

RESOLUTION NO. R 078 82

A RESOLUTION OF AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE FUNDS TO PAY THE NONFEDERAL SHARE (\$50,000 FROM OCTOBER 1, 1982 TO SEPTEMBER 30, 1983) OF THE RAIL CONTINUATION SUBSIDY REQUIRED FOR THE GEORGETOWN, DELAWARE TO LEWES BEACH, DELAWARE AND ELLENDALE, DELAWARE TO MILTON, DELAWARE LINES UNDER THE REGIONAL RAIL REORGANIZATION ACT OF 1973 AS AMENDED

WHEREAS, rail freight service on the branch line from Georgetown, Delaware to Lewes, Delaware and Ellendale, Delaware to Milton, Delaware operates under the terms of a rail service continuation subsidy in accordance with Section 304(c)(2)(A) of the Regional Rail Reorganization Act of 1973 as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Delaware Department of Transportation, Delaware Transportation Authority has executed operating agreements with an appropriate rail carrier to guarantee continuation of rail service; and

WHEREAS, the Delaware Department of Transportation, Delaware Transportation Authority has purchased the subject branch lines; and

WHEREAS, after April 1, 1977, a portion of the payment of the rail continuation subsidy must be paid from nonfederal sources; and


WHEREAS, after September 30, 1981, all of the payment of the rail continuation subsidy must be paid from nonfederal sources; and

WHEREAS, Sussex County desires that the rail freight operations of the subject branch lines be continued,

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED that Sussex County agrees to provide funds to pay the nonfederal share (\$50,000 from October 1, 1982 to September 30, 1983) of the rail continuation subsidy required for the Georgetown, Delaware to Lewes Beach, Delaware and the Ellendale, Delaware to Milton, Delaware lines under the Regional Rail Reorganization Act of 1973 as amended in order that such rail freight operations be continued.
