Mrs. Jennings reported that the Proposed Ordinance would authorize the issuance of \$850,000 of General Obligation Bonds of Sussex County for the cost of the design, construction, and equipping of the Concord Road Wastewater Expansion. A grant in the amount of \$449,000 is expected to be received for this project. The bonds are backed by the County’s full faith and credit and are expected to be paid back over 40 years through revenues from the Concord Road Wastewater Expansion. This bond issuance is within the legal debt limit of the County. It is anticipated that the Bonds will be sold to the United States of America, Rural Utilities Services. The Bonds will provide the funding for the boundaries of the area known as the Concord Road Expansion, which was adopted by Sussex County Council on September 24, 2013. This funding is in line with what was presented when the boundaries were established for this expansion.

**1. Projects Receiving Substantial Completion**

Per the attached Engineering Department Fact Sheets, Bay Pines received Substantial Completion effective July 1 and Senators – Phase 2C received Substantial Completion effective July 13, 2015.

**2. Delaware State Police Activity Report – May 2015**

Per the attached Delaware State Police activity report for May, there were 124 violent crime arrests with 91 clearances; 1,195 property crimes with 425 clearances; and 19,809 total traffic charges with 13,744 corresponding arrests. Of those traffic arrests, 380 were for DUI. Finally, there were 1,940 total vehicle crashes investigated in May. In

total, there were 191 troopers assigned to Sussex County for the month of May.

Mrs. Jennings reported that DART, a division of DelDOT, has allocated \$796,862 for funding of transportation expenses for various senior centers in Sussex County. This amount has remained at the same level for a number of years. The County's responsibility is to approve a recommended funding amount for Fiscal Year 2016 as per State law. This is an allocation of State grant funds to various senior agencies for transportation purposes. The recommended funding for each agency is the same as in previous years:

Mrs. Jennings reported that, during the last Council meeting, a new septic relief policy was presented to the Council. At that meeting, it was the Council's recommendation to come back with a policy that included an income-based qualification. Mrs. Jennings stated that she added a

provision that a property owner's income cannot exceed the medium household income level of Sussex County (\$63,000 for a family of 4). She stated that the septic system relief policy is created for property owners who are required to connect to County sewer within 5 years of installing, or upgrading, a new septic system on the same property. It is the County's hope that anyone in the five-year sewer planning area only install temporary systems until public sewer is available. The criteria to qualify for the program are: the property has no County Code violations; the property owner must be current on all County debts; the property owner must not exceed current Sussex County's medium household income levels; and the property owner purchased, or upgraded, the property's septic system by spending at least \$10,000 within five years of the required County connection date. If the criteria is met, the property owner will receive a deferred connection fee up to five years or until the property transfer, whichever comes first; and a grant for the annual front footage charge up to five years depending on the date of septic repair or installation and the required date of connection.

Jim Hickin, Airport and Industrial Park Director, presented a proposal for a lease termination. He stated that Legg-Hudson LLC leases a one acre parcel from the County and owns a 2,500 square foot hangar on the parcel. The 20 year lease expires December 31, 2017. Legg-Hudson has agreed to terminate the lease since they no longer have an aircraft to store in the hangar. Mr. Hickin proposed that the County purchase the hangar and terminate the lease for \$11,000.00. This amount compensates Legg-Hudson for the residual value of the hangar and lost potential revenue for the sublease of the hangar. Mr. Hickin commented that approval of this hangar purchase and lease termination will provide an opportunity to develop the parcel more efficiently. In the interim, the County would lease the hangar at a higher rent than currently received.

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH A MORATORIUM UPON THE ACCEPTANCE OF SPECIAL USE EXCEPTION APPLICATIONS FOR OFF-PREMISES SIGNS.

WHEREAS, Sussex County Code ("County Code") currently allows off-premises signs to be approved for a special use exception by the Sussex County Board of Adjustment in certain zoning districts; and

WHEREAS, an off-premises sign is defined in the County Code, Chapter 115 as a "sign directing attention to a business, commodity, service or entertainment conducted, sold or offered elsewhere than upon the premises where the sign is maintained;" and

WHEREAS, Sussex County Council views the placement of off-premises signs as an important public safety issue in Sussex County and believes that the recent proliferation of off-premises signs has a detrimental effect on the safety and welfare of the citizens of Sussex County; and

WHEREAS, Sussex County Council believes that the current County Code provisions do not sufficiently address the safety issues and its other concerns with off-premises signs and that the continued approval of off-premises signs under the current County Code provisions will exacerbate the issues associated with these signs; and

WHEREAS, Sussex County is in the process of engaging a consultant to study land use planning issues, including off-premises signs; and

WHEREAS, in order to avoid exacerbating the issues with the off-premises signs and to allow Sussex County a reasonable time period for the review and study of off-premises signs, the preparation of proposed legislation to address resultant issues, and

the consideration of said legislation, Sussex County Council desires to establish a moratorium upon the acceptance of any special use exception application for an off-premises sign for a period of six (6) months from the date of adoption of this Ordinance, unless otherwise extended, modified or terminated by a majority vote of County Council.

**NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNTY OF SUSSEX HEREBY ORDAINS:**

Section 1. That a moratorium upon the acceptance of any special use exception application for off-premises signs be hereby imposed for a period of six (6) months after the date of adoption of this Ordinance, unless extended, modified, or terminated in accordance with this Ordinance. During the period of said moratorium, the office of the Sussex County Planning and Zoning Director is hereby directed to decline to accept all special use exception applications for an off-premises sign. The meaning of “off-premises sign” shall be as defined in Sussex County Code, Section 115-157(B).

Section 2. This Ordinance may be extended, modified, or terminated at any time by a majority vote of all members of the County Council of Sussex County.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.

**Synopsis**

This Ordinance establishes a six-month moratorium upon the acceptance of applications for a special use exception for off-premises signs. This moratorium may be extended, modified, or terminated at any time by a majority vote by the Sussex County Council.

# Potential Expansion of the Angola Neck Sanitary Sewer District




Existing County Sewer Districts


Dear Mr. Vincent,

Gallery 107 continues to operate and serve our community as we have done since our inception. Classes for adults and children are increasingly popular and often filled to capacity. Many of our members are also members of Seaford Tomorrow formerly known as the Seaford Enhancement Team, which strives in an effort to revitalize our downtown. Downtown revitalization is part of the mission statement of the Nanticoke River Arts Council. Our expenses are met almost solely due to the classes, art sales, and member dues, with little funding from outside sources. The money from the Sussex County Council aids in our efforts to bring cultural experiences and education to western Sussex County.

On Monday, June 29, a water leak occurred in an apartment above the gallery and was not discovered for several hours. This resulted in flooding a closet containing much of the gallery supplies and other items. Fortunately, none of the art work was damaged and as a precautionary measure, all artwork was removed from the entire gallery. All of the flooring, ceiling, and walls will need to be repaired and replaced. This will be accomplished by the building owner. However due to the repair work, the gallery is closed for an indefinite period, resulting in a loss of income. This comes at a very critical time since Seaford's Riverfest is upcoming, and the gallery is normally open during the entire festival, which is now not possible. In addition, the gallery's only fundraiser is held in August, and tickets are typically purchased at the gallery, which is also now not an option. Any assistance from the Council is greatly appreciated.



**BEGINNING at a point on the northeasterly right-of-way of Lighthouse Road (Route 54), a corner for these subject lands and lands, now or formerly, of Raymond McCabe, Jr. et.ux.; thence North 24°51'54" East 146.05 feet along said McCabe lands to a concrete monument; thence North 66°44'54" West 257.53 feet along said McCabe lands to a concrete monument; thence North 03°06'46" West 499.40 feet along Shady Park Trailer Park Development to an iron pipe; thence South 89°34'54" East 975.41 feet along Shady Park Trailer Park Development to a concrete monument; thence South 30°33'24" East 277.53 feet along Bayview Landing Subdivision to a point; thence southwesterly 967.74 feet along the meandering property line with Bayville Shores – South Condominiums (12 bearing breaks) to a point on the northeasterly right-of-way of Lighthouse Road; and thence North 64°36'38" West 185.70 feet along the northeasterly right-of-way of Lighthouse Road to the point and place of beginning, said parcel containing 14.79 acres, more or less.**
