This Ordinance sets the fees the Clerk of the Peace charges for marriage and civil union ceremonies for Delaware residents, non-residents and active United States military personnel. George Parish, Clerk of the Peace, stated that the respective Clerks of the Peace of each Marriage Bureau in the State of Delaware have been engaged in a continuous dialogue in attempting to achieve unanimity in established fees. Mr. Parish stated that he endorses the proposition to extend Delaware resident fees to all active United States military personnel without regard to their legal residency. The proposition would apply to all Sussex County Marriage Bureau fees. This approach would provide an opportunity for the Sussex County Council to express its gratitude for active military personnel. Mr. Parish noted that the provision was implemented in New Castle and Kent counties in April 2012. Mr. Wilson suggested that the fees be waived for active military personnel. It was noted that this could be discussed during the Public Hearing process. ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 62 OF THE CODE OF SUSSEX COUNTY RELATING TO FEES CHARGED BY THE CLERK OF THE PEACE TO PERFORM MARRIAGE CEREMONIES AND CIVIL UNIONS.

WHEREAS, Sussex County Code, Chapter 62, Article V, Section 62-16 currently establishes the fees to be charged by the Clerk of the Peace for performing marriage ceremonies, and

WHEREAS, this ordinance shall amend Section 62-16 by including the fees to be charged for civil unions and providing Delaware resident rates for all active United States military personnel.

NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNTY OF SUSSEX HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. Amend Sussex County Code, Chapter 62, Article, V, Section 62-16, Enumeration of Fees, by adding the underlined language as follows:

A. The fee for a marriage <u>or civil union</u> license issued by the Clerk of the Peace for Sussex County to a Delaware resident <u>or any active United</u> <u>States military personnel, regardless of residency</u>, shall be \$50 each.

B. The fee for providing a marriage <u>or civil union</u> license issued by the Clerk of the Peace for Sussex County to a non-Delaware resident shall be \$100 each.

C. The fee for providing a certified copy of a marriage <u>or civil union</u> license issued by the Clerk of the Peace for Sussex County shall be \$25 each.

D. The fee for conducting a Memorable Marriage <u>or Civil Union</u> Ceremony for a Delaware resident <u>or any active United States military</u> <u>personnel, regardless of residency</u>, in the office of the Clerk of the Peace for Sussex County, or on The Circle or any building fronting The Circle, shall be \$50.

E. The fee for conducting a Memorable Marriage <u>or Civil Union</u> Ceremony in the office of the Clerk of the Peace for Sussex County, or on The Circle or any building fronting The Circle, for a non-Delaware resident shall be \$100. F. The fee for conducting a Memorable Marriage <u>or Civil Union</u> Ceremony outside of the office of the Clerk of the Peace for Sussex County for a Delaware resident<u>or any active United States military personnel</u>, <u>regardless of residency</u>, shall be \$75.

G. The fee for conducting a Memorable Marriage <u>or Civil Union</u> Ceremony outside of the office of the Clerk of the Peace for Sussex County for a non-Delaware resident shall be \$150.

H. The fee for performing a renewal of <u>marriage or civil union</u> vows ceremony in the office of the Clerk of the Peace for Sussex County, or on The Circle or any building fronting The Circle, for a Delaware resident <u>or any active United States military personnel, regardless of residency</u>, shall be \$50.

I. The fee for performing a renewal of <u>marriage or civil union</u> vows ceremony in the office of the Clerk of the Peace for Sussex County, or on The Circle or any building fronting The Circle, for a non-Delaware resident shall be \$100.

J. The fee for performing a renewal of <u>marriage or civil union</u> vows ceremony outside of the office of the Clerk of the Peace for Sussex County for a Delaware resident <u>or any active United States military personnel</u>, <u>regardless of residency</u>, shall be \$75.

K. The fee for performing a renewal of <u>marriage or civil union</u> vows ceremony outside of the office of the Clerk of the Peace for Sussex County for a non-Delaware resident shall be \$150.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective on , 2012.

During Tuesday's Council meeting, David Rutt will present a lease amendment on the Universal Forest Products (UFP) building at the industrial park. As you may know, this building has remained vacant for several years without a tenant.

Dating as far back as 1991, the lease for this building has gone through multiple assignments and there have been some errors in the lease terms and parcel lot dimensions as a result. The County was made aware of these issues recently.

Over the last few months, the Engineering Department, David, and I have been in negotiations with UFP to amend the lease and correct the parcel lot issues. This amendment is the result of those successful negotiations.

As a result, the lease and lot is corrected and UFP is prepared to assign the lease to a new tenant immediately. A copy of the corrected survey is attached for you to review.

Dear George,

First, I want to thank you for making a domation last spring towards our housing initiative. As you know our request was for \$5,000 at the time. You said then, that we could come back in the fall for an additional \$2,500. We are now about two thirds of the way to our goal of raising the funds to complete two rental units of housing for two West Rehoboth families. We had a very successful individual donor fundraising effort bringing in over \$5,000 and have received additional donations form LRAC, churches, and local banks. Although we have raised \$184,000 we are still short of completing our goal of \$290,000. In order to start construction we have received a construction loan form NCALL, a local Community Financing Institution.

Milford Housing Development Corporation received the bid for these units and began construction in early September. I can report that the framing is done and the roof on both houses will be up by next week.

We have interviewed residents and have selected two families who have been living in substandard housing and will lose that housing by January 2013. Milford Housing has a stop date of December 23, 2012. Because of raising money through mostly private sources we are able to offer these two units for \$400 and \$500 dollars per month, plus utilities. The Land Trust plans to take care of outside maintenance, sewer costs and garbage.

We are pleased that the county is willing to partner with us as we move forward to revitalize the West Rehoboth neighborhood and provide affordable housing for those who work close-by . Two years ago the Sussex County Council responded generously to our request for financial help for masonry repairs to the 60 year old portion of the library building.

Today I am appealing to you for assistance with a drainage problem that has developed on our property. It is a problem that must be addressed immediately and will cost more than is available in our FY2013 Budget.

Whenever it rains, water accumulates in an alcove to the left of the front entranceway. It pools, overflows, and never dries out entirely. I've been advised that if we do not attend to the situation before winter, it could cause major damage to our foundations and lead to mold or other serious problems which will be very costly to repair.

The Board of Commissioners joins me in requesting grant assistance on this project. Our re-engineered drainage plan has been approved by the Town of Laurel, but the front yard, including irrigation system, will need to be completely dug out and re-landscaped. The estimated cost is cost over \$3,000 at a time when the library is already trying to manage a \$1,000 shortfall due to increasing maintenance costs and reduced income.

We appreciate your consideration and hope you will be able to support this project.

The Mason Dixon Woodworkers is very appreciative of you past support to our annual charitable outreach program of making toys for needy children.

Our dedicated toy makers have been turning out toys for almost 2 decades and are on target for finishing up another 1300 toys for distribution to the organizations listed on the next page.
