## RESOLUTION NO. R Oll 71

WHEREAS, subsequent to a Public Hearing to be held at Dover, Delaware on Wednesday, March 24, 1971 by the Department of Health and Social Services, it is possible that the said Department may adopt certain regulations governing drinking water standards for the State of Delaware; and

WHEREAS, the Sussex County Council strongly and vigorously opposes Paragraph 22.303(c), which provides that approval of water supplies shall be under the charge of persons whose qualifications are accepted by the Division of Physical Health which condition constitutes needless expense and complication, and Paragraph 22.61 and Footnote #1, relating to corrosive substances in the system, this requirement and its criteria being unrealistic, excessive, and completely unnecessary, and Paragraph 22.613 requiring chlorination of all public water supplies, which is unselective, unduly burdensome and in and of itself a needless corruption of pure water systems,

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Council of Sussex County hereby declares itself in strict and urgent opposition of these measures and calls upon all interested persons and organizations to review these Sections, and contribute their support to the position of the Council, opposing the same, and seeking their elimination as a part of the proposed regulation.
