4. Sussex County Comprehensive Land Use Plan Workshop

The Sussex County Planning & Zoning Commission will host the next workshop on the Comprehensive Land Use Plan on Wednesday, October 4, 2017. Updates will be provided on the Intergovernmental Coordination, Future Land Use, and Transportation Elements. The workshop begins at 9:00 a.m. and will take place in the County Council Chambers located on The Circle in Georgetown. The agenda is attached, and public comment will be taken at the beginning of the meeting.

Public A Public Hearing was held on the Proposed Tucks Road Expansion of the Sussex County Unified Sanitary Sewer District. John Ashman, Director of Hearing/ Tuck's Utility Planning, and Hans Medlarz, County Engineer, presented the proposed boundaries and estimates rates. Mr. Ashman reported that this Expansion area is surrounded by the County's existing Unified Sanitary Sewer District boundary; that the project includes Tucks Road and Abby Way as well as SCUSSD parcels fronting John J. Williams Highway (Route 24) between Branch Road and Tucks Road; that the County will be completing the Branch and Autumn Roads design that was initiated as part of the Deerbrooke Expansion in October 2015; that based on economics of scale and prior requests inclusion of the Tuck's Road/Abby Way area to the Branch and Autumn Road project reduces costs for both projects; and that the County plans to include the System Connection Charges into the financing, therefore minimizing the out-of-pocket expense to the homeowners.

Mr. Ashman reported that the estimated rates are as follows:

Current Annual Service Charge: \$286/year per EDU; billed quarterly to connected customers (subject to change during the annual budget process)

Annual EDU based Sewer Assessment Charge: \$540.00 (fixed for the term of the financing)

Public Hearing/ Tuck's Road	System Connection Charge (SCC): \$0.00 for existing homes - the one-time SCC fee will be included in the financing; any future connection will be charged the SCC fee in effect at that time

	Estimated Connection Expense: Plumbing costs between \$1,250 - \$1,500 based on complexity and \$100 Permit Fee to Sussex County

	Mr. Medlarz reported that this project cannot be ready for service for approximately two years; once completed and ready for service, residents will be notified and will have 12 months to connect.		
	Public comments were heard.		
	Vicki Legutko questioned if it will be mandatory to hook up to the system.		
	Katherine Marx questioned the costs and if they will have to pay the assessment charge forever. She also commented on the sewer project for the Rehab Center and the location of a manhole on her property. Ms. Marx also raised questions about the selection of a plumber by the property owners.		
	Kathy Emory raised the following questions: (1) if she has to hook up to water as well as sewer, (2) if they pay the initial cost up front, are they exempt from the \$826 annual amount; (3) how sewage rates are calculated; (4) why seasonal residents have to pay the same amount as permanent residents, (5) why all properties pay the same when some have closer access to the pipe; and (6) who would be responsible for any costs associated with the failure of the pipe coming up their roadway.		
	Tom Staz questioned the \$826 fee and questioned if there is an option to pay the larger amount up front versus over many years.		
	Staff responded to questions raised.		
	There were no additional public comments and the Public Hearing was closed.

The Council found that Richard Jamison was present on behalf of his application. He presented background information on the facility that he proposes to use as a wedding venue and stated that he would like to use the barn for weddings and receptions, birthday parties, anniversary parties and similar events; that the area to be used will be approximately 2 acres around the existing barn; that he proposes to maintain it as an agricultural venue; that there will be no concerts/bands; that he has received three letters of support from neighbors, one of which is from the sellers of the property and who live next door; that most neighbors live at the back side of the property; that one neighbor (residing approximately 1/4 mile across the field through the woods in Woodland Station) has voiced concerns about the application; that concern was previously expressed regarding the Applicant's poultry houses and he noted that all setbacks requirements have been met; that he has a DelDOT approved entrance and a parking area; and that he prefers not to limit the number of events permitted and he anticipates one or two events per week. Mr. Jamison noted that, in regard to the conditions recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission, he would like to extend hours of operation to 11:00 p.m. (Proposed Condition 6A) and he would like some wording change in Proposed Condition 6C to include "unreasonable or foul/offensive language".

Mr. Cole raised a question regarding the title of the Proposed Ordinance which states "wedding venue" and he questioned if other events can be held such as birthday and anniversary parties. ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 110, SECTION 110-88 OF THE CODE OF SUSSEX COUNTY TO ADD "EQUIVALENT DWELLING UNITS" AS A METHOD OF CALCULATING SEWER OR WATER ASSESSMENTS.

WHEREAS, Title 9, Sections 6505(b) and 6514 of the Delaware Code were amended to allow other means of collecting sewer assessments besides front footage calculations by Sussex County; and

WHEREAS, Sussex County desires to utilize a more uniform method of calculating sewer and water assessments wherever possible as new properties are brought into a Sussex County Sewer District or Water District; and

WHEREAS, Sussex County desires to utilize Equivalent Dwelling Units ("EDUs") as that term is already defined in Chapter 110 of the Code of Sussex County as a method of calculating sewer or water assessments for service provided by Sussex County; and

WHEREAS, both the Sussex County Engineering Department and the Department of Finance recommend and support the conversion from front footage assessment calculations to EDU calculations as an equitable means of determining sewer assessments; and

WHEREAS, the deleted language is in [brackets] and the new amended language is *italicized and underscored*.

NOW, THEREFORE THE COUNTY OF SUSSEX HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. The Code of Sussex County, Chapter 110, Part 3, Article XIII, §110-88 "Annual Assessment Fees" is hereby amended by deleting the language in brackets and inserting the italicized and underscored language as follows:

§110-88 Annual assessment fees.

The annual sanitary sewer assessment fee and/or annual water assessment fee shall be established for each sanitary sewer district and or water district. Annual assessment fees shall be based on a proportion, as determined by the county, of the total amount required each year to reimburse the county for sums to be expended for retiring bonds and/or notes which have been issued or capital expenditures for a sanitary sewer district or a water district to design, acquire and construct a respective sewerage system or a respective water system. [The amount required from each district to reimburse the county shall be equally proportioned to the assessable footage in the district.] <u>Unless otherwise determined by the county as part of the approval of its annual assessment roll, the method of determining the assessment fee shall be based upon the method established at the time the property was incorporated into a sanitary sewer district or water district pursuant to Title 9 of the Delaware Code, as follows:</u>

A. Where EDUs are established as the method of determining assessment fees, the amount required from dwellings, structures or other establishments or facilities to which EDUs are assigned pursuant to this chapter shall be based upon the number of EDUs allocated to the property as determined in Article XIV of this Part 3 and the amount to be recovered by the assessment as determined by the county. Provided, however, that undeveloped residential lots shall be assessed with one EDU; once the property is improved or further subdivided, the number of EDUs allocated shall be as determined in Article XIV of this Part 3 and the amount to be recovered by the assessment as determined by the county.

B. Where a front footage calculation is established as the method of determining assessment fees, the amount required from each property shall be equally proportioned to the assessable footage in the district, as determined in Article XIII, Section 110-92 of this Part 3. All properties that are part of a sanitary sewer district or water district at the time of adoption of this ordinance shall continue to be assessed based upon a front footage calculation, unless otherwise determined by the county as part of the approval of

<u>its annual assessment roll.</u>

Section 2. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption by Sussex County Council.

County Council approved in the fiscal year 2018 budget, the procurement of constant current regulators to be installed in the two new airport lighting vaults as part of the airport lighting system upgrades. The vaults were purchased and delivered separately with the installation of the regulators and all related electrical work being performed by County staff.

Invitations to bid were advertised in two (2) newspapers, viewable on the Sussex County website, and bid packages were also sent to a total of seven (7) potential bidders. On September 28, 2017, bids for the Airport Constant Current Regulators project were opened. Two (2) bids were received and both were within approximately \$5,000.00 of each other.

The Engineering Department recommends award of the project to ADB Safegate Americas LLC for their Base Bid plus Additive Bid B-2 (internal megging module), in the total amount of \$57,978.62. These costs are under our original budget of \$63,000.00 for this project. The Engineering Department does not recommend award of Additive Bid Items B-1, 3 or 4, due to a lack of value with respect to increased operational efficiency and/or safety.

On November 29, 2016, Council authorized the purchase of the King Farm Industrial Park and the assumption of existing contractual arrangements held by Georgetown Airport Center, LLC. Under this arrangement, the County assumed the construction contracts with Melvin L. Joseph Construction Co., Inc. for the DelDOT entrance and the Boulevard in the aggregate amount of \$496,891.00. Their scopes covered the initial, limited Del DOT entrance construction and the phase I extension of the boulevard for +/-500' for access to the Atlantis Industries Corporation.

On April 25, 2017, Council approved Change Order No. 1 in the amount of \$55,238.00 extending the entrance structural pavement section to the first intersection, street widening for a median island and realignment of the Boulevard centerline with the entrance. On August 8, 2017 Council approved Change Order Nos. 2 and 3 in the aggregate amount of \$12,748.00 for an increase the fire line and valving to the Atlantis Industries building and for additional electrical and communication conduit runs.

In the course of the ongoing street design process for the remainder of the Park, it became obvious that a better street layout could be achieved if the drive aisle behind the Atlantis building were to be incorporated in the northern park access road. In order to accomplish this road realignment AIC Building LLC, the legal lease holder would have to agree to modify the lease lines.



In a meeting between County Administration, Engineering and AIC Building LLC, they agreed to this lease hold modification in exchange for a contribution to the overall site paving expense. Subsequently, the Engineering Department negotiated proposed Change Order No. 4 in the amount of \$ 190,148.80 covering the hot mix expenses. This approach represents a winwin for both parties since AIC Building LLC will be receiving a capital contribution towards their site work expense while Sussex County avoids road construction cost in a greater overall value as well as gains leasable land previously dedicated to road construction.

The Engineering Department therefore recommends, approval of Change Order No.4 Melvin Joseph Construction Co., Inc., Project No. 17-15 in the amount of \$190,148.80 increasing the contract to \$527,896.80 <u>contingent upon</u> execution of a Memorandum of Understanding between Sussex County and AIC Building LLC.

The County Council held a public hearing on August 29, 2017. The County Council deferred action for further consideration.

The following are the minutes and motion for the Change of Zone from the July 27, 2017 and August 10, 2017 Planning and Zoning Commission meetings.

Ms. Cornwell advised the Commission that comments from Sussex Conservation District; a Service Level Evaluation from DelDOT indicating a Traffic Impact Study was not required; and a staff analysis were submitted into the record as part of the application.

The Commission found Mr. Edgar Reyes, the property owner and Angelica Flores were present on behalf of the application; that that the application is for a Conditional Use for a shop to run a painting business and storage; that no business will be conducted on the premise; that they have 10–15 trucks and 25 employees; that employees come to the shop to get materials and equipment then go to the job site; that not all trucks return to the shop each night as some employees take vehicles home; that business hours are from 7am to 5:30 pm Monday thru Saturday; that the applicant wants to put a sign on the property for the business; that the lot is 1.4 acres in size; that there is a daycare across the street and a poultry business down the road.

The Commission found there were no parties in support of this application.

The Commission found that Mr. John Ingle and Mrs. Joan Ingle spoke in opposition to the application; that the Ingles' are adjacent neighbors; that since the Reyes' built the shop the Ingles' have issues with flooding; that there are no other commercial business in the neighborhood; that this is a residential area, not a commercial area; that the employees arrive at work between 5:30 and 5:45 am and there is considerable amount of noise from employees loading ladders and other equipment onto the trucks; that the neighbors are otherwise good neighbors; that Mrs. Ingle stated Mr. Reyes told her he had 40–42 employees; that they park 15–18 vehicles parked on the property every day all day; that sometimes the employees would have loud parties after work.

There was discussion about the application.



Motion by Mr. Hopkins, seconded by Ms. Stevenson, and carried unanimously to defer action for further consideration. Motion carried 5-0.

At their meeting of August 10, 2017, the Commission discussed this application which has been deferred since July 27, 2017.

Mr. Hopkins stated that he would move that the Commission recommend approval of Conditional 2090 for Edgar Reyes Hernandez for a shop for a painting business and storage based upon the record made during the public hearing and for the following reasons:

- 1. The use is situated on a 1.45 acre parcel of land. It is situated among other larger parcels of land. With the conditions and stipulations of approval, the use will not have a negative impact on the neighboring properties or roadways.
- 2. No work is done at the site, and most of the employees start the workday at offsite job locations. The existing buildings will only be used to store materials and equipment associated with the use.
- 3. The use is compatible with the area, which includes some other small businesses such as a day care and an upholstery shop.
- 4. Small family businesses such as this one are appropriate in the Low Density Area according to the Sussex County Land Use Plan. The Plan states that businesses that address the needs of agricultural and single family homes are appropriate in this Area. This small painting contractor is consistent with the direction given by the County's Plan.
- 5. This recommendation is subject to the following conditions:
 - A. The use shall be limited to a shop for a painting business and storage. The storage shall only be used for materials directly associated with the painting business.
 - B. There shall be no retail sales from the property.
 - C. There shall not be any outside storage of paint, equipment or other materials associated with the use.
 - D. All lighting on the site shall be downward screened so that it does not shine on neighboring properties or roadways.
 - E. Any dumpsters on the site are to be screened from the view of neighboring properties and roadways.
 - F. The applicant shall comply with all DelDOT requirements for entrance and roadway improvements.
 - G. The hours of operation shall be Monday through Saturday from 7:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. No deliveries to or from the site shall occur before 7:00 am.
 - H. Signage shall not exceed 32 square feet on each side and shall not be lighted.
 - I. All vehicle parking areas shall be clearly shown on the Final Site Plan and clearly marked on the site itself. All vehicles, including the applicant's vehicles and employees' vehicles, must only be parked within the designated areas.
 - J. No more than 15 vehicles may be parked on the site at any one time.
 - K. The use shall be limited to the existing buildings on the site. Any new or expanded buildings shall require a new public hearing.
 - L. Failure to comply with any of these conditions shall be grounds for the termination of the Conditional Use approval.

M. The Final Site Plan shall be subject to the review and approval of the Sussex County Planning and Zoning Commission.

Motion by Mr. Hopkins, seconded by Mr. Hudson, and carried unanimously to forward this application to the Sussex County Council with the recommendation that the application be approved for the reasons stated. Motion carried 5-0.

The County Council held a public hearing on August 22, 2017. The County Council deferred action for further consideration.

The following are the minutes and motion for the Change of Zone from the July 13, 2017 and July 27, 2017 Planning and Zoning Commission meetings.

Ms. Cornwell advised the Commission the submitted into the record as part of the application were the staff analysis, comments from the Sussex Conservation District, DelDOT, an exhibit book and survey.

The Commission found that Craig de Mariana Aleman, Attorney with Tunnel & Raysor P.A. and John Murray, Project Manager with Kercher Engineering, Inc. were present on behalf of the application; that Mr. Murray stated that the intent for the site is for storage and office space for antiques; that this property is consistent with the Comprehensive Plan; that adjacent to the property is a gas station, restaurant and other commercial zones; that it is adjacent to commercial zoning across the street; that to the northeast are some parcels zoned B-1 and being used as commercial uses; that the gas station was in the area prior to zoning; that property is in a Level 2 State Strategy; that there will be two small buildings; that there will be road improvements with a 10 foot multimodal path; that there is an electrical substation adjacent to the site; that it is on its own well and septic; that the project did go through DelDOT for approval; that there is no proposed access to Jersey Road because the access is too narrow; that it is only 20 ft. wide and adjacent to residential property; that it could comply with the Fire Marshal access for a one way street; however there is not a lot of room; that it is not preferred as residential is located along Jersey Road; that they are looking for a small office and storage for their existing business not for a lot of traffic; and that about 15% of the this parcel will be developed.

The Commission found Gary Cuppels, spoke in support of the application, that there is a 20-foot corridor and he does not want commercial traffic on Jersey Road; that he is ok with the rezoning which fronts on Route 24; that he wants deed restrictions with the access only on Route 24; that expressed concerns that the application was filed in violation of the Title 24 as the plans were not sealed documents; and that this should be denied for that reason.

- 1. The site is located along Route 24 near the town limits of Millsboro. It is also next to a large electrical substation on an adjacent property. This location is appropriate for CR-1 zoning.
- 2. The site is in an area where other Commercial and Business zoned properties exist. The CR-1 zoning will be consistent with the area zoning and uses.
- 3. The site is in a Developing Area according to the Sussex County Comprehensive Plan. CR-1 Zoning is appropriate within this Area according to the Plan.
- 4. The proposed use will not adversely affect neighboring or adjacent properties or roadways.
- 5. Whenever this property is developed for a particular use, the applicant will be required to meet or exceed all DelDOT requirements. DelDOT will determine where appropriate entrance locations should be.
- 6. CR-1 Zoning is appropriate, since the County Zoning Code states that the purpose of such zoning is to provide for a wide variety of commercial and service activities generally servicing a wide area, and that such uses should be located along existing major thoroughfares where a general mixture of commercial and service activities now exist. In this case, the rezoning along Route 24 falls within the stated purposes of the CR-1 District.
- 7. Any development of the site will require preliminary and final site plan review by the Sussex County Planning and Zoning Commission.



The Clear Space Performing Arts Institute offers educational opportunities unique to Sussex County. The vast majority of students in the Performing Arts Institute have little or not exposure to the arts beyond the band and chorus offerings at school. Classes in the institute are designed to move students through the logical progression of learning alaigned with the National Standards for Arts Education.

In Broadway Bound, students receive basic instruction in dance, acting and singing. In Spotlight on Young Performers, students learn the entire script and songs for a "junior" production of a real Broadway musical and present the show with full sets and costumes. Past Young Performer productions have included: "Woods," "Aladdin," "The Little Mermaid and " Thoroughly Modern Millie."

All students of the Institute may attend any performance of Clear Space Theatre free of charge. This concept allows students to make a direct connection between their course of study and a professional production. Several students in the institute have "graduated" to acting roles in the professional productions of the Company. Several students have gone onto enroll in drama courses at the college level.

A recent study by the National Endowment of The Arts shows that students who are engaged in the arts are more likely to attend college than those who are not. Students who are participate in the arts also are more civic-minded and volunteer more than those who are not engaged in the arts, according to the National Endowment of The Arts study.

All students in the program are able to attend any performance at Clear Space free of charge. This concept allows students to make a direct connection between their artistic study and a professional production.

In our Broadway Legends program, adults age 50 and older can experience the joy of performing a Broadway musical without the added preasure of memorization and complex staging. Past productions have included "Hello, Dolly!," " Chicago," "Anything Goes" and "Guys and Dolls." The semesters conclude with free public performances.

Clear Space offers scholarships to students who cannot afford the full tuition for a class. The funds requested will underwrite a portion of the scholarships. The total amount of the scholarships provided in 2017 was \$9,000.

The Village seeks a \$2000 grant from Sussex County in 2017 to allow us to accept 5 additional "reduced fee" members, as explained below. The Village is a volunteer, non-profit organization dedicated to helping older adults live independently for as long as possible. We do this by providing a variety of daily services, such as transportation (our most requested service), home visiting, changing light bulbs, taking out the garbage, assisting in computer problems and helping to pay bills, to name just a few. We also provide educational and social programs, like chair yoga, lunch outings and boat tours. All of these services are provided for a flat fee of \$500 per year for up to 25 hours of service per month for an individual. The need for our services is growing rapidly. By 2030, the number of residents in Sussex County aged 75 and over is projected to increase by more than 90%, with this rapid rate of increase already reflected in the Village's membership. The Village opened on November 1, 2013. Since that time we have welcomed over 155 new members (up from 70 members in 2015) and 90 volunteers. But our vision includes not only providing services to those who can pay, but also to those who cannot. We strive to have 15% of our members be those who cannot afford the annual fee. Instead we offer them the same services for a "reduced fee" of \$100 per year per person, a difference of \$400 per person.
