## RESOLUTION NO. R 015 79

DIRECTING THAT ALL PLANS FOR EXPANSION AND/OR DEVELOPMENT OF THE SUSSEX COUNTY AIRPORT CEASE

WHEREAS, there is considerable opposition by Sussex County residents, especially those living in the Georgetown area, concerning future expansion and/or development of the Sussex County Airport; and

WHEREAS, the information available to me concerning this matter indicates there are many objections to this expansion and/or development; and

WHEREAS, being elected by the citizens of the Second Councilmanic District I have an obligation and duty to represent their interests; and

WHEREAS, being their elected official I intend to represent them to the best of my ability,

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Sussex County Council, on this sixth (6th) day of February, 1979, cease all plans for expansion and/or development of lands beyond the boundaries of the present Sussex County Airport since its acquisition by deed from the State of Delaware on March 12, 1974; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that proposed plans for the Sussex

County Airport be available for review and comment at a public

hearing to be scheduled whereby all interested citizens of Sussex

County will have an opportunity to express their views and concerns

as to the future of this Airport; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that such public hearing be held in the Theater of the Delaware Technical and Community College on Route 18 west of Georgetown, Delaware on February 14, 1979 at 7:30 P. M. at which time this matter will be discussed thoroughly and any and all questions will be answered by representatives of the

Sussex County Government and the Department of Transportation of the State of Delaware; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution in no way shall affect the contract in existence for the improvement of the existing taxiway and terminal building roadway.
