RESOLUTION NO. R 014 87

LONG NECK SANITARY SEWER DISTRICT DECLARED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF TITLE 9, CHAPTER 65 OF THE DELAWARE CODE

WHEREAS, the eligible voters of the proposed Long Neck Sanitary Sewer District approved the creation of the sewer district by a vote of 574 to 279 in an election held, March 21st, 1987; and

WHEREAS, Title 9, Delaware Code, Section 6507 requires the County Council to issue a determination of the sewer district within thirty days of its approval by the eligible voters;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Council of Sussex County, Delaware hereby determines that the eligible voters of the Long Neck Sanitary Sewer District have approved the creation of said district; that the description of the Long Neck Sanitary Sewer District is described in Exhibit "A"; and that the said district is hereby declared to be validly constituted under the provisions of Title 9, Chapter 65 of the Delaware Code.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Sussex County Council directs the County Engineer and the Attorney for the County Council to procure the necessary lands and right-of-way by purchase, agreement or condemnation in accordance with the existing statutes.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Engineer is hereby directed to prepare maps, plans, specifications and estimates, elect contracts for and supervise the construction and maintenance of, or enlarging and remodeling of, any structures required to provide for the safe disposal of sewage in the sanitary sewer district.

EXHIBIT "A"

Description of the Long Neck Sanitary Sewer District

Beginning at a point where the centerline of Guinea Creek meets a bridge on the northern right-of-way (R/W) of County Road 298, thence proceeding with the centerline of said Creek to a point where Guinea Creek discharges to Herring Creek, thence proceeding with an imaginary line in an easterly direction to a point where it meets the centerline of Herring Creek, thence proceeding in an easterly direction with the centerline of said Creek to a point where Herring Creek discharges to Rehoboth Bay, thence proceeding with an imaginary line in a southerly to Rehoboth Bay, thence proceeding with an imaginary line in a southerly direction to a point where it meets the mean-low water line of the southwestern side of the Rehoboth Bay, thence proceeding in an easterly direction with the mean-low water line of said Bay to a point where it meets the Indian River Bay, thence proceeding in a westerly direction with the mean-low water line of said Bay to a point where it meets the mouth of Lingo Creek at its discharge to the Indian River Bay, then proceeding with an imaginary line in a southerly direction to a point where it meets the centerline of Lingo Creek, thence proceeding in a northwesterly direction with the centerline of said Creek to a point where it meets the eastern property boundary of the parcel of land now or formerly of (N/F) Ethel F. Tunnell and Bonney H. T. Bastholm and Robert W. Tunnell, Jr., thence proceeding in a southerly direction with the easternmost boundary of said property to the point where it meets the property corner of the parcel of land N/F Tunnell Companies, L.P., thence proceeding in a southerly direction with the easternmost boundary of said parcel to a point where it meets the property corner of the parcel of land N/F Jerome W. Hall and Herbert T. Hall, thence proceeding in a southerly direction with the easternmost boundary of said parcel to a point where it meets the northern R/W of County Road 299, thence proceeding in a southerly direction in an extended straight line to the southern R/W of said Road, thence proceeding in a westerly direction with the R/W of said Road to a point where it meets the northeastern property corner of the parcel N/F Thomas B. and Anna R. Curran, thence in a northerly direction in an extended straight line to the northern R/W of County Road 298, thence proceeding in a northeasterly direction along the R/W of said Road to a point where it meets the southern R/W of County Road 22, thence proceeding in a northeasterly direction in an extended straight line to a point where it meets the northern R/W of County Road 298, thence proceeding in a northeasterly direction along the R/W of said Road to the point of beginning.

The Proposed Long Neck Sanitary Sewer District is within these approximate boundaries. A map drawn to scale indicating the boundaries of the Proposed Sanitary Sewer District is available in the County Engineer's Office.
