DATE: January 27, 2017

During Tuesday's meeting, I will make a presentation on the County's new zoning map which has been created digitally through both the Mapping & Addressing office and Planning & Zoning office. This is a first for the County and will be a wonderful resource for our citizens and customers.

In order to replace the old County zoning map, our attorneys advised staff that an ordinance would be appropriate. We will review the ordinance prior to its introduction, a copy of which is attached hereto.

#### ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF SUSSEX COUNTY, CHAPTER 115 ("ZONING"), ARTICLE II ("ESTABLISHMENT OF DISTRICTS; MAPS") AND TO REPLACE THE OFFICIAL ZONING MAP OF SUSSEX COUNTY WITH AN IDENTICAL OFFICIAL ZONING MAP IN GIS-BASED FORMAT.

WHEREAS, Sussex County wishes to replace its current Official Zoning Map in written form with an Official Zoning Map based on its geographic information system ("GIS"); and

WHEREAS, these amendments to the Sussex County Code with respect to the GISbased zoning map will promote greater efficiency in mapping the County's zoning information and in making this information available to the public; and

WHEREAS, Sussex County Council believes that this legislation will promote the health, safety, morale, convenience, order, prosperity and/or welfare of its citizens.

NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNTY OF SUSSEX HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. Sussex County Code, Chapter 115, Article II, Section 115-7 ("Zoning Map") shall be amended by the addition of the underlined language and deletion of the bracketed language, as follows:

§ 115-7. Zoning Map.

A. The boundaries of the districts are hereby established as shown on the Zoning Map based on Sussex County's geographic information system ("GIS") and entitled the "Zoning Map of Sussex County" which[, properly attested,] shall be [on file in] <u>maintained by</u> the office of the County Planning and Zoning Commission of Sussex County, which map, with all explanatory matter thereon, shall be deemed to accompany, be and is hereby made a part of this chapter. [A copy of the Official Zoning Map shall be recorded in the office of the Recorder of Deeds, Sussex County, at Georgetown, and shall be periodically be revised to show amendments.]

Section 2. Sussex County Code, Chapter 115, Article II, Section 115-8 ("Informational copies; changes") shall be amended by the addition of the underlined language and deletion of the bracketed language, as follows:

§ 115-8. Informational copies; changes.

A. <u>Copies of the Official Zoning Map shall be provided by the Sussex County Office of</u> <u>Mapping and Addressing upon request for a reasonable fee. The Official Zoning Map</u> <u>shall also be available for inspection at the office of the Planning and Zoning</u> <u>Commission and through the Sussex County government website.</u> [Informational copies of the Official Zoning Map shall be available for inspection at the office of the Planning and Zoning Commission and at such other locations as may be necessary or convenient.]

Section 3. The Official Zoning Map of Sussex County is hereby replaced with an identical GIS-based Official Zoning Map of Sussex County.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption by a majority of the elected members of Sussex County Council.

#### **Synopsis**

This Ordinance replaces the current Official Zoning Map of Sussex County with an identical GIS-based zoning map. Sussex County Code is amended to make the GIS-based zoning map the Official Zoning Map of Sussex County. The Official Zoning Map will be available for inspection at the office of Planning and Zoning Commission and through the Sussex County government website. Copies of the Official Zoning Map will be available to the public through the Sussex County Office of Mapping and Addressing upon request for a reasonable fee.

## RE: AIRPORT ELECTRICAL ENCLOSURES PROJECT NO. 17-11 BID AWARD

DATE: January 31, 2017

County Council approved in the fiscal year 2017 budget two (2) additional electrical enclosures for the Coastal Airport. These enclosures are actually pre-engineered buildings which are prewired for the proposed use. The intention is to separate the power supply and controls for the runway lighting from the various taxiway lighting systems.

The project was publicly advertised as per the County Procurement Policy. In addition, the Engineering Department reached out to a number of vendors. On January 23, 2017, bids for the Airport Electrical Enclosures project were opened. Four (4) bids were received, with two of the bids submitted by Fibrebond, Inc for different structure types. Despite being clearly stated in the bid documents, three (3) submissions did not meet the 120 mph wind loading requirement and were hence deemed non-responsive. The attached check list shows other deficiencies of the non responsive bidders.

The Engineering Department recommends award of the project to Fibrebond, Inc., for their bid option#1 being a steel structure, in the amount of \$256,294.00 for supplying and installing the structure. These costs are under our original budget for this project.

The County will still be responsible for providing concrete pads and extending the conduit system. The latter is currently under design. Once the design is complete we propose to utilize the services of the General Labor & Equipment Contractor after approval by Council of the associated change order.
