed, and a 6 foot-high chain link fence surrounding the Facility. The monopole and leased area will be designed to accommodate up to three (3) wireless providers.

The Facility is proposed to remedy a significant gap in wireless coverage in AT&T's wireless network in the vicinity of the Property. The proposed Facility represents the least intrusive means of solving this significant coverage gap in network coverage.

II. REQUEST FOR RELIEF

Applicant requests the following:

1. A special use exception pursuant to and consistent with Section 115-194.2.A of the Sussex County Code ("County Code") to allow for the installation and use of the Facility in accordance with the plans prepared by Network Connex dated August 1, 2025. The special use exception is triggered because the proposed monopole is located within 500 feet of the GR-General

Residential district to the northwest. That district measures about 282 feet from the proposed Facility.

- 2. A variance from the provisions of Section 115-194.2.H of the County Code which requires the installation of air traffic warning lights to be located at 50-foot intervals on the tower. The Delaware Coastal Airport is located about 1.3 miles southwest of the proposed Facility. While lighting on the tower may be required, the agency having jurisdiction over the need for air traffic control lighting and marking is the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). Typically, warning lighting is mandated by the FAA and typically, if required, is only placed on the top of the tower. As such, Applicant requests that a variance be granted by the Board of Adjustment to require any warning lighting/markings as may ultimately be mandated by the FAA.
 - 3. To the extent necessary, site plan approval.
- 4. Applicant also applies for such other interpretations, waivers, variances or other relief and/or approvals as may ultimately be required.

III. NARRATIVE IN SUPPORT OF REQUESTED ZONING RELIEF

The following narrative discusses the criteria applicable to the Application and why the proposed use is suitable for the Property and is in the best interests of the community.

County Code, Section 115-194.2 Commercial communications towers and antennas.

A. In nonresidential districts, no minimum lot size shall be required nor shall a special use exception be required, except that if any new freestanding commercial communications tower or antenna or monopole is to be erected within 500 feet of any residentially zoned lot, improved or which can be improved with a residential dwelling unit, a special use exception shall be required.

Since the Facility will be located about 282 feet from the GR General Residential district, a special use exception is required by the County Code. The present Application is submitted as required.

B. Collocation of telecommunications equipment on existing freestanding towers, antennas, monopoles, buildings, water towers/tanks and other similar structures shall be permitted without special use exception, subject to site plan review by the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Proofs shall be offered with testimony at the time of the hearing before the Board of Adjustment to establish that no available tall structures exist which are located within the required service area of the proposed Facility to satisfy the network requirements of AT&T.

C. All applicants for special use exceptions shall submit a site plan and appropriate documentation demonstrating compliance with the applicable conditions listed in this section.

The required site plans and other supporting documentation have been submitted with the Application to demonstrate compliance with the applicable conditions listed in Section 115-194.2 of the County Code.

D. The applicant shall submit to the Board of Adjustment documentation showing that existing structures within a two-mile radius of the proposed location are not available for collocation. Any application for a new commercial communications tower or antenna or monopole shall include documentation substantiating the need for such tower at the proposed location.

Applicant has submitted with the Application an alternatives analysis which shows the alternative sites considered within a two-mile radius, and rationale for rejection of those candidates as viable solutions to addressing the gap in wireless coverage. Additional proofs shall be offered with testimony at the time of the hearing before the Board of Adjustment to establish that no available tall structures exist which are located within the required service area of the proposed Facility to satisfy the network requirements of AT&T.

E. All new towers or antennas or monopoles shall be designed to accommodate at least two additional PCS/cellular platforms.

The proposed monopole shall be designed to support the antenna arrays and equipment of at least three (3) wireless providers. Applicant is willing to agree in writing to the imposition a condition to that effect as a requirement of any approval of its Application.

F. All new freestanding towers or antennas or monopoles shall be set back from adjoining property lines by a minimum of 1/3 the height of the tower, antenna or monopole.

The required setback for a 145-foot monopole is 48.33 feet. The proposed monopole shall be setback a minimum of 48.42 feet to the nearest property line to the west, which complies with the County Code.

G. Pad sites, ground equipment structures and guy wires shall be surrounded by a minimum six-foot tall fence.

The Facility shall be surrounded by a chain-link fence, six (6) feet in height. As a further security measure, 1-foot of barbed wire shall be placed above the fence, so that the overall height of the fence will be seven (7) feet, which complies with the County Code.

H. All towers, antennas, or monopoles shall have warning lights. Such lights shall be placed every 50 feet of elevation. The tower, antenna or monopole shall meet all applicable requirements of the Federal Communications Commission and the Federal Aviation Administration.

Applicant has completed an analysis of the impact of the Facility on air traffic navigation. The Delaware Coastal Airport is located about 1.3 miles southwest of the proposed Facility. While lighting on the tower may be required, the agency having jurisdiction over the need for air traffic control lighting and marking is the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). Typically, warning lighting is mandated by the FAA and typically, if required, is only placed on the top of the tower. As such, Applicant requests that a variance be granted by the Board of Adjustment to require any warning lighting/markings as may ultimately be mandated by the FAA, in lieu of mandating placement of warning lights at 50-foot intervals. Applicant is willing to agree as a conditional of any approval that the tower, antenna or monopole shall meet all applicable requirements of the Federal Communications Commission and the Federal Aviation Administration.

I. Any tower, antenna or monopole that is not operated for a continuous period of six months shall be considered abandoned, and the owner of such tower or antenna or monopole shall remove the same within 90 days of a receipt of notice from the county notifying the owner of such abandonment. If such tower is not removed within 90 days, the county may remove the tower or antenna or monopole at the owner's expense.

Applicant is willing to agree to the above requirement as a condition of any approval which the Board of Adjustment may grant.

J. No signs shall be permitted on any commercial antenna or towers or monopole. Any blinking or rotating lights thereon shall be screened so as not to throw their light below the horizontal plane upon which they are located, except as required by the Federal Aviation Administration.

Applicant is willing to agree to the above requirement as a condition of any approval which the Board of Adjustment may grant.

IV. FURTHER REASONS IN SUPPORT OF REQUESTED ZONING RELIEF

- 1. The addition of a telecommunication facility, a passive communications use, is a suitable and appropriate use of the Property. The use will not adversely affect the uses of adjacent and neighboring properties.
- 2. The proposed use will serve the best interest of the County, the convenience of the community, and the public welfare by making wireless telecommunications service available and by designing the Facility to accommodate additional providers.

- 3. The proposed use will be entirely consistent with the logical, efficient and economical extension of public services and facilities within the County including police and fire protection.
- 4. The proposed use will be designed in accordance with all applicable safety and industry standards and will not endanger the safety of persons or property.
- 5. The proposed use will not impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent property.
- 6. The proposed use will not adversely affect transportation or unduly burden public facilities.
- 7. The Facility will with all applicable standards established by the Federal Communications Commission.
- 8. The Facility shall not cause radio frequency interference with other communications facilities located in the County.
- 9. AT&T is licensed by the Federal Communications Commission to operate the Facility.
- 10. The Facility shall comply with all applicable Federal Aviation Administration Regulations.
- 11. The surrounding neighborhood will not be subjected to objectionable noise, lighting, glare, heat, ventilation, smoke, fumes, vapors, dust, dirt, gases or radioactive or electrical disturbances by the proposed use.
- 12. The Facility will be maintained in a safe manner in accordance with the requirements of the applicable building codes.
- 13. The placement of the proposed service cannot be provided through co-location with an existing facility or attachment to an existing structure.

For all of the reasons stated above, Applicant requests the above referenced relief and any other relief the Board of Adjustment deems necessary.

This office represents TowerNorth Development, LLC ("TowerNorth") with respect to the enclosed Application to the Sussex County Board of Adjustment relating to its telecommunications facility proposed on the Megee property located at 22975 Lewis Georgetown Road, Georgetown, DE (the "Property"). The Property is further identified as Parcel 135-16.00-12.00 and is located within the C-1 General Commercial District.

There is a need for enhanced wireless service coverage within the County, including New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC, d/b/a AT&T Mobility ("AT&T"). TowerNorth is a telecommunications company which provides infrastructure facilities needed by the providers of personal wireless services licensed by the Federal Communications Commission. To achieve enhanced coverage, TowerNorth proposes the installation of a new monopole antenna support structure extending to a height of 145 feet. AT&T will attach its panel-style antennas to the top of the tower, together with supporting electronic equipment. Fiber cables will connect to the antennas, run inside the tower, and will be attached to radio equipment located at the base of the tower. The radio equipment will be housed within a walk-in equipment cabinet having a footprint of about 44 square feet. Additional cabinets will be placed to connect the facility to the national telephone network. The facility (as described, the "Facility") will be contained within a 50' x 50' compound. The compound shall be surrounded by a chain-link security fence, six (6) feet in height with an additional 1-foot of barbed wire for security.

I have received and executed your request that I perform an independent evaluation and certification of the anticipated radio-frequency emission levels for the AT&T telecommunications facility proposed at the above-referenced coordinates. The intention of this study is to verify compliance with Federal Communications Commission (hereafter "FCC") guidelines for human exposure limits to radio-frequency electromagnetic fields as per FCC Code of Federal Regulation 47 CFR 1.1307 and 1.1310 which incorporate ANSI standards C95.3. As a registered Professional Engineer, I am bound by a code of ethics to hold paramount the safety, health, and welfare of the public. All statements and calculations offered herein are made in an objective and truthful manner pursuant to that code.

Summary of Findings

The maximum exposure to radio-frequency emissions from the above referenced AT&T facility will be complaint with FCC exposure limits. Using upper limit assumptions for the AT&T equipment configurations the cumulative radio-frequency exposure levels would be less than 2.3% of the applicable FCC standard at all locations of public access. The following charts specifically illustrate the anticipated exposure levels in areas surrounding the facility. All exposure limits have been calculated using the methods prescribed in FCC Office of Engineering and Technology (OET) Bulletin 65 "Evaluating Compliance with FCC Guidelines for Human Exposure to Radio-frequency Electromagnetic Fields". The upper-limit conditions include maximum traffic loading, significant antenna down-tilt, maximum pattern gain, and constructive interference from ground reflection. AT&T will remain within their FCC governed limits for output power but for worst-case analysis purposes, the equipment theoretical output power is considered in this analysis. Additionally, signal attenuation due to environmental clutter such as buildings, trees, and roadways has been ignored which will overestimate actual power

densities. Continuous exposure up to 100% of FCC limit is considered by the scientific community to be just as safe as continuous exposure at 1% of FCC limit.

Applicability of the National Telecommunications Act of 1996

This Act states that "no state or local government or instrumentality thereof may regulate the placement, construction, and modification of personal wireless service facilities on the basis of the environmental effects of radio-frequency emissions to the extent that such facilities comply with the (Federal Communications) Commission's regulations concerning such emissions". As indicated above, this proposed facility will be in full compliance with the FCC's emissions standards and as such is beyond regulation in that regard.

Technical Parameters of Consideration

According to the configuration information furnished by its representatives, AT&T plans to add nine (9) new panel-style antennas in three (3) arrays of three (3) antennas per array. The average antenna centerline height will be 140' above grade with sector azimuths of 80°, 200°, and 320° in the horizontal plane with respect to true north. Transmitting through these antennas will be up to twelve (12) LTE transmit paths in the 700 MHz band (per sector) at a cumulative maximum of 480 watts, up to eight (8) 5GNR transmit paths in the 1900 MHz band (per sector) at a cumulative maximum of 240 watts, up to four (4) 5GNR transmit paths in the 2100 MHz band (per sector) at a cumulative maximum of 240 watts, up to four (4) 5GNR transmit paths in the 850 MHz band (per sector) at a cumulative maximum of 240 watts, up to sixty-four (64) 5GNR transmit paths in the 3700 MHz C-Band band (per sector) at a cumulative maximum of 320 watts radio power, and up to sixty-four (64) 5GNR transmit paths in the 3500 MHz DoD-Band band (per sector) at a cumulative maximum of 320 watts radio power.

Co-location of Other Wireless Providers

In an attempt to halt the proliferation of telecommunications structures and preserve as much of their natural landscape as possible many municipalities have adopted telecommunications ordinances that specifically require structures to accommodate additional wireless providers from a structural standpoint. From the standpoint of radio-frequency exposure, the AT&T equipment would in no way preclude the use of this facility by other providers.

Background Information

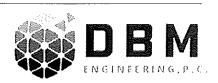
In 1985, the FCC first adopted guidelines to be used for evaluating human exposure to RF emissions. The FCC revised and updated these guidelines on August 1, 1996, as a result of a rule-making proceeding initiated in 1993. The new guidelines incorporate limits for Maximum Permissible Exposure (MPE) in terms of electric and magnetic field strength and power density for transmitters operating at frequencies between 300 kHz and 100 GHz.

The FCC's MPE limits are based on exposure limits recommended by the National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP) and, over a wide range of frequencies, the exposure limits were developed by the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, Inc., (IEEE) and adopted by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) to replace the 1982 ANSI guidelines. Limits for localized absorption are based on recommendations of both ANSI/IEEE and NCRP.

The FCC's limits, and the NCRP and ANSI/IEEE limits on which they are based, are derived from exposure criteria quantified in terms of specific absorption rate (SAR). The basis for these limits is a whole-body averaged SAR threshold level of 4 watts per kilogram (4 W/kg), as averaged over the entire mass of the body, above which expert organizations have determined that potentially hazardous exposures may occur. The MPE limits are derived by incorporating safety factors that lead, in some cases, to limits that are more conservative than the limits originally adopted by the FCC in 1985. Where more conservative limits exist, they do not arise from a fundamental change in the RF safety criteria for whole-body averaged SAR, but from a precautionary desire to protect subgroups of the general population who, potentially, may be more at risk.

The FCC exposure limits are also based on data showing that the human body absorbs RF energy at some frequencies more efficiently than at others. The most restrictive limits occur in the frequency range of 30-300 MHz where whole-body absorption of RF energy by human beings is most efficient. At other frequencies, whole-body absorption is less efficient, and consequently, the MPE limits are less restrictive.

MPE limits are defined in terms of power density (units of milliwatts per centimeter squared: mW/cm²), electric field strength (units of volts per meter: V/m) and magnetic field strength (units of amperes per meter: A/m). The far-field of a transmitting antenna



is where the electric field vector (E), the magnetic field vector (H), and the direction of propagation can be considered to be all mutually orthogonal ("plane-wave" conditions).

Occupational / controlled exposure limits apply to situations in which persons are exposed as a consequence of their employment and in which those persons who are exposed have been made fully aware of the potential for exposure and can exercise control over their exposure. Occupational/controlled exposure limits also apply where exposure is of a transient nature as a result of incidental passage through a location where exposure levels may be above general population/uncontrolled limits, as long as the exposed person has been made fully aware of the potential for exposure and can exercise control over his or her exposure by leaving the area or by some other appropriate means.

General population / uncontrolled exposure limits apply to situations in which the general public may be exposed or in which persons who are exposed as a consequence of their employment may not be made fully aware of the potential for exposure or cannot exercise control over their exposure. Therefore, members of the general public would always be considered under this category when exposure is not employment-related, for example, in the case of a telecommunications tower that exposes persons in a nearby residential area. In the case of this study, the general population exposure limits have been applied as they are the more conservative set of standards.

Additional Remarks

The radio-frequency emission levels from AT&T and other PCS and Cellular communications base stations are similar to that of other two-way communications systems like those used by police, fire and ambulance personnel. In contrast, commercial broadcast systems like television and radio often transmit at power levels ten times greater or more than the systems discussed above.

The biological effects on humans of non-ionizing radio-frequency exposure have been studied extensively now for decades. There have been thousands of reports produced by government agencies, universities, and private research groups that support the standards adopted by the FCC. To date, there have been no credible studies conducted whose results showed evidence of any adverse health effects at the above exposure limits.

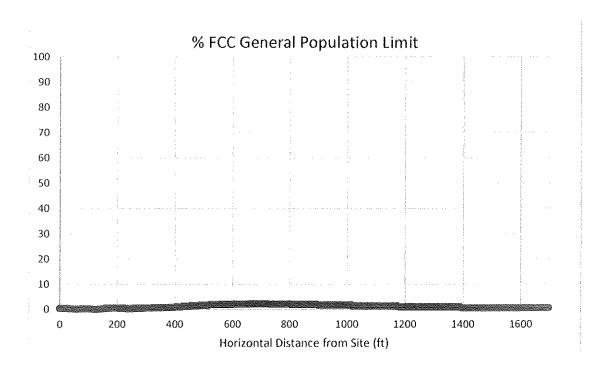


Figure-1 – calculated cumulative exposure level surrounding the proposed telecommunications facility expressed in percentage of the applicable FCC standard

I have received and executed the request that I perform an independent evaluation of the potential for harmful interference generated by the AT&T telecommunications facility at the location referenced above. The intention of this study is to determine if the manifestation of harmful interference is a viable concern through the close examination of the radio frequency (hereafter RF) parameters of the installation. As a registered professional engineer, I am bound by a code of ethics to hold paramount the safety, health, and welfare of the public. All statements and calculations offered herein are made in an objective and truthful manner pursuant to that code.

Summary of Findings

After close examination of the details of this proposal, it is my professional opinion that no potential exists for the manifestation of harmful interference as a result of the proposed AT&T telecommunications facility. My findings indicate that AT&T will be operating in full compliance with all applicable standards as outlined in their Federal Communications Commission licensure.

Licensure Discussion

AT&T is bound by its Federal Communications Commission (hereafter FCC) licensure to transmit only the specific frequencies and power levels for which they are licensed. . In Sussex County, Delaware these licenses include the 'A' Cellular Band, the 'A', 'B3', and 'D' PCS bands, the 'H' and 'I' AWS bands, the 'B', 'C' and 'D' 700 MHz bands, the 'A' 'B', 'C', and 'D' WCS band, portions of the 3700 MHz 'C' band and portions of the 3400 MHz 'DoD' band. Other communication facilities and services such as emergency responders, television broadcasting, AM/FM broadcasting, mobile to mobile radios, and home electronics operate at different frequencies, once again, allocated by the FCC. For this reason, the manifestation of direct, harmful interference is precluded by virtue of AT&T being the only entity licensed to utilize these specifically defined portions of the RF spectrum. As such, there will be no direct, significant radio frequency emissions that fall into any band other than that for which AT&T is licensed. However, when non-linear elements (such as amplifiers) are introduced in the RF path the possibility exists for indirect interference caused by harmonic and inter-modulated frequency emissions that may fall outside the licensed spectrum. Due to the fact that the harmonic and intermodulated output of Cellular and PCS transmitters is extremely low (as required by FCC type approval), this only becomes a concern when there are multiple telecommunication installations in close proximity to one another. This problem is easily avoided by insuring adequate vertical separation (roughly 10') when service providers co-locate on a structure. In this specific installation, the point is moot as AT&T is the only service provider currently proposing use of the tower. In the unlikely event that future radio frequency interference is reported, it is AT&T policy (and incumbent upon them as an FCC licensee) to identify and mitigate any reported interference issues as quickly as possible.



Facility Discussion

According to the configuration information furnished by its representatives, AT&T plans to add nine (9) new panel-style antennas in three (3) arrays of three (3) antennas per array. The average antenna centerline height will be 140' above grade with sector azimuths of 80°, 200°, and 320° in the horizontal plane with respect to true north. Transmitting through these antennas will be up to twelve (12) LTE transmit paths in the 700 MHz band (per sector) at a cumulative maximum of 480 watts, up to eight (8) 5GNR transmit paths in the 1900 MHz band (per sector) at a cumulative maximum of 240 watts, up to four (4) 5GNR transmit paths in the 2100 MHz band (per sector) at a cumulative maximum of 240 watts, up to four (4) 5GNR transmit paths in the 850 MHz band (per sector) at a cumulative maximum of 240 watts, up to sixty-four (64) 5GNR transmit paths in the 3700 MHz C-Band band (per sector) at a cumulative maximum of 320 watts radio power, and up to sixty-four (64) 5GNR transmit paths in the 3500 MHz DoD-Band band (per sector) at a cumulative maximum of 320 watts radio power.

Additional Remarks

The radio frequency emission levels from AT&T and other PCS and Cellular communications base stations are similar to that of other two-way communications systems such as those used by police, fire and ambulance personnel. In contrast, commercial broadcast systems such as television and radio often transmit at power levels ten times greater or more than the systems discussed above. Due to the relatively low power output, the potential for harmful interference is greatly reduced as the harmonic and intermodulated emissions are typically in the noise floor of most receivers when only a few hundred feet away.

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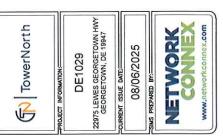

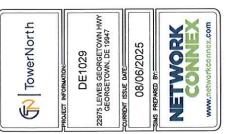

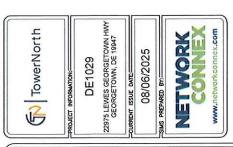

OPTION AND LEASE AGREEMENT

THIS OPTION AND LEASE AGREEMENT ("Agreement"), dated as of the latter of the signature dates below (the "Effective Date"), is entered into by B. DARROW MCLAUCHLIN and ERIC E. MCLAUCHLIN, TRUSTEES OF THE ERNEST E. MEGEE IRREVOCABLE TRUST DATED DECEMBER 23, 1993 ("Landlord") having a mailing address of 4690 Millennium Drive, Suite 200, Belcamp, Maryland 21017 and TOWERNORTH DEVELOPMENT, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company ("Tenant"), having a mailing address of 2400 Ansys Drive, Suite 102, Canonsburg, Pennsylvania 15317.

BACKGROUND

Landlord is the fee owner of that land and property, together with all rights and privileges arising in connection therewith, located in the State of Delaware, County of Sussex and commonly referred to as parcel number 135-16.00-12.00 and further described on Exhibit 1 (collectively, the "Property"). Landlord desires to lease to Tenant, and Tenant desires to lease from Landlord, a portion of the Property measuring approximately four thousand two hundred twenty five (4,225) square feet (with dimensions of 65 feet by 65 feet) (the "Premises"), together with non-exclusive easements over, across, under and through the Property for ingress, egress, access, regress and parking and the installation and maintenance of cables, utilities and lines (collectively, the "Easements") each being approximately located as shown on Exhibit 2 (the Premises and the Basements are collectively referred to herein as the "Leased Premises"), for the purpose of constructing, operating, installing, maintaining, removing, replacing and modifying a communications facility for Tenant's use and the use thereof by Tenant's subtenants, licensees and customers

The parties agree as follows:

1. OPTION TO LEASE.

(a) In consideration of the payment of "Option Fee") by Tenant to Landlord, Landlord hereby grants to Tenant an exclusive and irrevocable option (the "Option") to lease the Premises and use the Easements on the terms and conditions set forth below. The Option shall commence upon the Effective Date and shall continue for an initial term of three (3) years (the "Initial Option Term"). Tenant shall have the right to extend the Option for one (1) additional period of two (2) years (the "Extended Option Term") upon written notification to Landlord and the payment of "Extended Option Fee") within thirty (30) days following the commencement of the Extended Option Term. The Initial Option Term and any Extended Option Term are collectively referred to as the "Option Term."

(b) During the Option Term, and during the term of this Agreement, Tenant and its agents, engineers, surveyors and other representatives will have the right to enter upon the Property to inspect, examine, conduct soil borings, drainage testing, material sampling, radio frequency testing and other geological or engineering tests or studies of the Property (collectively, the "Tests"), to apply for and obtain licenses, permits, approvals, or other relief required of or deemed necessary or appropriate at Tenant's sole discretion for its use of the Premises and include, without limitation, applications for zoning variances, zoning ordinance, amendments, special use permits, and construction permits (collectively, the "Government Approvals"), initiate the ordering and/or scheduling of necessary utilities, and otherwise to do those things on or off the Property that, in the opinion of Tenant, are necessary in Tenant's sole discretion to determine the physical condition of the Property, the environmental history of the Property, Landlord's title to the Property and the feasibility or suitability of the Property for Tenant's Permitted Use, all at Tenant's expense. Tenant will not be liable to Landlord or any third party on account of any pre-existing defect or condition on or with respect to the Property, whether or not such defect or condition is disclosed by Tenant's

inspection. Tenant will restore the Property to its condition as it existed at the commencement of the Option Term, reasonable wear and tear and loss by casualty or other causes beyond Tenant's control excepted.

- (c) This Option shall be binding upon the heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns of both parties hereto. This Option may be assigned or transferred at any time by Tenant. Landlord shall not sell, lease, convey, subdivide or separate all or any portion of the Property in a manner that may, in Tenant's reasonable discretion, interfere with or prohibit the use of the Leased Premises by Tenant and without not less than thirty (30) days' notice to Tenant.
- (e) If Tenant does not exercise the Option during the Option Term, this Agreement shall automatically terminate as of the last day of the Option Term, and neither party shall have any further obligation to the other. Tenant may exercise the Option at any time during the Option Term by providing written notice to Landlord in the manner set forth in this Agreement, which notice shall be effective on the date set forth in the notice ("Commencement Date").
- 2. <u>LEASE AND EASEMENT</u>. Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, upon Tenant's exercise of the Option, Landlord hereby leases to Tenant and Tenant hereby leases from Landlord, the Premises and grants to Tenant, its successors, assigns, for its use and the use by Tenant's subtenants, licensees, invitees, and customers, and each of their respective employees, contractors and agents, the use of the Easements for ingress, egress, regress, access and parking (including a 20' x 20' turnaround area) seven (7) days a week, twenty-four (24) hours a day, on foot or motor vehicle, including trucks, cranes and heavy equipment and the installation, construction, modification, operation and maintenance of above and below ground electrical, telephone, fiberoptic and other lines, cables, conduit, pipes, poles, equipment boxes, pull boxes and ancillary improvements.
- PERMITTED USE. Tenant, together with its subtenants, licensees, invitees and customers, may use the Premises for, among other things, the construction, modification, operation, maintenance, repair, removal and replacement of a communications tower facility (as well as, to the extent applicable, that of its subtenants, licensees and/or customers) radio transmitting and receiving antennae, dishes, generators, communications equipment, and related cables, wires, conduits, generators, air conditioning equipment and other appurtenances, equipment shelters or cabinets and fencing and any other items necessary, in Tenant's discretion, to the successful and secure use of the Premises by Tenant (collectively, the "Communication Facility"), as well as the right to test, survey and review title on the Property (collectively, the "Permitted Use"). Tenant shall be entitled to sublease and/or sublicense all or any part of the Premises or any communications tower(s) thereon at any time without Landlord consent and without additional payment to Landlord. Landlord and Tenant agree that any portion of the Communication Facility that may be conceptually described on Exhibit 2 will not be deemed to limit Tenant's Permitted Use. If Exhibit 2 includes drawings of the initial installation of the Communication Facility, Landlord's execution of this Agreement will signify Landlord's approval of Exhibit 2. In addition, Landlord grants Tenant, its subtenants, licensees and sublicensees, the right to use such portions of Landlord's contiguous, adjoining Property as may reasonably be required during the construction, installation, repair, replacement or modification of the Communication Facility. Tenant has the right to make other improvements, alterations, upgrades, installations or additions appropriate for Tenant's Permitted Use to the Premises and within the Property. Tenant has the right'to modify, supplement, replace, upgrade, expand the equipment, increase the number of antennas or relocate the Communication Facility within the Premises at any time during the term of this Agreement. In the event Tenant desires to modify or upgrade the Communication Facility in a manner that requires an additional portion of the Property (the "Additional Premises") for such modification or upgrade, Landlord agrees to lease to Tenant the Additional Premises, upon the same terms and conditions set forth herein, except that the Rent shall increase by the amount equivalent to the thencurrent per square foot rental rate charged by Landlord to Tenant times the square footage of the Additional Premises. Landlord agrees to take such actions and enter into and deliver to Tenant such documents as Tenant reasonably requests in order to effect and memorialize the lease of the Additional Premises to Tenant.

4. TERM.

- (a) The initial term of this Agreement (the "Initial Term") shall be five (5) years, beginning on the Commencement Date. Tenant shall have the option to extend this Agreement for nine (9) additional terms of five (5) years each (each an "Extension Term"). This Agreement shall automatically renew for each successive Extension Term unless Tenant provides written notice to Landlord of its election not to renew this Agreement not less than sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the Initial Term or any applicable Extension Term. The Initial Term and the Extension Terms shall collectively be referred to as the "Term".
- (b) Unless (i) Landlord or Tenant notifies the other in writing of its intention to terminate this Agreement at least sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the final Extension Term, or (ii) the Agreement is terminated as otherwise permitted by this Agreement prior to the end of the final Extension Term, then upon the final Extension Term, this Agreement shall continue in force upon the same covenants, terms and conditions for a further term of one (1) year, and for annual terms thereafter (each an "Annual Term") until terminated by either party by giving to the other written notice of its intention to so terminate at least six (6) months prior to the end of any such Annual Term. Monthly rental during such Annual Terms shall be equal to the Rent paid for the last month of the final Extension Term. If Tenant remains in possession of the Premises after the termination of this Agreement, Tenant will be deemed to be occupying the Premises on a month-to-month basis (the "Holdover Term"), subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- (c) The Initial Term, any Extension Terms, any Annual Terms and any Holdover Term are collectively referred to as the Term (the "Term").

5. <u>RENT</u>.

(a) Commencing on the first day of the month following the date that Tenant commences construction of the Communication Facility (the "Rent Commencement Date"), Tenant will pay Landlord on or before the fifth (5th) day of each calendar month in advance,

(the "Rent"). In any partial month occurring after the Rent Commencement Date, Rent will be prorated. The initial Rent payment will be forwarded by Tenant to Landlord within forty-five (45) days after the Rent Commencement Date.

(b) The Rent shall increase, on the first day of each Extension Term, by an amount equal to over the Rent payable for the Initial Term or immediately preceding Extension Term, as the case may be.

6. APPROVALS.

- (a) Landlord agrees that Tenant's ability to use the Premises is contingent upon the suitability of the Premises, Leased Premises and Property for Tenant's Permitted Use and Tenant's ability to obtain and maintain Government Approvals. Landlord authorizes Tenant to prepare, execute and file all required applications to obtain Government Approvals for Tenant's Permitted Use under this Agreement and agrees to reasonably assist Tenant with such applications and with obtaining and maintaining the Government Approvals.
- (b) Tenant has the right to obtain a title report or commitment for a leasehold title policy from a title insurance company of its choice and to have the Property surveyed by a surveyor of its choice.
- (c) Tenant may also perform and obtain, at Tenant's sole cost and expense, soil borings, percolation tests, engineering procedures, environmental investigation or other tests or reports on, over, and under the Property, necessary to determine if Tenant's use of the Premises will be compatible with Tenant's engineering specifications, system, design, operations or Government Approvals.
- 7. <u>TERMINATION.</u> This Agreement may be terminated, without penalty or further liability, as follows:
- (a) by either party on thirty (30) days prior written notice, if the other party remains in default under Section 16 of this Agreement after the applicable cure periods;

- (b) by Tenant upon written notice to Landlord, if Tenant is unable to obtain, or maintain, any required approval(s) or the issuance of a license or permit by any agency, board, court or other governmental authority necessary for the construction or operation of the Communication Facility as now or hereafter intended by Tenant; or if Tenant determines, in its sole discretion that the cost of or delay in obtaining or retaining the same is commercially unreasonable;
- (c) by Tenant, upon written notice to Landlord, if Tenant determines, in its sole discretion, due to the title report results or survey results, that the condition of the Premises is unsatisfactory for its intended uses;
- (d) by Tenant upon written notice to Landlord for any reason or no reason, at any time prior to commencement of construction of the Communications Facility by Tenant; or
- (e) by Tenant upon sixty (60) days' prior written notice to Landlord for any reason or no reason, so long as Tenant pays Landlord a termination fee equal to three (3) months' Rent, at the then-current rate, provided, however, that no such termination fee will be payable on account of the termination of this Agreement by Tenant under any termination provision contained in any other Section of this Agreement, including the following: 6 Approvals, 7(a) Termination, 7(b) Termination, 7(c) Termination, 7(d) Termination, 12(d) Environmental, 19 Condemnation or 20 Casualty.
- 8. <u>INSURANCE</u>. Tenant shall acquire and maintain during the Term of this Agreement: (i) workers' compensation insurance as required by law; and (ii) commercial general liability (CGL) insurance with respect to its activities on the Property, such insurance to afford protection of up to One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) general aggregate. Tenant's CGL insurance shall contain list Landlord as an additional insured, as its interest may appear. Such additional insured coverage (i) shall be limited to bodily injury, property damage or personal and advertising injury caused, in whole or in part, by Tenant, its employees, agents or independent contractors; (ii) shall not extend to claims for punitive or exemplary damages arising out of the acts or omissions of Landlord, its employees, agents or independent contractors or where such coverage is prohibited by law or to claims arising out of the gross negligence of Landlord, its employees, agents or independent contractors; and (iii) shall not exceed Tenant's indemnification obligation under this Agreement, if any.

9. INTERFERENCE.

- (a) Prior to or concurrent with the execution of this Agreement, Landlord has provided or will provide Tenant with a list of radio frequency user(s) and frequencies used on the Property as of the Effective Date. Tenant warrants that its use of the Premises will not interfere with those existing radio frequency uses on the Property, as long as those existing radio frequency user(s) operate and continue to operate within their respective frequencies and in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations.
- (b) Landlord shall not use, nor shall Landlord permit its tenants, licensees, employees, invitees or agents to use any portion of the Property in any way that interferes with Tenant's Permitted Use of the Leased Premises. Such interference will be deemed a material breach of this Agreement by Landlord and Landlord shall have the responsibility to terminate said interference immediately upon written notice from Tenant. Anything to the contrary in this Agreement notwithstanding, if any such interference does not cease or is not rectified as soon as possible, but in no event longer than 24 hours after Tenant's written notice to Landlord, Landlord acknowledges that continuing interference will cause irreparable injury to Tenant, as well as Tenant's subtenants and licensees, and Tenant shall have the right, in addition to any other rights that it may have at law or in equity, to bring action to enjoin such interference or to terminate this Agreement immediately upon notice to Landlord. Landlord represents and warrants that it has not sold, leased, licensed or otherwise granted rights in the Property that in any way interfere or could reasonably be likely to interfere with Tenant's rights to the Leased Premises as set forth in this Agreement.

10. INDEMNIFICATION.

(a) Tenant agrees to indemnify, defend and hold Landlord harmless from and against any and all injury, loss, damage or liability (or any claims in respect of the foregoing), costs or expenses (including

reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs) arising directly from the installation, use, maintenance, repair or removal of the Communication Facility or Tenant's breach of any provision of this Agreement, except to the extent attributable to the negligent or intentional act or omission of Landlord, its employees, agents or independent contractors.

- (b) Landlord agrees to indemnify, defend and hold Tenant harmless from and against any and all injury, loss, damage or liability (or any claims in respect of the foregoing), costs or expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs) arising directly from the actions or failure to act of Landlord, its employees or agents, or Landlord's breach of any provision of this Agreement, except to the extent attributable to the negligent or intentional act or omission of Tenant, its employees, agents or independent contractors.
- (c) The indemnified party: (i) shall promptly provide the indemnifying party with written notice of any claim, demand, lawsuit, or the like for which it seeks indemnification pursuant to this Section and provide the indemnifying party with copies of any demands, notices, summonses, or legal papers received in connection with such claim, demand, lawsuit, or the like; (ii) shall not settle any such claim, demand, lawsuit, or the like without the prior written consent of the indemnifying party; and (iii) shall fully cooperate with the indemnifying party in the defense of the claim, demand, lawsuit, or the like. A delay in notice shall not relieve the indemnifying party of its indemnity obligation, except (1) to the extent the indemnifying party can show it was prejudiced by the delay; and (2) the indemnifying party shall not be liable for any settlement or litigation expenses incurred before the time when notice is given.

11. WARRANTIES AND COVENANTS.

- (a) Tenant and Landlord each acknowledge and represent that it is duly organized, validly existing and in good standing and has the right, power and authority to enter into this Agreement and bind itself hereto through the party set forth as signatory for the party below.
- (b) Landlord represents, warrants and agrees that: (i) Landlord solely owns the Property as a legal lot in fee simple; (ii) the Property is not and will not be encumbered by any liens, restrictions, mortgages, covenants, conditions, easements, leases, or any other agreements of record or not of record, which would adversely affect Tenant's Permitted Use and enjoyment of the Leased Premises under this Agreement; (iii) as long as Tenant is not in default of this Agreement beyond any applicable cure period, Landlord grants to Tenant sole, actual, quiet and peaceful use, enjoyment and possession of the Premises and the non-exclusive use of the Easements without hindrance or ejection by any persons lawfully claiming under Landlord; (iv) Landlord's execution and performance of this Agreement will not violate any laws, ordinances, covenants or the provisions of any mortgage, lease or other agreement binding on Landlord; and (v) if the Property is or becomes encumbered by a deed to secure a debt, mortgage or other security interest, Landlord will provide promptly to Tenant a mutually agreeable subordination, non-disturbance and attornment agreement executed by Landlord and the holder of such security interest.
- (c) Landlord agrees, from time to time, upon not less than ten (10) days prior written notice from Tenant, to execute and deliver to Tenant a written estoppel certificate certifying that as of the date of the certification: (i) this Agreement is a valid enforceable agreement, presently in full force and effect; (ii) whether Landlord has any knowledge of any default or breach by Tenant under any of the terms, conditions, or covenants of this Agreement; (iii) the Term (its commencement and termination dates) and the term of any option or renewal periods granted to the Tenant to extend the Term; (iv) the amount of the then-current Rent payable under the Agreement; (v) attached to the certification is a true and correct copy of the Agreement and all amendments thereto, (vi) and such other facts as Tenant or its prospective mortgagee or purchaser may request.
- (d) Landlord, as Trustee, represents and warrants to Tenant that: (a) the trust under which the Trustee acts (the "Trust") is validly existing and in full force and effect under applicable law; (b) the Trustee has full authority under the Trust and applicable law to enter into this Agreement and to perform all obligations hereunder; (c) the execution, delivery, and performance of this Lease by the Trustee has been duly authorized in accordance with the terms of the trust; and (d) any trust certificate or other written

confirmation of authority delivered to Tenant in connection with this Agreement may be conclusively relied upon by Tenant as true, correct, and complete, without duty of further inquiry.

12. ENVIRONMENTAL.

- (a) Landlord represents and warrants that, except as may be identified on Schedule A attached to this Agreement, (i) the Property, as of the date of this Agreement, is free of hazardous substances, including asbestos-containing materials and lead paint, and (ii) the Property has never been subject to any contamination or hazardous conditions resulting in any environmental investigation, inquiry or remediation. Landlord and Tenant agree that each will be responsible for compliance with any and all applicable governmental laws, rules, statutes, regulations, codes, ordinances, or principles of common law regulating or imposing standards of liability or standards of conduct with regard to protection of the environment or worker health and safety, as may now or at any time hereafter be in effect, to the extent such apply to that party's activity conducted in or on the Property
- (b) Landlord and Tenant agree to hold harmless and indemnify the other from, and to assume all duties, responsibilities and liabilities at the sole cost and expense of the indemnifying party for, payment of penalties, sanctions, forfeitures, losses, costs or damages, and for responding to any action, notice, claim, order, summons, citation, directive, litigation, investigation or proceeding ("Claims"), to the extent arising from that party's breach of its obligations or representations under Section 12(a). Landlord agrees to hold harmless and indemnify Tenant from, and to assume all duties, responsibilities and liabilities at the sole cost and expense of Landlord for, payment of penalties, sanctions, forfeitures, losses, costs or damages, and for responding to any Claims, to the extent arising from subsurface or other contamination of the Property with hazardous substances prior to the Effective Date of this Agreement or from such contamination caused by the acts or omissions of Landlord during the Term. Tenant agrees to hold harmless and indemnify Landlord from, and to assume all duties, responsibilities and liabilities at the sole cost and expense of Tenant for, payment of penalties, sanctions, forfeitures, losses, costs or damages, and for responding to any Claims, to the extent arising from hazardous substances brought onto the Property by Tenant.
- (c) The indemnifications of this Section 12 specifically include reasonable costs, expenses and fees incurred in connection with any investigation of Property conditions or any clean-up, remediation, removal or restoration work required by any governmental authority. The provisions of this Section 12 will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.
- (d) In the event Tenant becomes aware of any hazardous substances on the Property, or any environmental, health or safety condition or matter relating to the Property, that, in Tenant's sole determination, renders the condition of the Premises or Property unsuitable for Tenant's use, or if Tenant believes that the leasing or continued leasing of the Premises would expose Tenant to undue risks of liability to a government agency or other third party, Tenant will have the right, in addition to any other rights it may have at law or in equity, to terminate this Agreement upon written notice to Landlord.
- 13. ACCESS. At all times throughout the Term of this Agreement, and at no additional charge to Tenant, Tenant, its customers, sublessees, and invitees, together with each of their respective employees, agents, and subcontractors, shall have twenty-four (24) hour per day, seven (7) day per week pedestrian and vehicular access ("Access") to and over the Property, from an open and improved public road to the Premises, and the unrestricted right to install, maintain, operate, repair or replace any utilities serving the Premises. As may be described more fully in Exhibit 2, Landlord grants to Tenant an easement for such Access and Landlord agrees to provide to Tenant such codes, keys and other instruments necessary for such Access at no additional cost to Tenant. Upon Tenant's request, Landlord will execute a separate recordable easement evidencing this right. Landlord acknowledges that in the event Tenant cannot obtain Access to the Premises, Tenant shall incur significant damage. If Landlord fails to provide the Access granted by this Section 12, such failure shall be a default under this Agreement. In connection with such default, in addition to any other rights or remedies available to Tenant under this Agreement or at law or equity, Landlord shall pay Tenant, as liquidated damages and not as a penalty, per day in consideration of Tenant's damages until Landlord cures such default. Landlord and Tenant agree that Tenant's damages in the event

of a denial of Access are difficult, if not impossible, to ascertain, and the liquidated damages set forth above are a reasonable approximation of such damages.

14. REMOVAL/RESTORATION. All portions of the Communication Facility brought onto the Property by Tenant will be and remain Tenant's personal property and, at Tenant's option, may be removed by Tenant at any time during or after the Term. Landlord covenants and agrees that no part of the Communication Facility constructed, erected or placed on the Premises by Tenant will become, or be considered as being affixed to or a part of, the Property, it being the specific intention of Landlord that all improvements of every kind and nature constructed, erected or placed by Tenant on the Premises will be and remain the property of Tenant and may be removed by Tenant at any time during or after the Term. Tenant shall be required to remove the above ground portions of the Communication Facility, and those below ground portions to a depth of three (3) feet below grade, within one hundred twenty (120) days following the end of the Term or upon other termination hereunder. Tenant will repair any damage to the Property resulting from Tenant's removal activities. To the extent that Tenant fails to comply with the provisions of this Section Tenant shall pay to Landlord the actual reasonable costs paid to licensed third parties for the removal of the Communications Facility in the manner required of Tenant. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Tenant will not be responsible for the replacement of any trees, shrubs or other vegetation.

15. MAINTENANCE/UTILITIES.

- (a) Tenant will keep and maintain the Premises in good condition, reasonable wear and tear and damage from the elements excepted. Landlord will maintain and repair the Property and access thereto and all areas of the Leased Premises where Tenant does not have exclusive control, in good and tenantable condition, subject to reasonable wear and tear and damage from the elements.
- Tenant will be responsible for paying on a monthly or quarterly basis all utilities charges for electricity, telephone service or any other utility used or consumed by Tenant on the Premises. In the event Tenant cannot secure its own metered electrical supply, Tenant will have the right, at its own cost and expense, to submeter from Landlord. When submetering is required under this Agreement, Landlord will read the meter and provide Tenant with an invoice and usage data on a monthly basis. Landlord agrees that it will not include a markup on the utility charges. Landlord further agrees to provide the usage data and invoice on forms provided by Tenant and to send such forms to such address and/or agent designated by Tenant. Tenant will remit payment within forty-five (45) days of receipt of the usage data and required forms. Landlord shall submit any and all bills, invoices or requests for payment to Tenant within twelve (12) months of the date such charges were incurred by Landlord. If Tenant submeters electricity from Landlord, Landlord agrees to give Tenant at least twenty-four (24) hours advance notice of any planned interruptions of said electricity. Landlord acknowledges that Tenant provides a communication service which requires electrical power to operate and must operate twenty-four (24) hours per day, seven (7) days per week. If the interruption is for an extended period of time, in Tenant's reasonable determination, Landlord agrees to allow Tenant the right to bring in a temporary source of power for the duration of the interruption. Landlord will not be responsible for interference with, interruption of or failure, beyond the reasonable control of Landlord, of such services to be furnished or supplied by Landlord.
- (c) Landlord hereby grants to Tenant, its subtenants, licensees, invitees and customers, together with any electric, telephone or fiberoptic company providing electric, telephone or fiberoptic service to the Premises a non-exclusive easement over the Property to and from open and improved public road to the Premises for the purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining such lines, wires, circuits, and conduits, associated equipment cabinets and such appurtenances thereto, as Tenant or such companies may from time to time require. Upon Tenant's or the service company's request, Landlord will execute a separate recordable easement evidencing this grant, at no cost to Tenant or the service company.

16. DEFAULT AND RIGHT TO CURE.

(a) The following will be deemed a default by Tenant and a breach of this Agreement: (i) non-payment of Rent if such Rent remains unpaid for more than thirty (30) days after written notice from

Landlord of such failure to pay; or (ii) Tenant's failure to perform any other term or condition under this Agreement within forty-five (45) days after written notice from Landlord specifying the failure. No such failure, however, will be deemed to exist if Tenant has commenced to cure such default within such period and provided that such efforts are prosecuted to completion with reasonable diligence. Delay in curing a default will be excused if due to causes beyond the reasonable control of Tenant. If Tenant remains in default beyond any applicable cure period, Landlord will have the right to exercise any and all rights and remedies available to it under law and equity. In the event Landlord elects to terminate this Agreement due to a default by Tenant, it shall continue to honor all leasehold and or license commitments made by Tenant through the expiration of the Term of any such commitment, it being intended hereby that each such commitment shall survive the early termination of this Agreement.

- (b) The following will be deemed a default by Landlord and a breach of this Agreement: (i) Landlord's failure to provide Access to the Premises as required by Section 12 of this Agreement within twenty-four (24) hours after written notice of such failure; (ii) Landlord's failure to cure an interference problem as required by Section 9 of this Agreement within twenty-four (24) hours after written notice of such failure; or (iii) Landlord's failure to perform any term, condition or breach of any warranty or covenant under this Agreement within forty-five (45) days after written notice from Tenant specifying the failure. No such failure, however, will be deemed to exist if Landlord has commenced to cure the default within such period and provided such efforts are prosecuted to completion with reasonable diligence. Delay in curing a default will be excused if due to causes beyond the reasonable control of Landlord. If Landlord remains in default beyond any applicable cure period, Tenant will have: (i) the right to cure Landlord's default and to deduct the costs of such cure from any monies due to Landlord from Tenant, and (ii) any and all other rights available to it under law and equity.
- 17. ASSIGNMENT/SUBLEASE. Tenant may assign or transfer its interest in this Agreement and the Leased Premises without the consent of Landlord, provided that such assignee agrees in writing to assume the obligations of Tenant hereunder. Upon such assignment, Tenant shall be released of all obligations under this Agreement. Tenant may sublease all or any portion of the Leased Premises to any other party or multiple parties, without the consent of Landlord, provided that no such sublease shall relieve Tenant of its obligations under this Agreement. Additionally, Tenant may mortgage or grant a security interest in this Agreement and the Communications Facility, and may assign this Agreement and the Communication Facilities to any such mortgagees or holders of security interests including their successors and assigns (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Secured Parties"). If requested by Tenant, Landlord shall execute such consent to such financing as may reasonably be required by Secured Parties. In addition, if requested by Tenant, Landlord agrees to notify Tenant and Tenant's Secured Parties simultaneously of any default by Tenant and to give Secured Parties the same right to cure any default as Tenant. If a termination, disaffirmance or rejection of the Agreement by Tenant pursuant to any laws (including any bankruptcy or insolvency laws) occurs, or if Landlord shall terminate this Agreement for any reason, Landlord will give to Secured Parties prompt notice thereof and Secured Parties shall have the right to enter upon the Premises during a thirty (30) day period commencing upon Secured Parties' receipt of such notice for the purpose of removing any Communications Facilities. Landlord acknowledges that Secured Parties are third-party beneficiaries of this Agreement.
- 18. <u>NOTICES</u>. All notices, requests and demands hereunder will be given by first class certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, or by a nationally recognized overnight courier, postage prepaid, to be effective when properly sent and received, refused or returned undelivered. Formal notices will be addressed to the parties as follows:

Either party hereto may change the place for the giving of notice to it by thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the other as provided herein.

- 19. <u>CONDEMNATION.</u> In the event Landlord receives notification of any condemnation proceedings affecting the Property, Landlord will provide notice of the proceeding to Tenant within forty-eight (48) hours. If a condemning authority takes all of the Property, or a portion sufficient, in Tenant's sole determination, to render the Premises unsuitable for Tenant, this Agreement will terminate as of the date the title vests in the condemning authority. The parties will each be entitled to pursue their own separate awards in the condemnation proceeds, which for Tenant will include, where applicable, the value of its Communication Facility, moving expenses, prepaid Rent, and business dislocation expenses. Tenant will be entitled to reimbursement for any prepaid Rent on a prorated basis.
- CASUALTY. Landlord will provide notice to Tenant of any casualty or other harm affecting the 20. Property within forty-eight (48) hours of the casualty or other harm. If any part of the Communication Facility or Property is damaged by casualty or other harm as to render the Premises unsuitable, in Tenant's sole determination, then Tenant may terminate this Agreement by providing written notice to Landlord, which termination will be effective as of the date of such casualty or other harm. Upon such termination, Tenant will be entitled to collect all insurance proceeds payable to Tenant on account thereof and to be reimbursed for any prepaid Rent on a prorated basis. Landlord agrees to permit Tenant to place temporary transmission and reception facilities on the Property, but only until such time as Tenant is able to activate a replacement transmission facility at another location; notwithstanding the termination of this Agreement, such temporary facilities will be governed by all of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, including Rent. If Landlord or Tenant undertakes to rebuild or restore the Premises and/or the Communication Facility, as applicable, Landlord agrees to permit Tenant to place temporary transmission and reception facilities on the Property at no additional Rent until the reconstruction of the Premises and/or the Communication Facility is completed. If Landlord determines not to rebuild or restore the Property, Landlord will notify Tenant of such determination within thirty (30) days after the casualty or other harm. If Landlord does not so notify Tenant and Tenant decides not to terminate under this Section, then Landlord will promptly rebuild or restore any portion of the Property interfering with or required for Tenant's Permitted Use of the Premises to substantially the same condition as existed before the casualty or other harm. Landlord agrees that the Rent shall be abated until the Property and/or the Premises are rebuilt or restored, unless Tenant places temporary transmission and reception facilities on the Property.

21. WAIVER OF LANDLORD'S LIENS. Landlord waives any and all lien rights it may have, statutory or otherwise, concerning the Communication Facility or any portion thereof. The Communication Facility shall be deemed personal property for purposes of this Agreement, regardless of whether any portion is deemed real or personal property under applicable law; Landlord consents to Tenant's right to remove all or any portion of the Communication Facility from time to time in Tenant's sole discretion and without Landlord's consent.

22. TAXES.

- (a) Tenant shall pay all personal property taxes separately levied or assessed against Tenant's Facilities on the Leased Premises. Landlord shall pay when due all real property taxes and all other fees and assessments attributable to the Property and the Leased Premises, provided that Tenant shall reimburse Landlord for the increase in any such real property taxes that is directly attributable to the Tenant Facilities, and Landlord agrees to provide such documentation to Tenant within thirty (30) days following the receipt of such assessment by Landlord. If Landlord fails to pay when due any taxes affecting the Property or the Leased Premises, Tenant shall have the right, but not the obligation, to pay such taxes and (i) deduct the full amount of the taxes paid by Tenant on Landlord's behalf from future installments of Rent, or (ii) collect such taxes by any lawful means. Nothing herein shall require Tenant to pay any inheritance, franchise, income, payroll, excise, privilege, rent, capital stock, stamp, documentary, estate or profit tax, or any tax of similar nature, that is or may be imposed upon Landlord.
- (b) For any tax amount for which Tenant is responsible under this Agreement, Tenant shall have the right to contest, in good faith, the validity or the amount thereof using such administrative, appellate or other proceedings as may be appropriate in the jurisdiction, and may defer payment of such obligations, pay same under protest, or take such other steps as Tenant may deem appropriate. This right shall include the ability to institute any legal, regulatory or informal action in the name of Landlord, Tenant, or both, with respect to the valuation of the Premises. Landlord shall cooperate with respect to the commencement and prosecution of any such proceedings and will execute any documents required therefor. The expense of any such proceedings shall be borne by Tenant and any refunds or rebates secured as a result of Tenant's action shall belong to Tenant, to the extent the amounts were originally paid by Tenant. In the event Tenant notifies Landlord by the due date for assessment of Tenant's intent to contest the assessment, Landlord shall not pay the assessment pending conclusion of the contest, unless required by applicable law.
- (c) Landlord shall not split or cause the tax parcel on which the Premises are located to be split, bifurcated, separated or divided without the prior written consent of Tenant.

23. SALE OF PROPERTY.

- (a) Landlord shall promptly notify Tenant in writing of any sale, conveyance, rezoning, subdivision or other transfer of the Property and such rezoning, sale, subdivision or transfer shall be subject to this Agreement and Tenant's rights hereunder. In the event of a change in ownership of the Property, Landlord shall provide to Tenant the documents set forth below within ten (10) days of such any such transfer. Until Tenant receives all such documents, Tenant shall not be responsible for any failure to make payments under this Agreement and reserves the right to hold payments due under this Agreement.
 - i. Old deed to Property
 - ii. New deed to Property
 - iii. Bill of Sale or Transfer
 - iv. Copy of current Tax Bill
 - v. New IRS Form W-9
 - vi. Completed and Signed TND Payment Direction Form
 - vii. Full contact information for new Landlord including phone number(s)
- (b) Landlord agrees that, during the Term, Tenant will have the exclusive right to lease the Property or any portion thereof from the Landlord for communications uses or the use and operation of

antenna, transmitter or telecommunications facilities providing transmission and/or receiving facilities. Landlord shall not, at any time during the Term of this Agreement, use or suffer or permit another person to use any portion of the Property or any adjacent parcel of land now or hereafter owned, leased or managed by Landlord for any of the Permitted Use or uses similar thereto, including the construction, development, use or operation of communications tower facilities, data transmission facilities, or other systems for the transmission, reception or relay of communications signals, including small cells, distributed antenna systems, data centers, C-RAN or fiber.

24. RIGHT OF FIRST REFUSAL / RENTAL STREAM OFFER.

- (a) From and after the Effective Date, Landlord hereby grants Tenant a right of first refusal in connection with all requests, proposals or offers from any Offeror (as defined below) other than the Tenant to acquire, lease or obtain an easement (or other right of way) under all or any portion of the Leased Premises. Landlord shall provide Tenant written notice (the "ROFR Notice") of its receipt of such a request, proposal or offer which Landlord desires to accept. Such ROFR Notice shall describe all material terms of such request, proposal or offer and include a copy of such request, proposal or offer. Tenant shall have thirty (30) days to evaluate such request, proposal or offer and notify Landlord in writing (the "Acceptance Notice") if it intends to exercise its right to consummate such acquisition, lease or obtaining of easement (or other right of way) pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth in such request, proposal or offer. If Tenant fails to provide Landlord with an Acceptance Notice or within such thirty (30) day period, then Landlord may proceed with such sale, lease or grant of easement (or other right of way) to such third party as set forth in the ROFR Notice, provided that if the acquisition, lease or obtaining of easement (or other right of way) set forth in the ROFR Notice is not completed within one hundred eighty (180) days of when Tenant notifies Landlord it does not intend to provide an Acceptance Notice (or, if no such notice is given, one hundred eighty (180) days after the expiration of the aforementioned thirty (30) day period), then Landlord shall not complete such transaction(s) without first providing Tenant an additional ROFR Notice pursuant to the terms of this Section 24, whereupon the provisions of this Section 24 shall again apply. An "Offeror" is any person or entity that, directly or indirectly, owns or operates towers or communications facilities, or is in the business of acquiring, in whole or in part, fee title, tenancy rights, licensing rights, easement rights, contract rights, economic rights or any other type of right or interest in real property and/or leases in, under or around towers or communications facilities.
- (b) If at any time after the date of this Agreement, Landlord receives a bona fide written offer from an Offeror seeking an assignment or transfer of Rent payments associated with this Agreement ("Rental Stream Offer") which Landlord desires to accept, Landlord will furnish Tenant with a copy of the Rental Stream Offer. Tenant shall have the right within thirty (30) days after it receives such copy to match the Rental Stream Offer and agree in writing to match the terms of the Rental Stream Offer. Such writing shall be in the form of a contract substantially similar to the Rental Stream Offer. If Tenant chooses not to exercise this right or fails to provide written notice to Landlord within such thirty (30) day period, Landlord may assign the right to receive the Rent payments pursuant to the Rental Stream Offer, subject to the terms of this Agreement. If Landlord attempts to assign or transfer Rent payments without complying with this section, the assignment or transfer shall be void. Tenant shall not be responsible for any failure to make payments under this Agreement and reserves the right to hold payments due under this Agreement until Landlord complies with this Section 24(b).

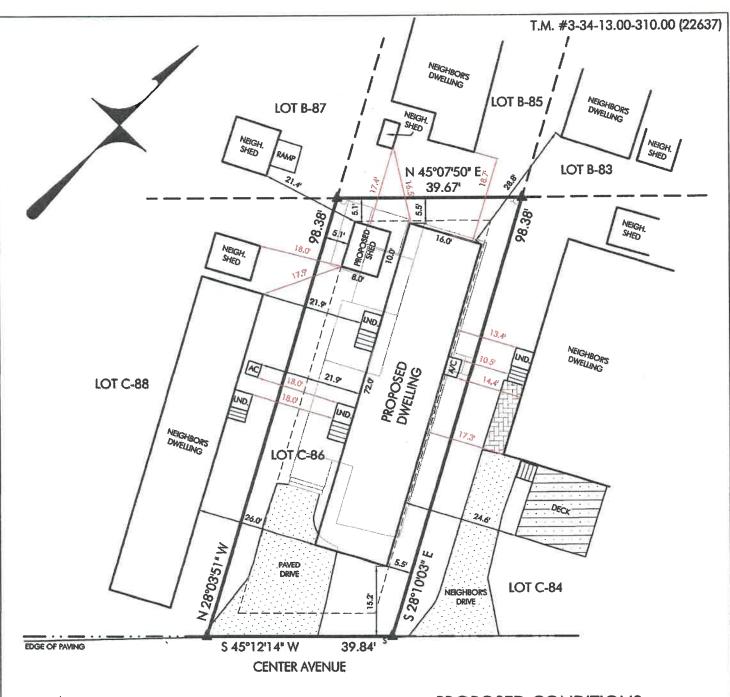

- 1. Uniqueness of the property:
- That there are unique physical circumstances or conditions, including irregularity, narrowness, or shallowness of lot size or shape, or exceptional topographical or other physical conditions peculiar to the particular property and that the exceptional practical difficulty is due to such conditions and not to the circumstances or conditions generally created by the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance or Code in the neighborhood or district in which the property is located.
- 1-11 The uniquely narrow dimensions of this lot create a challenge placing the manufactured home and maintaining minimum separation between homes and accessory structures. This lot was laid out with others in the community in the 1950's and 1960's prior to the current county requirements for separation distances. The lots sizes are small in comparison with the size of the modern manufactured home. I have selected a standard size floorplan for this home that is comparable to other new homes in the community, but I am still unable to place on the lot with the required setbacks. The narrow shape of the lot and the previous build out of the surrounding adjacent lots makes it difficult to place a new manufactured home on the property consistent with others in the neighborhood while maintaining compliance with Sussex County's current Zoning Code. The newly proposed replacement dwelling is slightly longer that the prior home but is much narrower than the previously approved unit which had a large, enclosed room added onto it.
- 2. Cannot otherwise be developed:
- That because of such physical circumstances or conditions, there is no possibility that the
 property can be developed in strict conformity with the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance or
 Code and that the authorization of a variance us therefore necessary to enable the reasonable
 use of the property.
- 1-11: Due to the uniqueness of the property, the property cannot be developed in strict conformity with the Sussex County Zoning Code. I propose to place a normal width sized manufactured home that is consistent with other new homes in the community and a standard size shed that is consistent with other new homes in the community but am unable to do so without violating the separation distance requirements between neighboring manufactured homes and accessory structures (ie, sheds). The variances are necessary to enable reasonable use of the property, without said variance the property cannot be developed. Because the surrounding homes are within the lot setbacks, this request is for minimal accommodation. And, much less than previously approved by the board.
- 3. Not created by the applicant:
- That such exceptional practical difficulty has not been created by the appellant.
- 1-11: The exceptional practical difficulty was not created by the applicant. The property is quite narrow which greatly limits the buildable area thereof. The neighboring lots are also narrow causing development of nearby lots to be nearer to lot lines/neighboring homes. It appears

impossible for a home to be placed on the property without violating the separation distance requirements. The exceptional practical difficulty was created by the unique conditions of the property and the development of adjacent lots. In viewing the proposed survey, you will notice that the need for varianceis reduced from the prior foot print and you will notice that the separation distances between the primary structures are much larger and very reasonable given the narrowness of the lots.

- 4. Will not alter the essential character of the neighborhood:

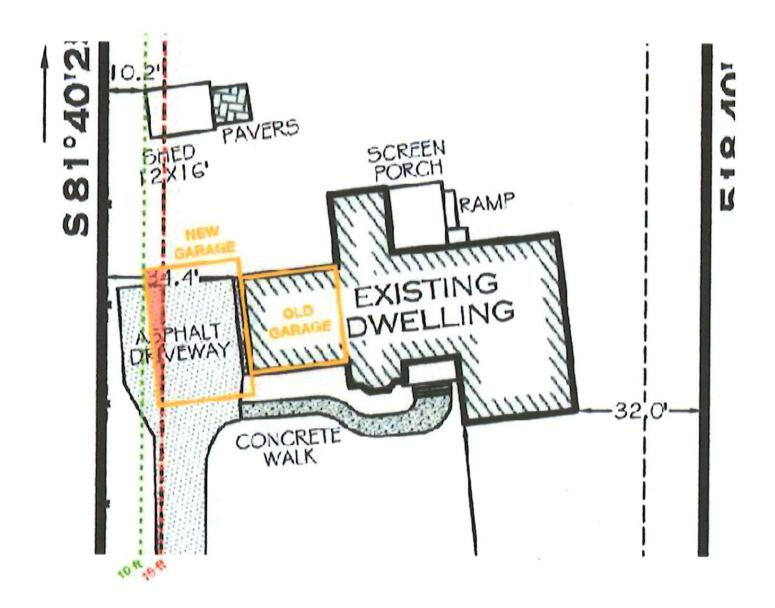
Description:

This 3-bedroom house, located on a 1.75 acre lot, was recently purchased on September, 2023. The new owners are expanding the square footage of the house by converting the current garage into indoor living space and adding a new 2-car attached garage. The purpose of this expansion is to be able to accommodate their multi-generational family and to add a much needed work-from-home office space. A variance authorization is being requested because the new 2-car garage will need to slightly surpass the current 15 foot setback indicated on the survey. Because of the uniquely angled house placement (see image below), there is a small portion (red shaded triangle) that sticks out towards the back of the property. If it wasn't because of this strange angle, the new garage would have fitted perfectly within the allowable limits. If authorized, the garage would still be a reasonable 10 feet away from the property line. The adjacent neighbor has also provided approval (see attached signed letter). 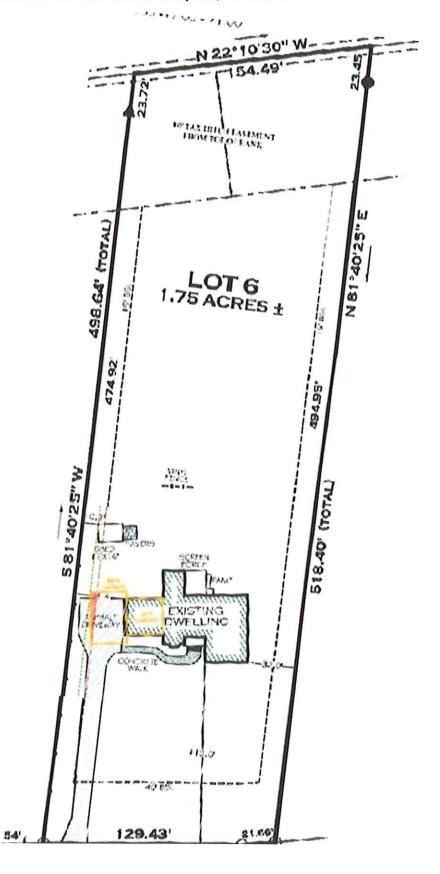


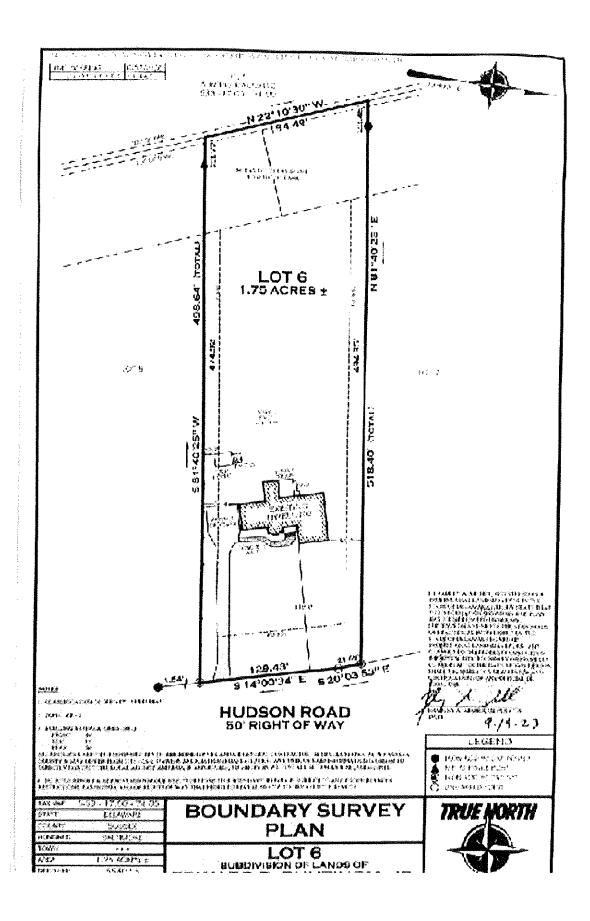

However, because this structure slightly exceeds one of their setback lines, they are requesting the Board and their next door neighbors to review and approve.

Their current survey indicates the setback should be 15' from the property line. 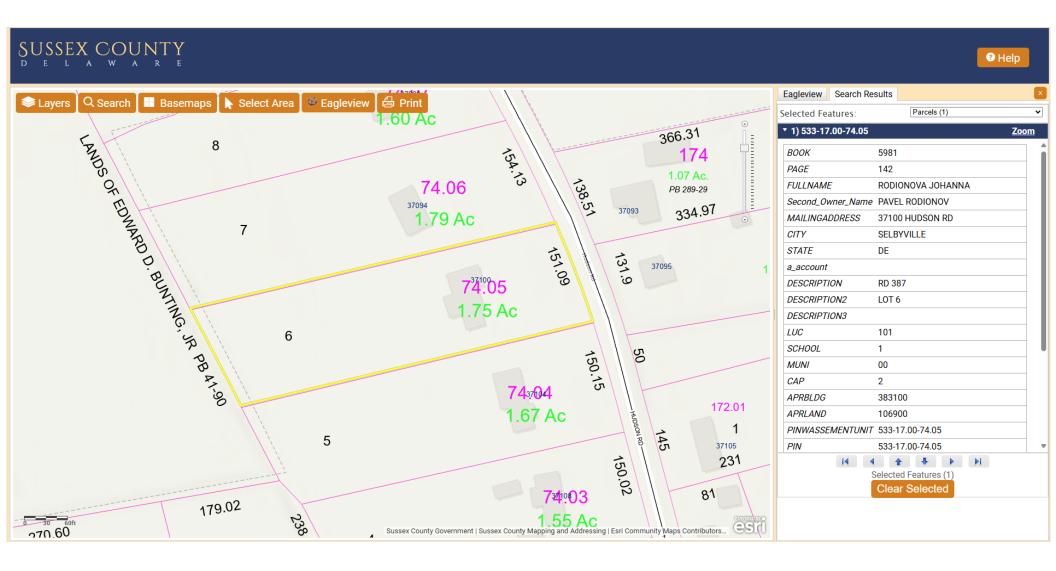

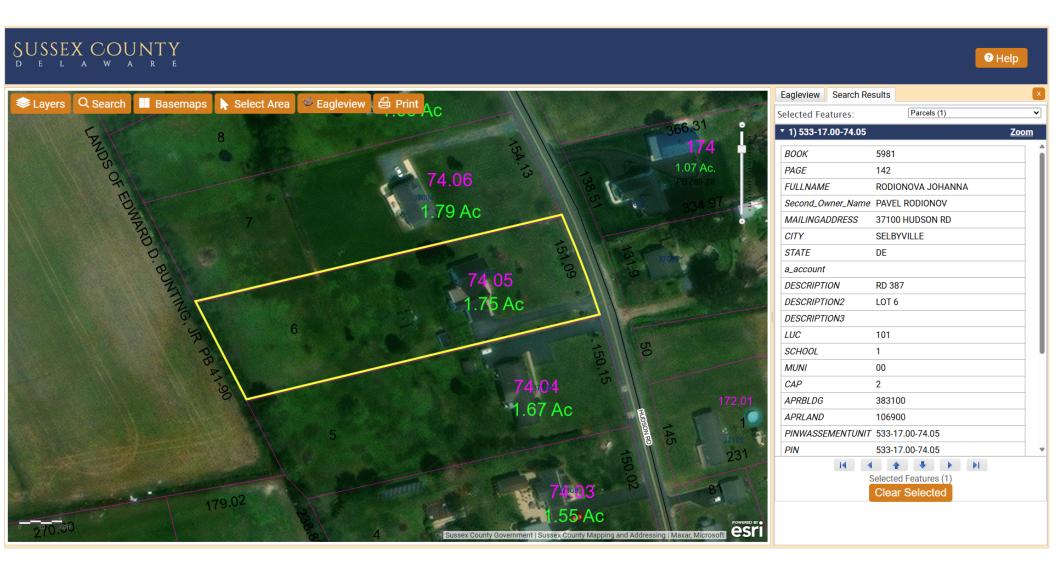

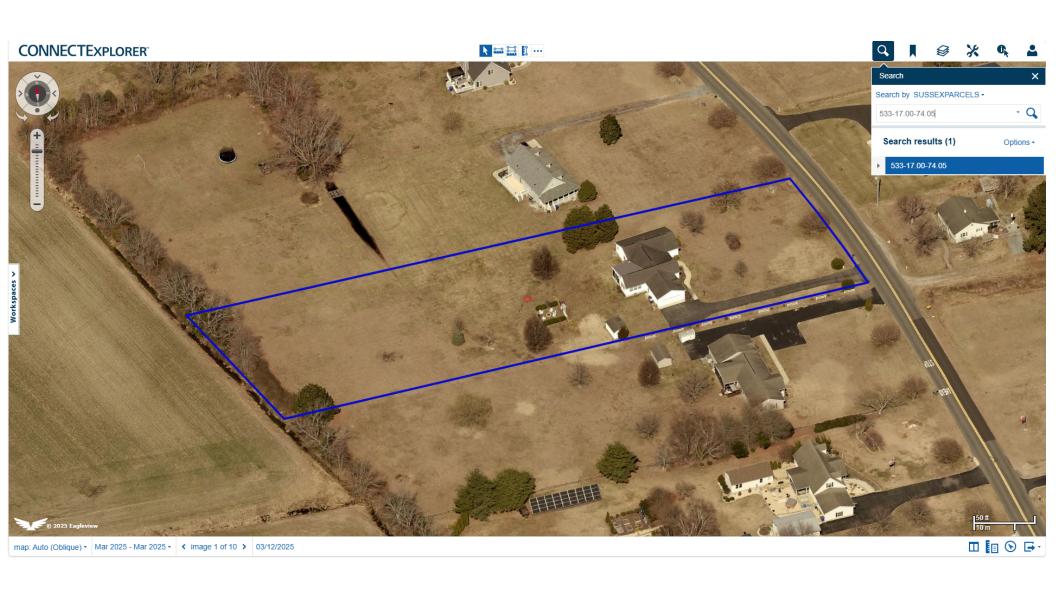
